



Saint Francis Hospital Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA)

Adopted by the Trinity Health Mid-Atlantic Regional Board on May 25, 2023.

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Purpose of the Community Health Needs Assessment

Identifying and addressing unmet health needs of local communities is a core aspect of the care provided by hospitals and health systems across the U.S. The Affordable Care Act (ACA) formalized this role by mandating that tax-exempt hospitals conduct a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) every three years and implement strategies focused on emergent priorities from the assessment. This assessment is central to not-for-profit hospitals and health system’s community benefit and social accountability planning. By better understanding the service needs and gaps in a community, an organization can develop implementation plans—also mandated by the ACA—that more effectively respond to high priority needs. This CHNA represents the commitment of Saint Francis Hospital to improve health outcomes in the community we serve through rigorous assessment of health status in our service area. Resident and community leader stakeholder perspectives have been incorporated into the assessment process as well as the adoption of related implementation strategies to address priority health needs. Our goal with this CHNA was not only to fulfill a legal requirement, but to also to partner for improved outcomes.

The goals include:

Engaging public health and community stakeholders including community-based organizations, low-income, minority and other under-served populations.

Assess and understand the community's health issues and needs with a high focus on priority zip codes.

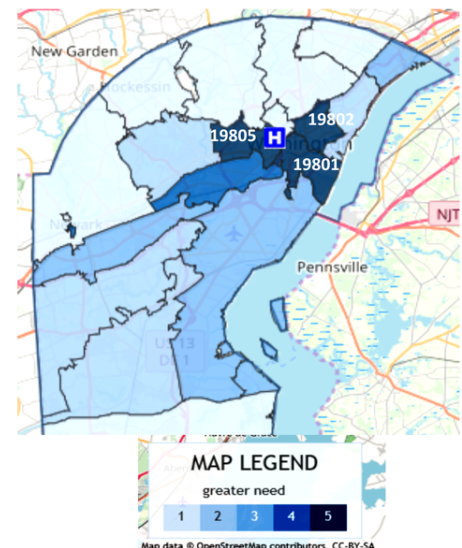
Understand the risk factors and social determinants that impact health.

Identify community resources and opportunities to collaborate with partners.

Use findings to develop and adopt an implementation strategy based on the prioritized issues.

Saint Francis Healthcare’s Community Health Needs Assessment is used to identify health priorities and make decisions on where to commit resources that can effectively improve community health and wellbeing.

Saint Francis Healthcare primarily serves the City of Wilmington, which has some of the highest socio-economic needs zip codes in the State of Delaware — 19801, 19802 and 19805. Saint Francis Hospital is located in 19805, just blocks from Census Tract 22, a high needs neighborhood. Zip codes considered high needs generally have poorer health outcomes than zip codes in more affluent neighborhoods.

Saint Francis Hospital acknowledges the wide range of priority health issues which emerged from the CHNA process based on feedback from community partners, including health care providers, public health experts, health and human service agencies, and other community representatives, and determined it could effectively focus on only those health needs which are the most pressing, under-addressed and within its ability to influence. Saint Francis Hospital plans to focus their efforts on the following health priorities over the next three-year cycle:

1. Food Access/Insecurity
2. Housing (including homeless)
3. Access to Care

Introduction

Saint Francis Hospital

Founded in 1924, Saint Francis Hospital is guided by its Catholic-health core values of reverence, stewardship, integrity, safety, justice and commitment to the underserved. Located in Wilmington, Del., and with 219 licensed beds, Saint Francis Hospital offers numerous outpatient services, a primary care physician network and is a member of the Sidney Kimmel Cancer Network at Jefferson. Saint Francis Hospital offers the shortest ER wait time in New Castle County, Del., and is designated by the state and American College of Surgeons (ACS) as a Level III Trauma Center. The hospital is the basic life support EMS provider for the cities of Wilmington and Dover, Del. Additionally, the hospital partners with Nemours- Children’s Hospital for Level II neonatology care, and partners with Thomas Jefferson University Hospitals for maternal-fetal medicine.

Trinity Health Mid-Atlantic is a Regional Health System that includes Mercy Fitzgerald Hospital in Darby, Pa.; Nazareth Hospital in Northeast Philadelphia; Saint Francis Hospital in Wilmington, Del.; St. Mary Medical Center in Langhorne, Pa. and home health and LIFE programs. Trinity Health Mid-Atlantic is a member of Trinity Health, one of the largest multi-institutional Catholic health care delivery systems in the nation.

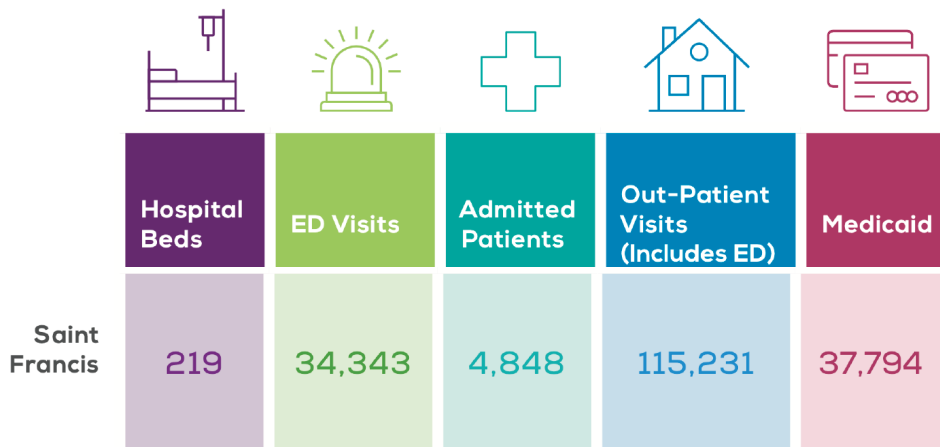

2020 Community Health Needs Assessment

The previous Community Health Needs Assessment was adopted on June 30, 2020. Based on feedback from community partners, healthcare providers, public health experts, health and human services agencies, and other community representatives, Saint Francis Hospital focused its 2020-2022 community health improvement efforts on the following health priorities and implementation strategies: (1) Behavioral Health (2) Chronic Disease Prevention and Management (3) Food Insecurity. The following summary is focused on the work accomplished by Saint Francis in response to the previous CHNA.

Access to Behavioral Health Services

Overview Saint Francis contracted with Catholic Charities to provide virtual behavioral health assessments for uninsured and underinsured St. Clare Van patients. A licensed clinician was available 8 hours per week to patients. Patients were scheduled for follow-up care or further evaluation as needed. The Saint Clare Medical Outreach Van provides primary care services five days a week to underserved populations in Wilmington, New Castle, and Newark, Delaware.

Goals Improve care delivery and coordination for patients who have substance use disorder and/or mental health issues.

Impact Adjustments in Trinity Health of the Mid-Atlantic Region to behavioral health leadership, along with hospital visitor restrictions due to COVID-19, resulted in deferral of both the Recovery innovations Inc. Peer coach & ED Bridge Program within the acute care setting. The remaining community engagement activities related to the Brandywine Counseling Services were also paused. In light of COVID-19 restrictions being closely monitored and removed or reduced as per CDC guidelines, Saint Francis has engaged partner collaborations for inpatient and outpatient behavioral health, mental health & MAT.

Chronic Disease Prevention and Management

Overview. Poorly managed diabetes often signals a problem with accessing healthcare services. Cost of devices and supplies, lack of or limited insurance, and lack of access to routine care are the most common barriers those with chronic diseases encounter. Diabetes nationally and in Delaware disproportionately affects minority and older populations. The Saint Clare Mobile Outreach Van is a primary care office on wheels serving northern New Castle County, Delaware, Monday through Fridays delivering medical care to people who are poor, homeless and uninsured. The Van offers physicals, immunizations (adult and children), preventative screenings and point of care testing as well as access to free or reduced prescription medications. In addition to providing traditional primary care services, the Van is a social care hub, referring patients to community-based organizations and social service agencies through the use of Find Help platform. The St. Clare Medical Outreach Van partnered with Quality Insights to improve access to mammograms, pap smears, colonoscopies and other screenings at no cost or low cost to St. Clare Van patients. Quality Insights navigators connected with St. Clare Van patients weekly, and with participants of the monthly mobile food bank to provide education and referrals. The St. Clare Medical Outreach Van obtained take home blood pressure kits through a grant. Patients with high or uncontrolled blood pressure were identified and kits were distributed free of charge to the patient. Patient education on use of the kits was provided and blood pressure monitored for improvement. The Saint Clare Medical Outreach Van referred patients to Dispensary of Hope pharmacy charity care programs for insulin and other medications.

Goal Improve diabetes management among St. Clare Van patients by reducing or preventing diabetes related complications arising from

Impact Our community benefit activities included going directly into underserved communities/ populations and providing COVID-19 vaccine education and administration. Part of our community benefit portfolio includes providing access to primary care physicians in a medically underserved area. In addition, St. Francis maintain a 24-hour emergency room, an open medical staff, and a board comprised largely of independent members of the community. The organization extends privileges to all qualified physicians in the community. COVID-19 vaccines and education for 3, 753 individuals as part of the “It Starts Here Campaign” in collaboration with United Way of Delaware & Latin American Community Center. The St. Clare van provided COVID-19 vaccines and testing for adults and children within the community by meeting people where they live work and play weekly through years 2021 & 2022. St. Clare also provided medication assistance through the Dispensary of Hope including insulin to over 436 individuals.

Food Insecurity

Overview Food insecurity has been associated with low food expenditure, low fruit and vegetable consumption, and a less-healthy diet. Over consumption of low-cost, energy- dense foods may result in a greater energy intake and lead to obesity, which in turn, increases one’s risk for heart disease, diabetes, cancer, and other chronic diseases. Saint Francis continued and expanded its food insecurity program in Fiscal Year 2022. St. Francis Hospital partnered with Food Bank of Delaware to provide nonperishable, fresh produce, dairy, and other refrigerated or frozen items once a month to those living in the surrounding area of St. Francis. Additionally, Saint Francis contracted with Lancaster Farm Fresh program to supplement the Mobile Food Pantry with weekly delivery of healthy fruits and vegetables through the Trinity Farm Box program.

Goal Increase consumption of healthy foods among patients with high risk factors for food insecurity and diet-related health conditions.

Impact This mobile pantry in FY22 helped to support 895 families with more than 80 food insecure families or individuals per month. In FY22 3,499 Trinity Farm Boxes were distributed to community members. The individuals or families who received produce were identified as food insecure and were diagnosed with either diabetes or obesity. Weekly, two thirds of the produce boxes were divided among Marydale Retirement Village a low-income senior living facility and low-income families served by the Latin American Community Center. In FY22 405 Grocery store gift cards were provided throughout the year and especially during holidays, to families who met the need of food insecure and needed extra assistance purchasing groceries. Saint Francis partnered with William Lewis Elementary and Las Americas Aspira for The Backpack Meal Program. There were 2,908 Backpack meals provided weekend for students and others who did not have access to food outside the normal school week.

CHNA Methods & Process

The Association for Community Health Improvement's (ACHI) community engagement model frames our Fiscal Year 2023 CHNA. Steps 1 through 6 on the diagram below are the focus of this Report. Step 7, the Implementation Plan, will be made available on or before November 15, 2023. Steps 8 and 9 will be rolled out between Fiscal Year 2023-2026.



Stakeholder Engagement

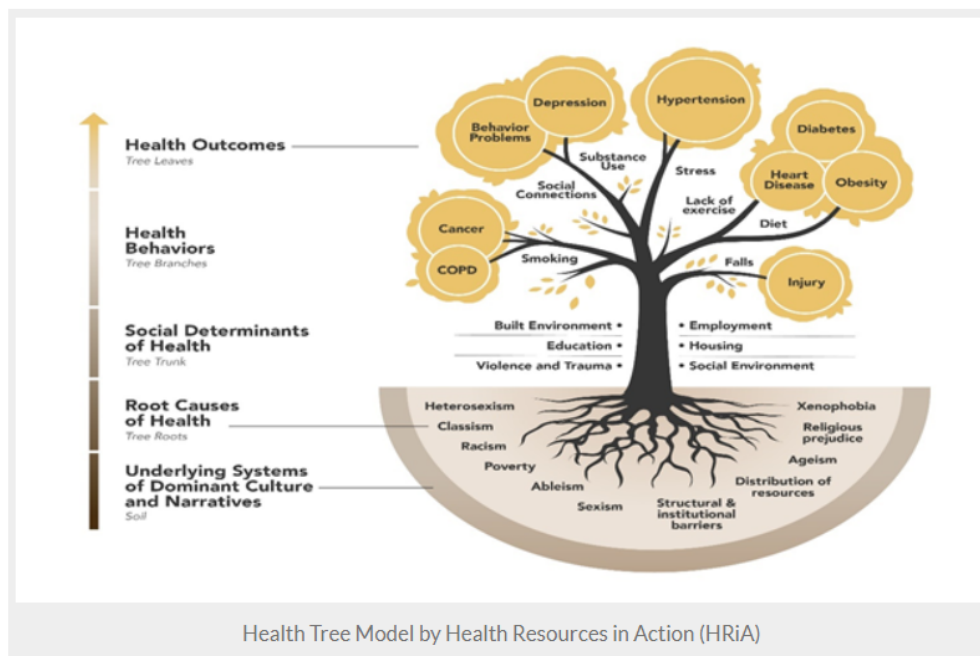
Engaging our community stakeholders in meaningful discussions was a goal we established early in the CHNA process. We benefited from participating in neighborhood, city and county coalitions or consortiums that were also addressing community health needs albeit from a different perspective. Some of those community groups include: Westside Grows Together, Wilmington COVID-19 Community Mobilization, Equitable Wilmington CDFI Collaborative, among others. The end result of more frequent and on-going engagement was an expanded network of stakeholders who could provide insight and overall direction for our FY 2023 CHNA. Most importantly, as explained in later sections of this Report, stakeholders participated in a needs identification and prioritization process.

Our Approach to Health Equity

While community health needs assessments (CHNA) and Implementation Strategies are required by the IRS, Trinity Health ministries have historically conducted CHNAs and developed Implementation Strategies as a way to meaningfully engage our communities and plan our Community Health & Well-being work. Community Health & Well-Being promotes optimal health for those who are experiencing poverty or other vulnerabilities in the communities we serve by connecting social and clinical care, addressing social needs, dismantling systemic racism, and reducing health inequities. Trinity Health has adopted the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's definition of Health Equity - "Health equity means that everyone has a fair and just opportunity to be as healthy as possible. This requires removing obstacles to health such as poverty, discrimination, and their consequences, including powerlessness and lack of access to good jobs with fair pay, quality education and housing, safe environments, and healthcare."

Health equity means achieving the conditions where everyone has the ability to live to their full health potential. Captured visually in the accompanying tree graphic is an analysis of what prevents health equity. We acknowledge that the causes of inequity are the deep-rooted, longstanding belief systems and narratives that were historically developed to confer advantage and power to certain groups, in order to disadvantage and disempower other groups. Historically, advantaged groups that asserted power over others included White people, males, those with wealth and land, cisgender and heterosexual people, and people without disabilities. Groups that were dominated and excluded included women, people without wealth, indigenous tribes, enslaved Africans and their descendants, Latin Americans, Asians and Pacific Islanders, other immigrants, people with disabilities, LGBTQIA+ and religious minorities.

Systemic racism, structural poverty, and the others in the graphic's tree roots are each a means to perpetuate dominant advantage, and they continue today. They show up in public policies, institutional practices, including in healthcare systems, and individual actions. As a result, race, ethnicity, age, gender, wealth and income, disability status, etc. determine one's ability to receive quality health care, earn a living wage, live in safe, affordable housing, enjoy freedom from violence, receive a good education, and have access to healthy foods and physical activity.



Community Served

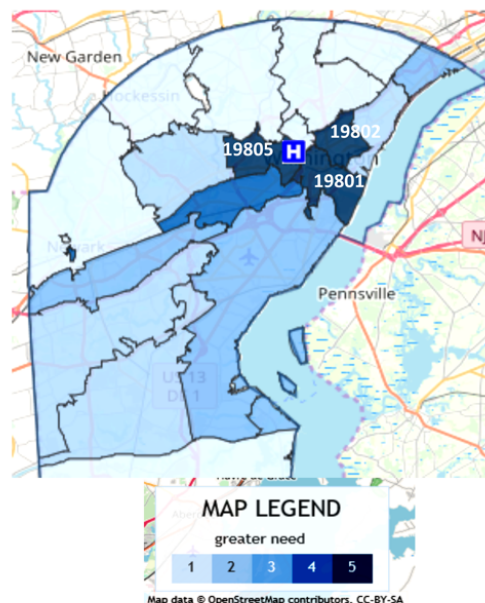
For the purposes of the 2023 CHNA Saint Francis Hospital used a geographic approach focusing on the area which most patients come for care and defines the community served as: 1) The City of Wilmington; and 2) Census Tract 22, bounded by West 6th Street to the North; I-95 to the west; Lancaster Avenue to the South; and Broom Street to the East.

By defining the geographic area and population, we were diligent to ensure that no groups, especially minority, low-income, or medically under-served, were excluded from the assessment process or data collection. The Hospital itself is geographically located in 19805, making it a true inner-city, community hospital.

The map below shows where the hospital is located in relation to the three zip codes. The darkest areas of shading represent areas with the highest social-economic needs score. Census Tract 22, located within a few blocks of the Hospital, is considered a high needs neighborhood within 19805 due to its high poverty rates especially among children, and its demonstrated poor health outcomes. Census Tract 22 presents Saint Francis Hospital with an opportunity to improve health outcomes in neighborhoods that may have fallen through the cracks.

Community Profile

The following tables are a demographic overview of the City of Wilmington in comparison to the State and US data.

Prosperity Now, a national non-profit devoted to increasing economic opportunity in low income areas, in partnership with JP Morgan Chase, released a March 2019 report called *The Racial Wealth Divide in Wilmington*. The report concluded the average median household income for black and Hispanic families living in Wilmington is half that of white families. Furthermore, the report concluded that nearly 65% of Hispanic households lack sufficient savings to replace income at the poverty level for three months if they were to experience a sudden job loss, medical emergency, or other financial crisis. Hispanic/Latinx residents lead in income poverty, with roughly 30 percent of families in Wilmington earning below the federal poverty level for the past 12 months.

With respect to housing, the Prosperity Now report found that the city's home ownership rate stands at 56 percent for white residents, nearly twenty points higher than that for black and Hispanic/Latinx residents, and roughly double that for Latino residents. The study did acknowledge that Wilmington's black-white racial divide in home ownership is smaller than the national divide.

Healthy People 2030 defines social determinants of health (SDOH) as “conditions in the environments in which people are born, live, learn, work, play, worship, and age that affect a wide range of health, functioning, and quality-of-life outcomes and risks (<https://health.gov/healthypeople/priority-areas/social-determinants-health>).” Understanding the relationship between how populations experience conditions (e.g., social, economic and physical) in differing environments and settings (e.g., school, church, workplace and neighborhood) and the impact those conditions have on health is fundamental to the SDOH framework — including both social and physical determinants. Healthy People 2030 developed five key areas of SDOH as a guiding framework (Figure below).



Data Collection and Analysis

Data from multiple sources were gathered and assessed, including secondary data published by others and primary data obtained through community input. Input from the community was received through key informant interviews and a community survey. Informant interviews and survey participants represented the broad interest of the community and included individuals that serve children, homeless populations, LGBTQ+, Spanish speaking populations, public health organizations, school districts and health care organizations. (See Appendix D) A wide array of information is important when assessing community health needs to ensure the assessment captures a wide range of facts and perspectives and to increase confidence that significant community health needs have been identified accurately and objectively. Statistics for numerous community health status, health care access, and related indicators were analyzed, including data from local, state, and federal government agencies, and local community service organizations.

In addition to the data analysis, we inventoried and reviewed existing state and community reports to better understand the contextual relationship between the Saint Francis CHNA and the broader healthcare landscape. Please see Appendix B for an inventory of reports reviewed.

Secondary data was collected between September 2022 and February 2023 to describe the population living within the region that is being served. Previously published reports documenting regional health needs were reviewed to develop a list of data sources and commonly used indicators to describe the population. The review showed that demographic, socioeconomic, environmental, and health data were commonly used. Four direct sources were used for the secondary data analysis. These sources are listed below:

- The Trinity Health Data Hub: The Trinity Health Data Hub supports a network of hospitals and their community benefit teams by providing easy access to core health outcomes and behaviors. The Hub hosts two reports - a custom Community Health Needs Assessment and a Vital Sign report. Data are available by hospital service area, aggregate areas, and system wide. The CHNA report is comprised of specific indicators that were selected by the CHWB council and are required for all Trinity Health ministries to include in their CHNA data analysis. The indicators available on the data hub replace the previously distributed list of required indicators. <https://trinityhealthdatahub.org/> (Appendix A)

Primary data was gathered through stakeholder interviews, community surveys, and community meetings between July 2019 and February 2023.

Informant Interviews- 67 Comprehensive internal and external interviews were conducted to learn about community health needs in New Castle County to better prepare for future concerns as the hospital transforms into a Healthy Village; a revolutionary model of strengthening critically needed traditional healthcare services and enhancing them with others offered by trusted partners woven into a single system of care. Interviews focused on ways to improve the health and well-being of people and communities, and address needs, which the pandemic has amplified. See Appendix D for information regarding who participated in the interviews.

The interviewees most frequently identified the following issues:

1. Behavioral Health (including mental health & substance abuse)
2. Housing (including homeless)
3. Food Access/Insecurity
4. Education (Pre-K through skills/college)
5. Senior Care

- An stakeholder serving the Hispanic/Latino population commented, “ **There is a gap in behavioral health and mental health services and resources for the black and brown community.**” There is still a stigma among the community leading black and brown people less likely to seek care via the traditional healthcare system.
- A housing comment, “**Homelessness in Wilmington is a Public Health challenge, how do we coordinate services**”, was made by a community-based organization in the context of discussing health disparities.
- A stakeholder from a community-based organization commented, “**we need better access to affordable healthy food at more locations**”. This speaks to systemic issues such as poverty, income inequalities, and other structural problems requiring coordinated policy and environmental changes.
- A representative from a public health agency, “**We need innovative leaders and mentors for career planning and supportive programs to aid students and help them graduate**” in the context of discussing the Social Determinants of Health (SDOH).

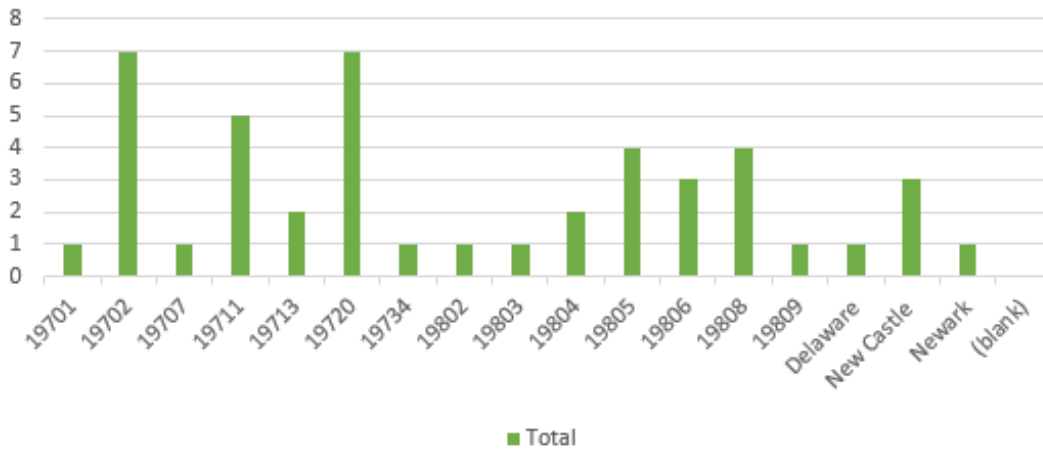
- Since the last CHNA, Saint Francis has attended and participated in neighborhood, city, and state level meetings to promote alignment of CHNA priorities among multiple stakeholders. Saint Francis Hospital is an active member of groups such as Westside Grows Together, Wilmington COVID-19 Community Mobilization, Equitable Wilmington CDFI Collaborative, among others. These meetings provided a forum for CHNA discussions.

Community Survey

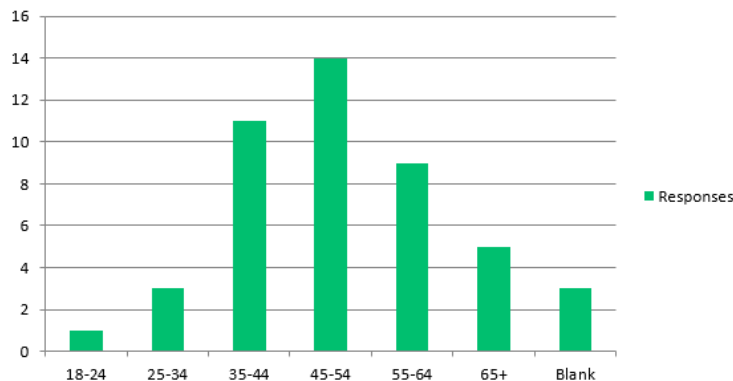
An on-line community survey conducted through Survey Monkey was made available to community residents and Saint Francis employees between December 2022 and February 2023. The survey consists of questions relating to demographic, racial and social equity, social determinants of health, healthcare access, and lifestyle. The survey was fielded to the community and to stakeholders, respectively via paper copy, website link, and/or QR code in both English and Spanish. The survey link was promoted through various distributions channels. We posted the link to social media accounts, gave out surveys at two community health fairs, emailed links to community-based organizations for their help with distribution, and reached out to patients supported through the Saint Clare Community Outreach Van. A copy of the survey is found in Appendix C. The total number of survey respondents was 46. While the surveys conducted for this CHNA provide valuable insights, results are not statistically representative of a larger population due to small sample size.

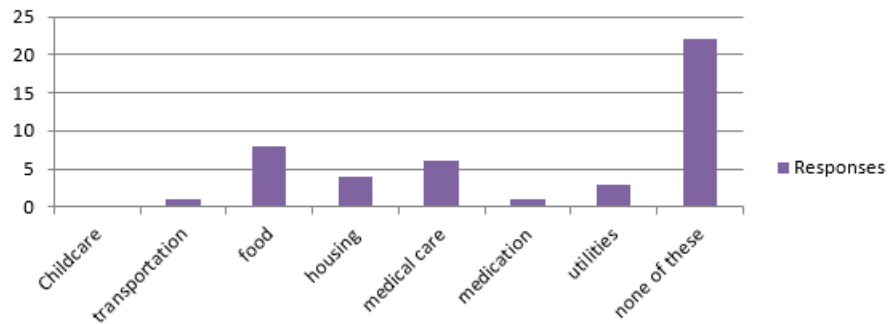
Survey Participant Zip Codes



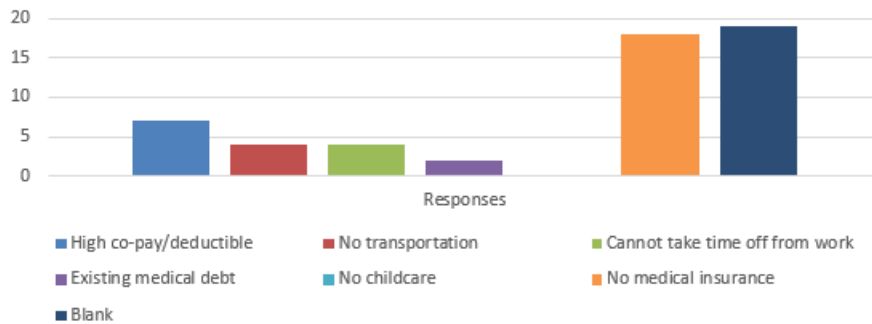
What is your age group (years)?



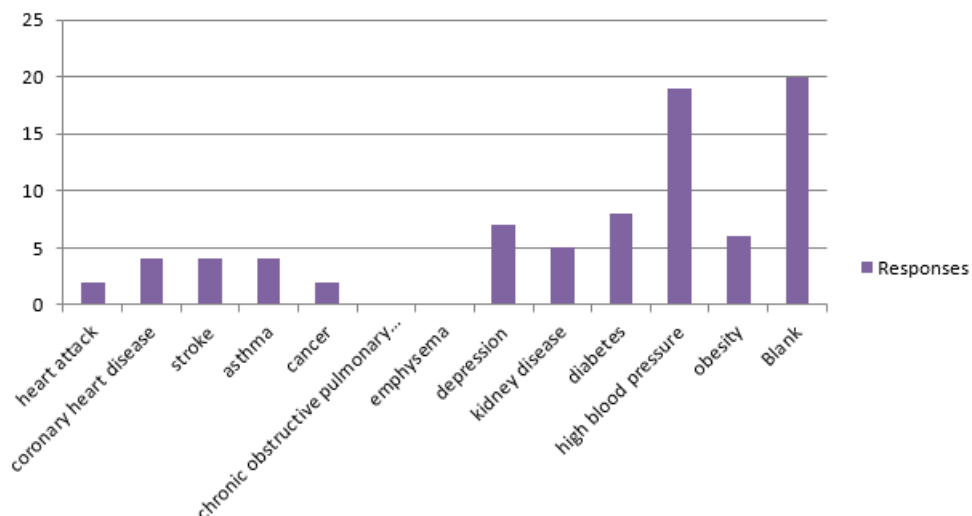
Within the last past 12 months, have you or anyone in your household have trouble paying for any of the following? (check all that apply)

The overall goal of the community health needs assessment is to identify and prioritize the needs of community members. This section included general questions from the survey designed to identify what is working well in the community and what community members feel like those needs are.

Are there any additional services or resources that you think should be available to your community to help residents maintain or improve their overall health?

"My employer's health insurance requires co-insurance for almost everything, even stuff that is preventative care, like proper care for my diabetes so that I decrease my risk of stroke or kidney disease. It really eats into my monthly budget."

"Fresh food, community gardens, grocery stores. More fitness areas in parks."

"Safe routes/roads, more public transportation, affordable housing."

"Reduced and /or free accessible mental health services."

"Offer more free medical services."

What strengths and resources are available in your community that help residents maintain or improve their overall health?

"My PCP, diagnostics, hospital ERs, labs."

"Food bank, WIC, other community organizations."

Significant Community Health Needs

Process for Significant Needs Identification

As determined by analysis of quantitative and qualitative data, with an overarching focus on advancing health equity, recognizing that racism and poverty contribute to measurable health disparities, Saint Francis developed a collaborative, community-engaged approach to comprehensively assess the health needs of the population defined by the CHNA. Significant Community Health Needs were identified by: 1) data analysis comparing Delaware to national health and well-being benchmarks (Healthy People 2023, County Health Rankings, Trinity Data Hub) and measuring the difference between the benchmark and the community's performance on the benchmark; 2) conducting an on-line community health survey; and 3) engaging community partners in a prioritization process to identify and prioritize needs from the community perspective. The assessment resulted in a list of 12 high priority community health needs. The purpose of prioritizing the significant health needs is to allow for West Side Grows Together Steering committee members to easily pinpoint which needs have been deemed most critical and practical to direct resources, time and energy toward. The needs represented three categories: health issues, access and quality of healthcare and health resources, and community factors. West Side Grows Together Steering Committee members represent a broad range of community stakeholders including West Side residents, civic associations, neighborhood planning councils, institutions, and businesses.

12 High Priority Community Health Needs: Behavioral Health, Housing, Food Access, Education, Senior Care/ Isolation, Chronic Conditions, Linguistically and Culturally appropriate services, Access to Care, Health and Health Resource Navigation, Racism and discrimination in healthcare settings, socioeconomic disadvantage and community violence.

Prioritization of Needs Process

For each need, the West Side Grows Together Steering Committee assigned scores for both Criterion 1: Size of the Health Problem (based on relevant health indicators) and Criterion 2: Importance to Community (based on the frequency a given community health need was mentioned during qualitative data collection). West Side Grows Together Steering Committee, represents a broad range of community stakeholders including West Side residents, civic associations, neighborhood planning councils, institutions, and businesses. The members were asked to individually rank unmet health needs from the list of significant health needs based on the defined criterion in (Appendix F) using a modified Hanlon Method. The prioritization tools is provided as Appendix G.

A modified Hanlon rating method was used to prioritize the community health needs. Each committee member scored the remaining three criteria (Capacity to Address, Alignment with Hospital/Health System Mission and Strategic Direction, Existing Collaborations/Interventions) using the ranking guidance. A final score was computed for each health need by weighting the score for each criterion and adding the weighted scores.

An aggregate score for each community health need was calculated as an average of the scores for that health need. The health needs were then prioritized from highest to lowest final aggregate score.

As a final check, the 'PEARL' test was applied to each health need to screen out any community health needs that did not meet the following feasibility factors:

Propriety –Is a program for the health problem suitable?

Economics –Does it make economic sense to address the problem? Are there economic consequences if a problem is not carried out?

Acceptability –Will a community accept the program? Is it wanted?

Resources –Is funding available or potentially available for a program?

Legality –Do current laws allow program activities to be implemented?

No health needs were eliminated based on the PEARL test.

Saint Francis Hospital took into account input from the West Side Steering Committee, community leaders, public health officials, and community members at-large while selecting the priority areas of focus for the Fiscal Years 2023— 2026 Community Health Needs Assessment.

The Saint Francis CHNA priorities are:



Food Access
Housing
Access to Care

Each priority area will specifically target special needs populations in an effort both to help the State of Delaware reduce health disparities, and to uphold Saint Francis Healthcare's mission to serve as a safety net hospital.

Conclusion

Saint Francis Healthcare is in the process of completing the Community Health Implementation Plan due no later than November 15th, 2023. The Implementation Strategy Plan will identify specific programs and strategies for each of the three priority areas outlined in this Community Health Needs Assessment. The Implementation Strategy Plan is updated annually.

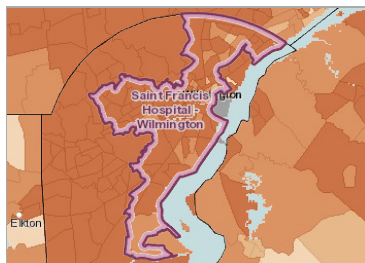

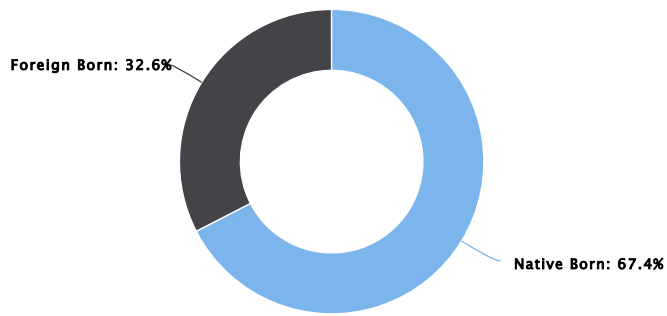

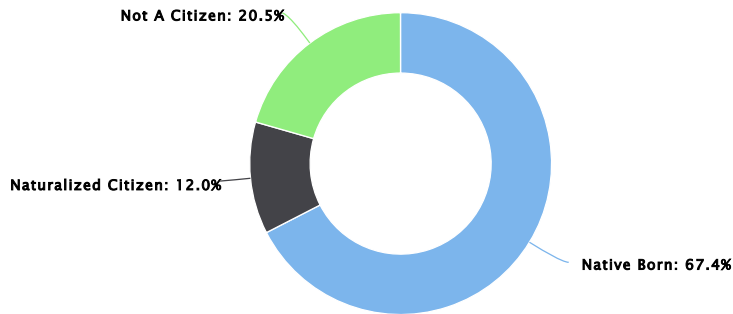

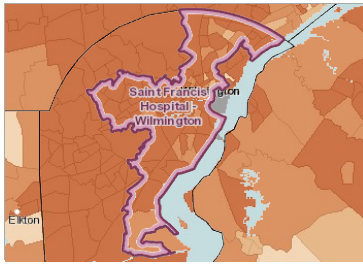

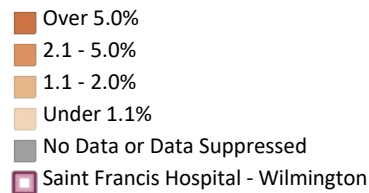

Foreign-Born Population (Non-Citizen or Naturalized), Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20

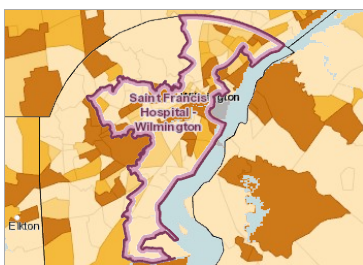

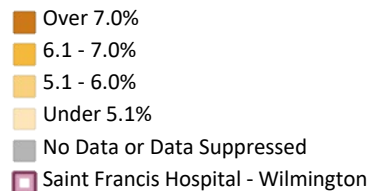

Population Age 0-4, Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20

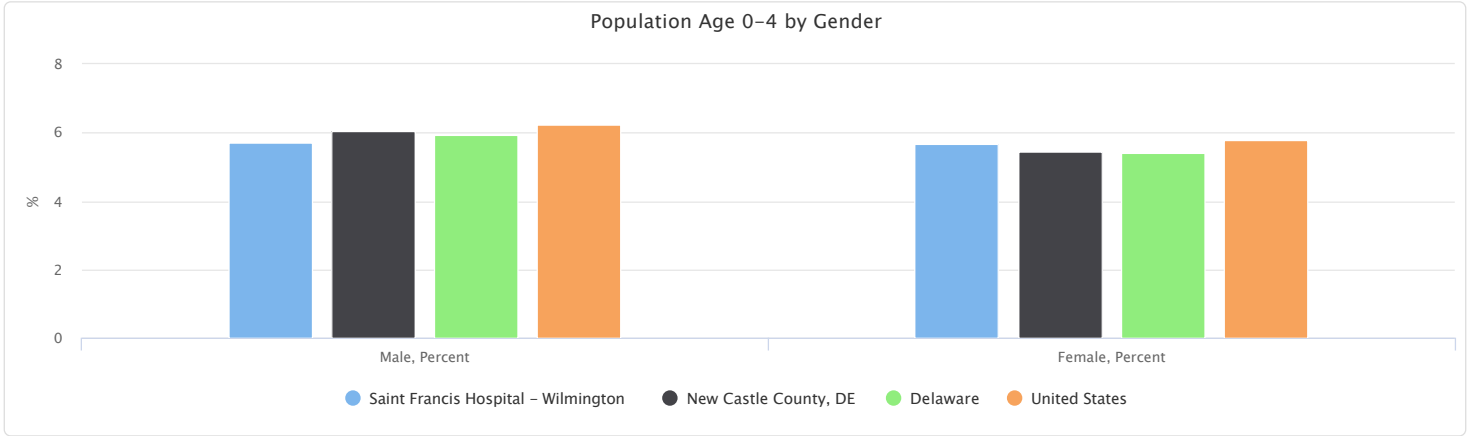

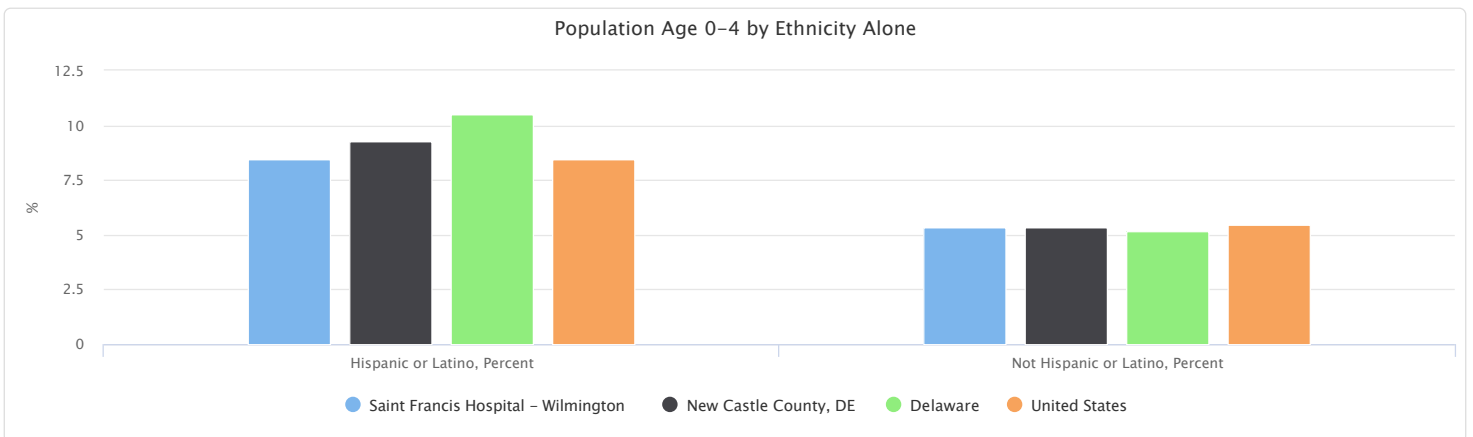


Population Age 0-4 by Ethnicity Alone

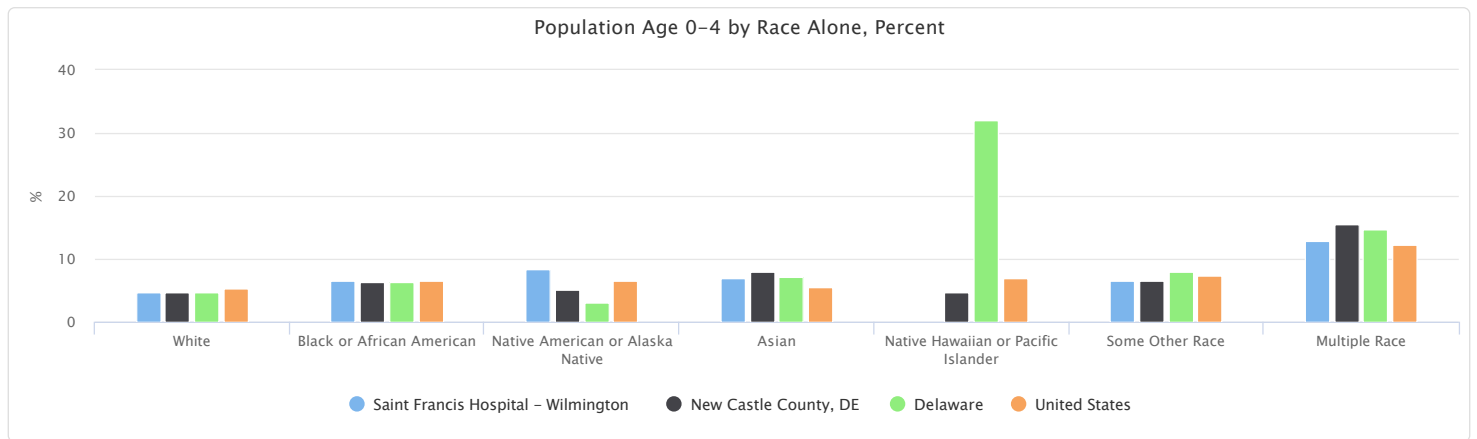

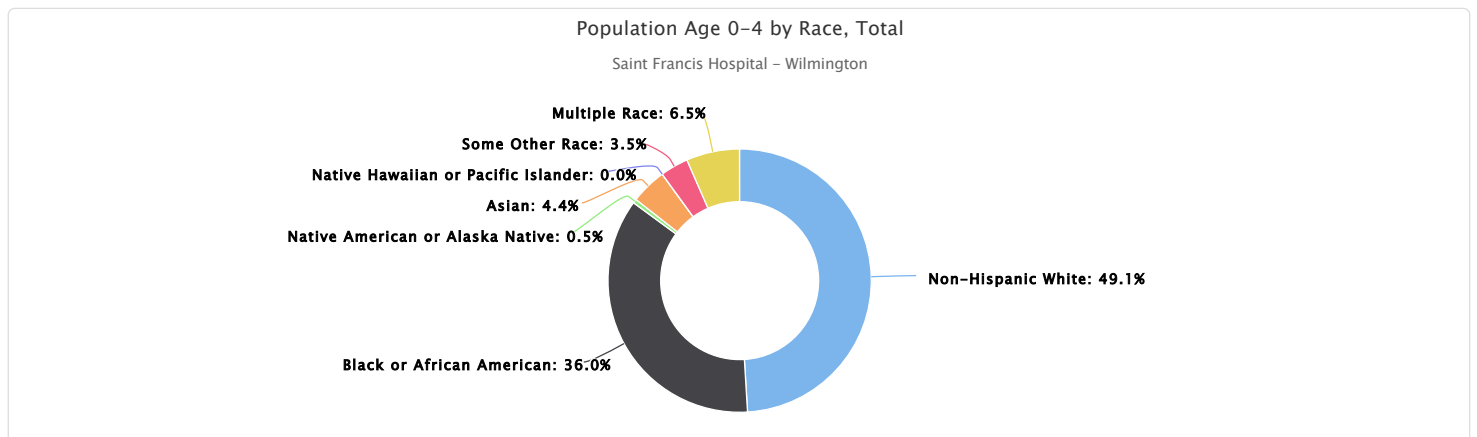


Population Age 0-4 by Race, Total

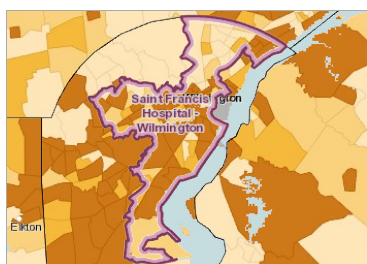

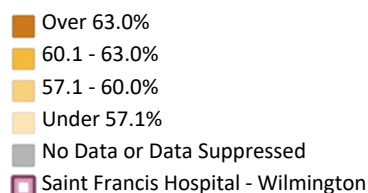

Population Age 18-64, Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20

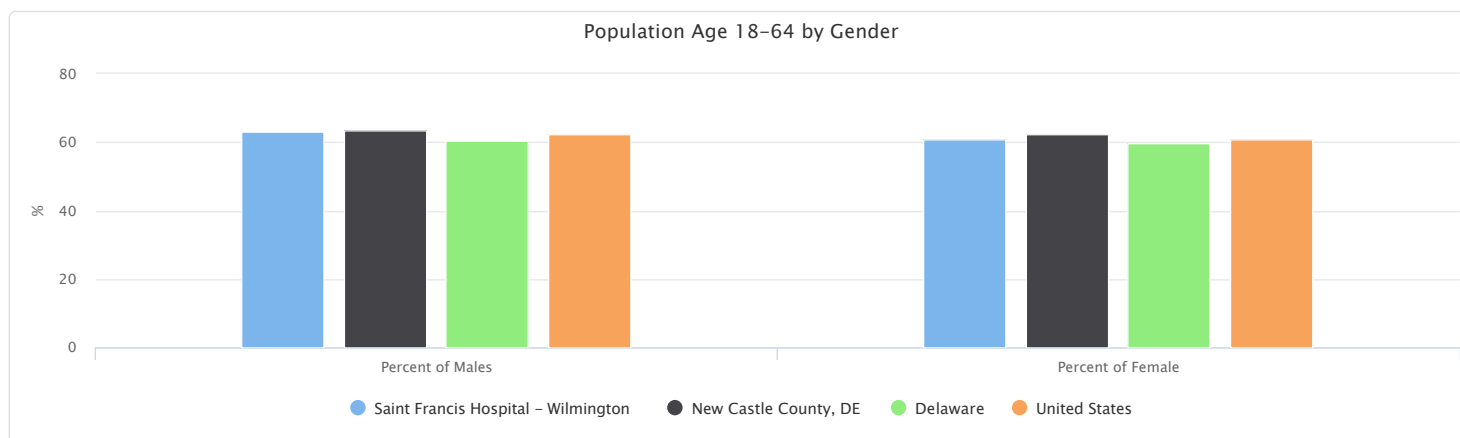

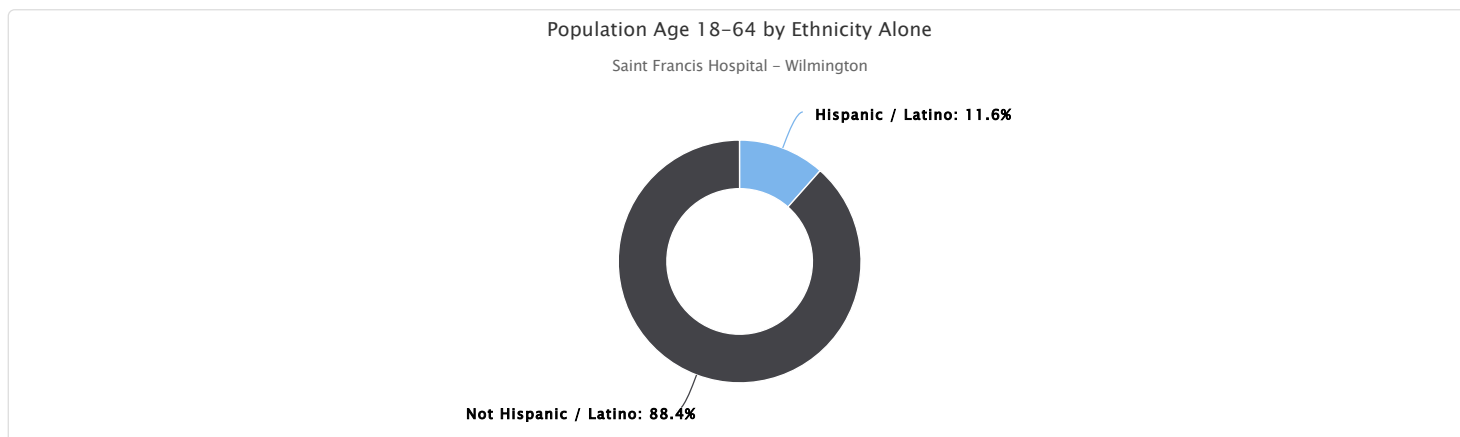


Population Age 18-64 by Ethnicity Alone

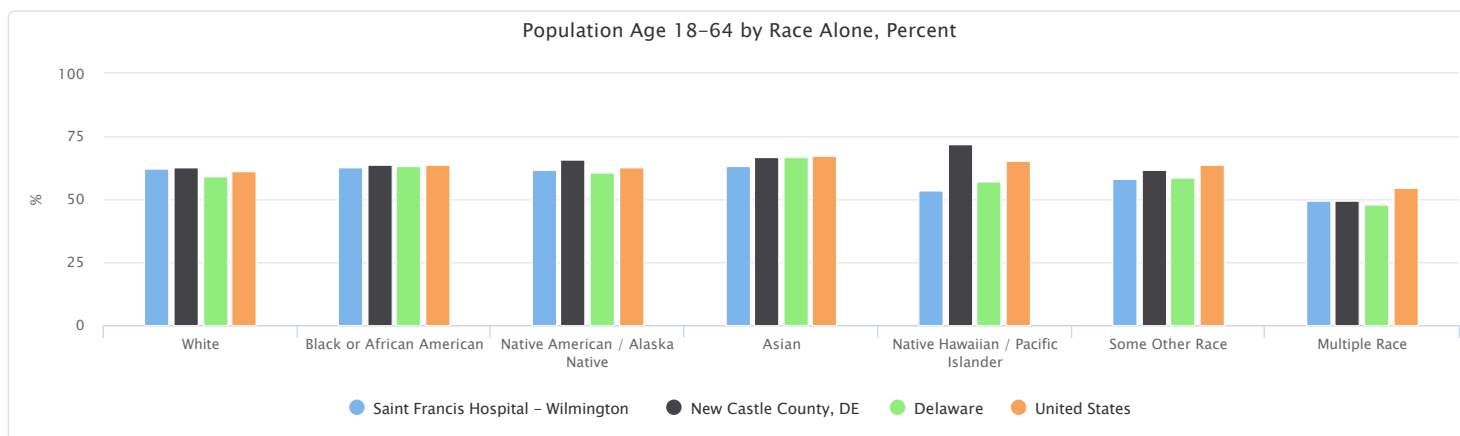


Population Age 18-64 by Race Alone, Percent

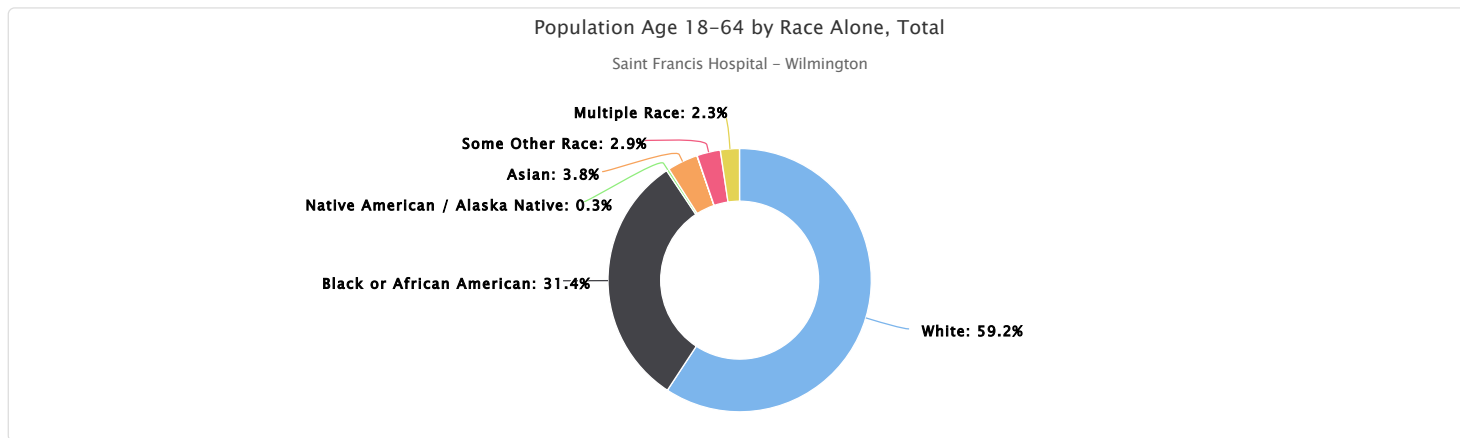


Population Age 18-64 by Race Alone, Total

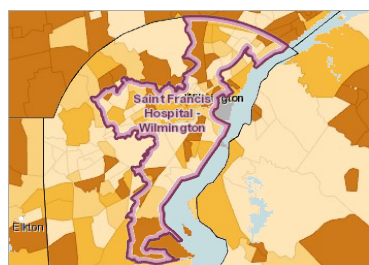

Population Age 5-17, Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20

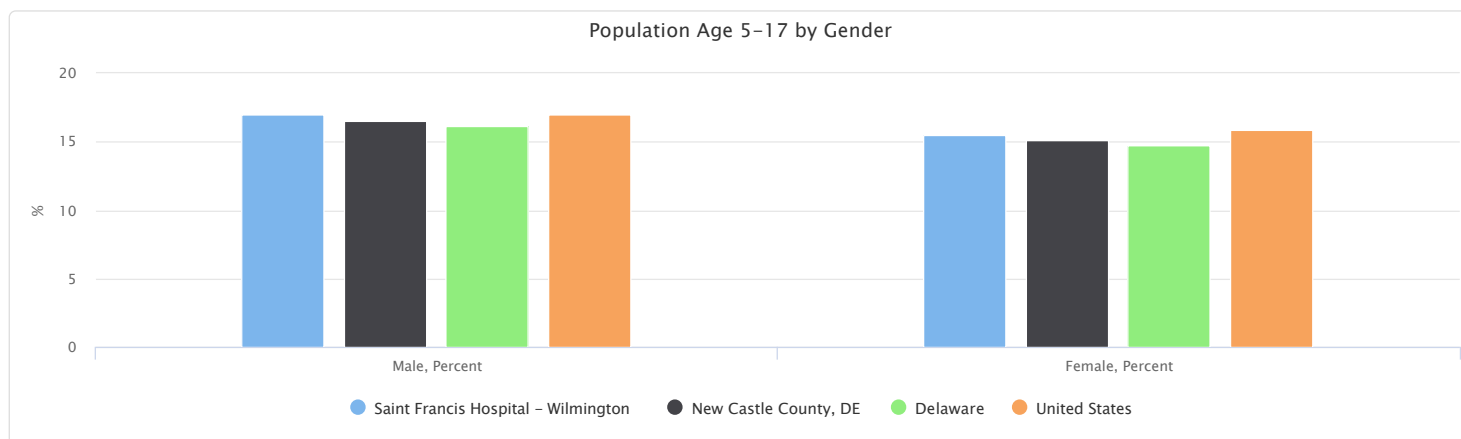

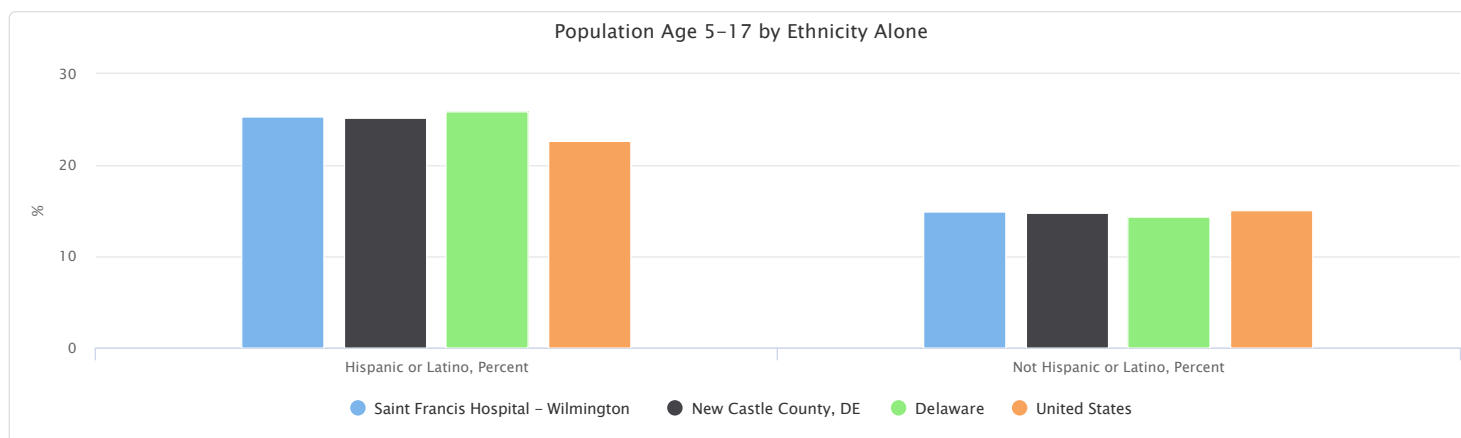


Population Age 5-17 by Ethnicity Alone

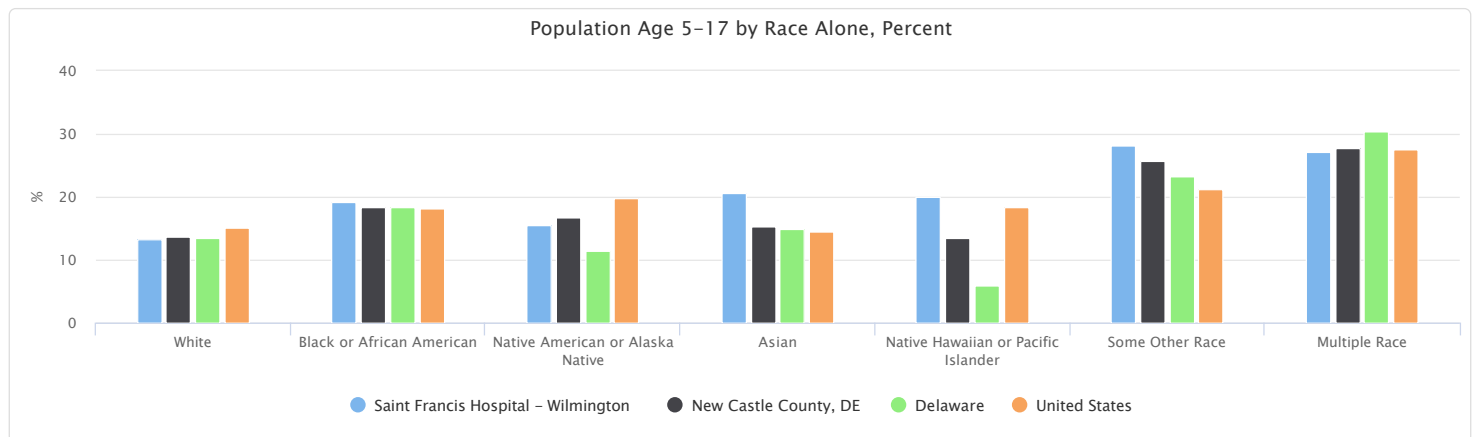


Population Age 5-17 by Race Alone, Percent

Population Age 5-17 by Race Alone, Total

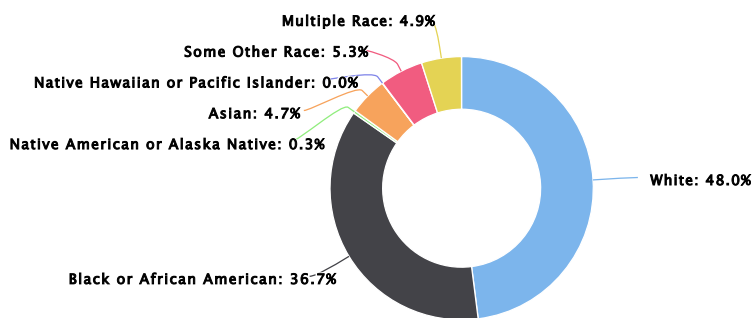

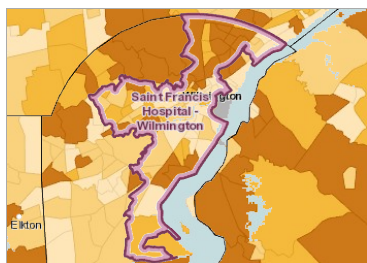

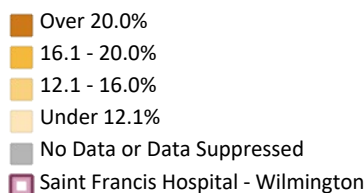

Population Age 65+, Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20

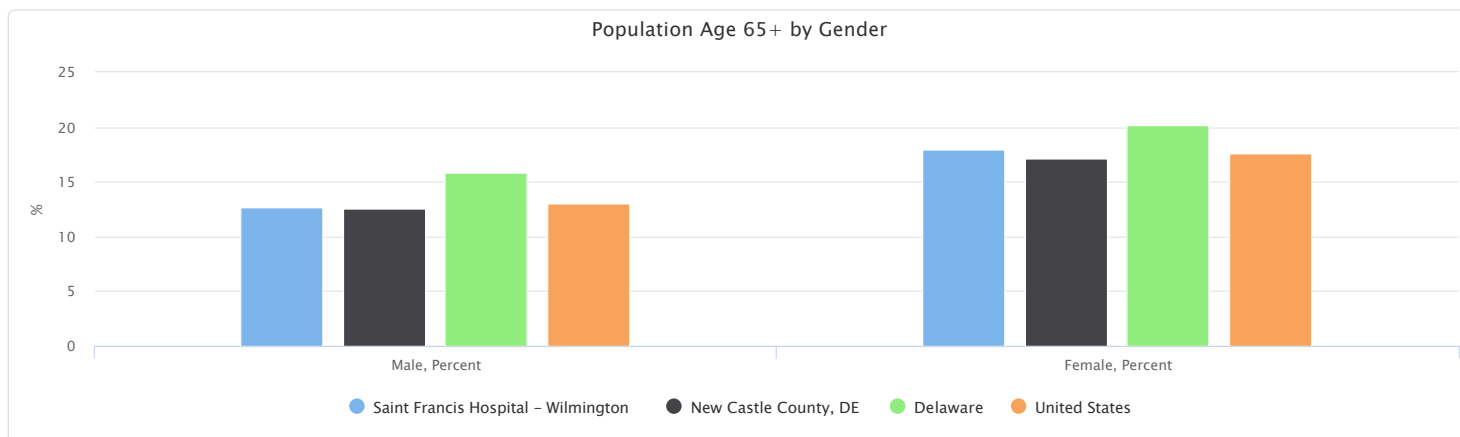

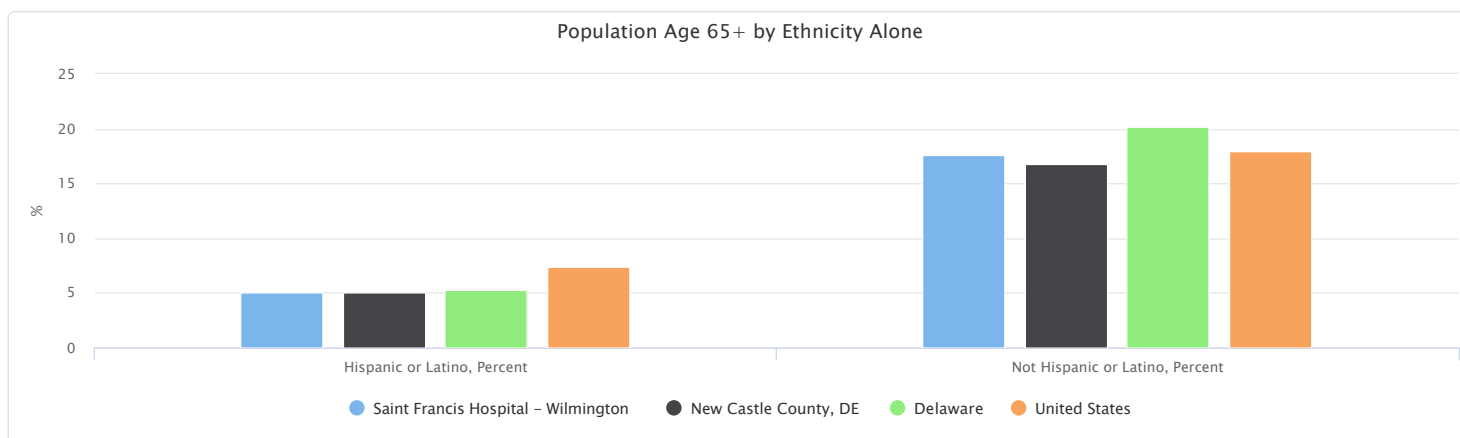


Population Age 65+ by Ethnicity Alone

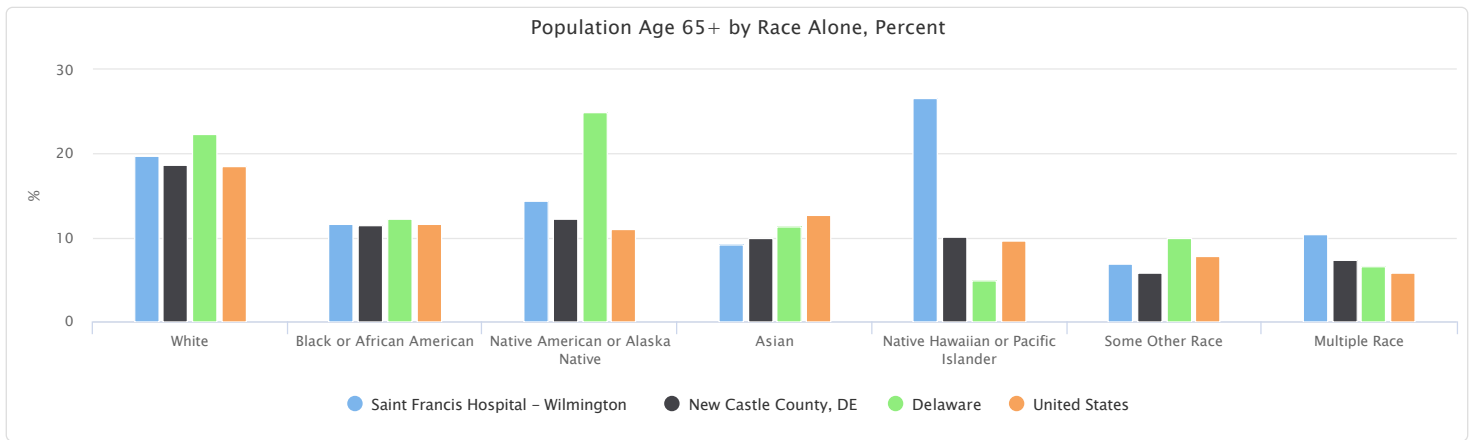


Population Age 65+ by Race Alone, Percent

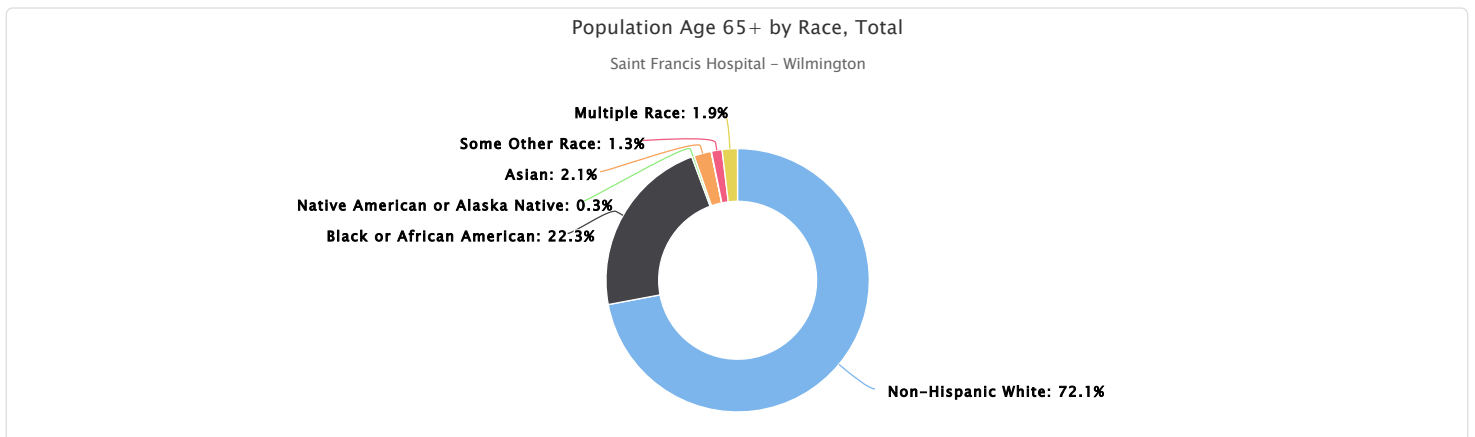

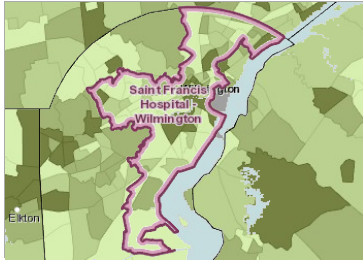

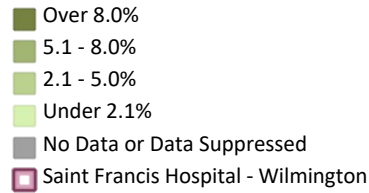

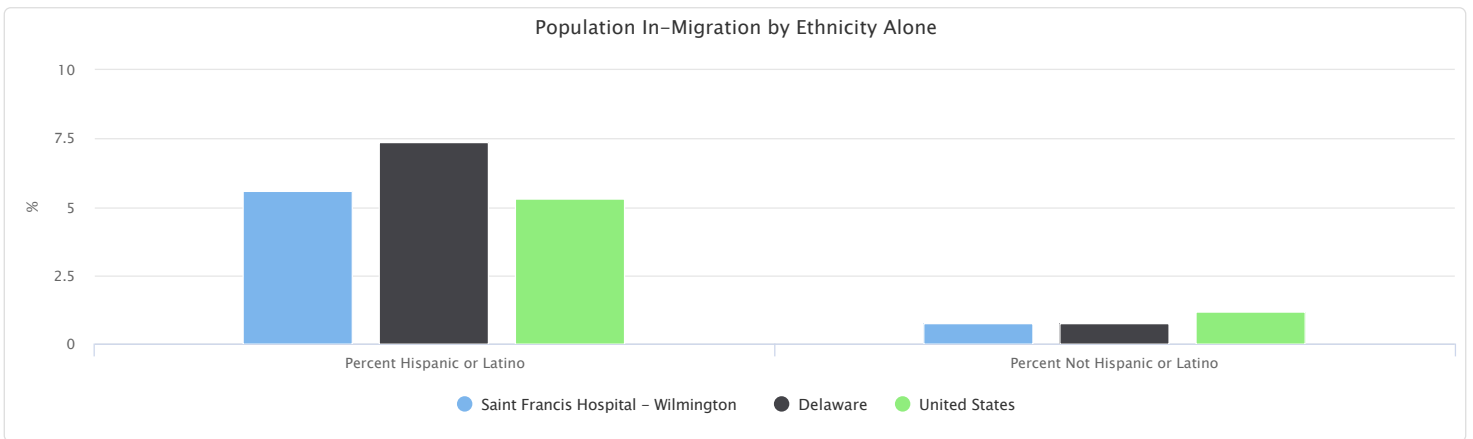
Population Migrated from Outside of the County, State, or Country, Percent of Total Population by Tract, ACS 2016-20

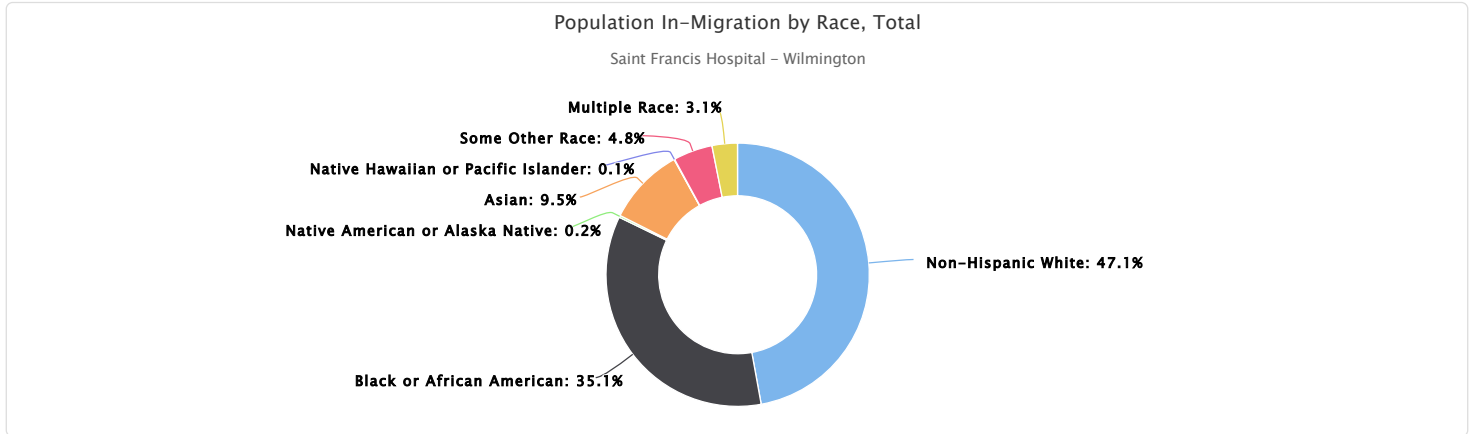

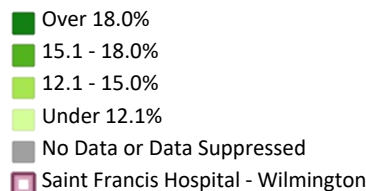

Disabled Population, Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20

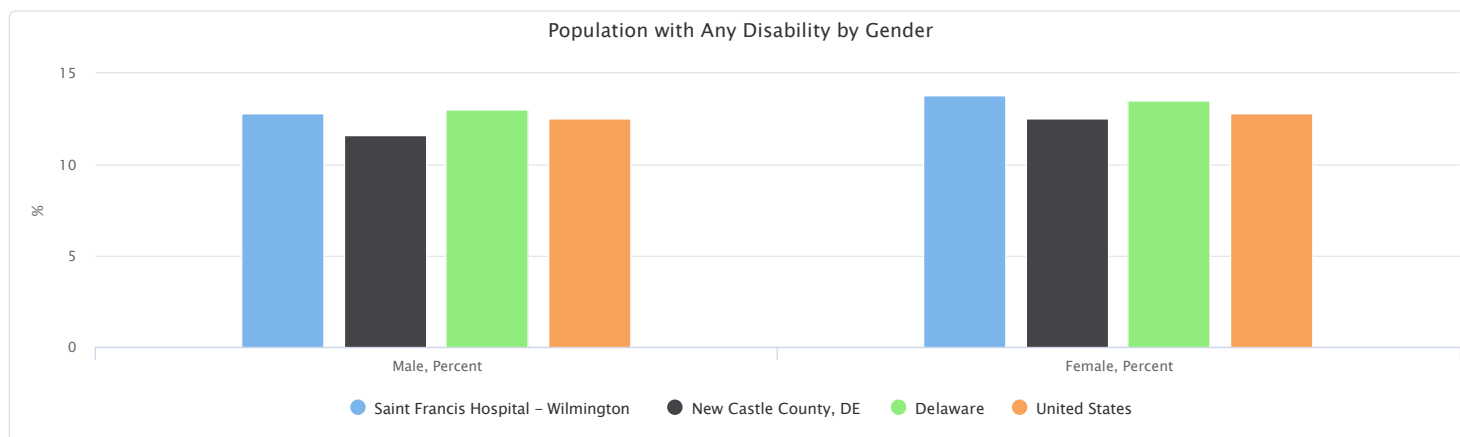

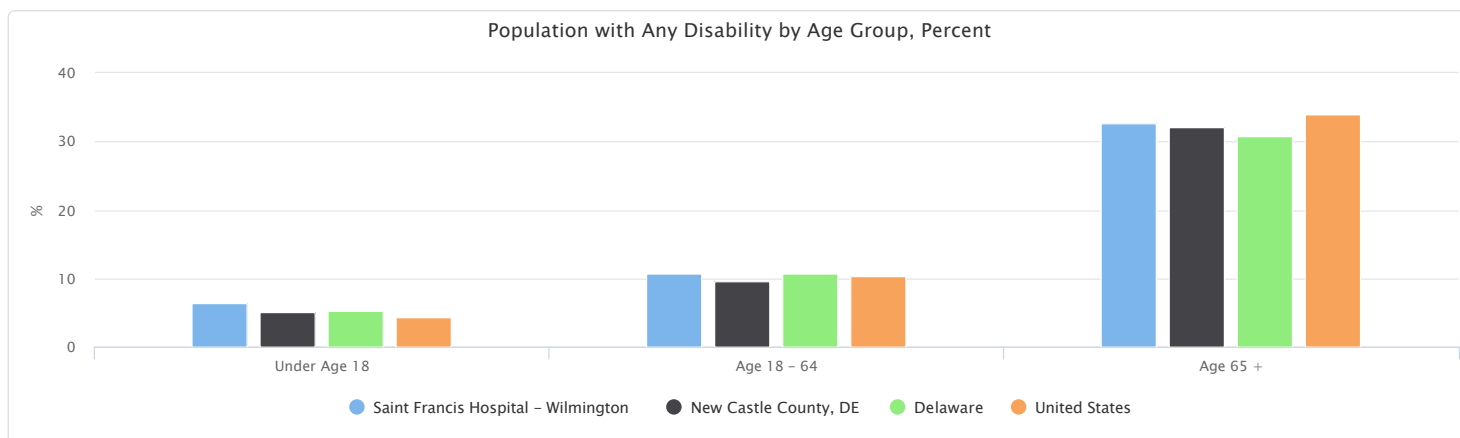

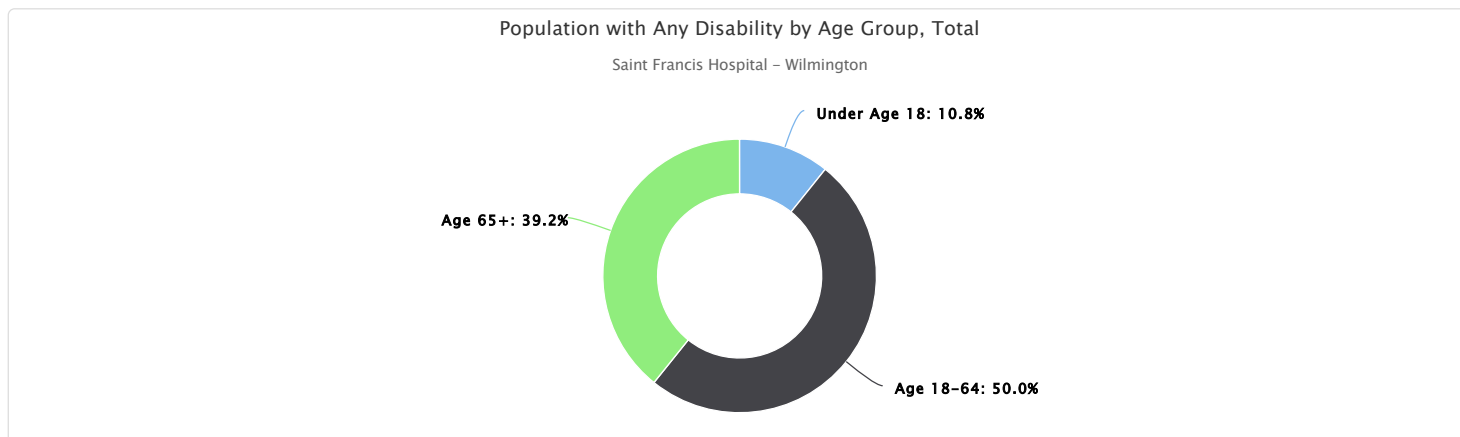

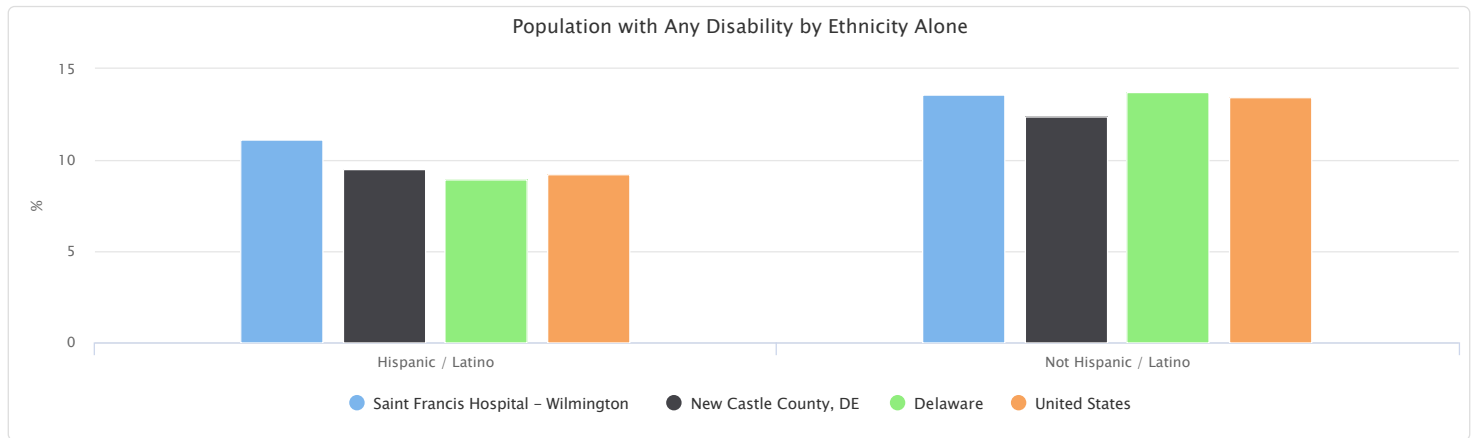

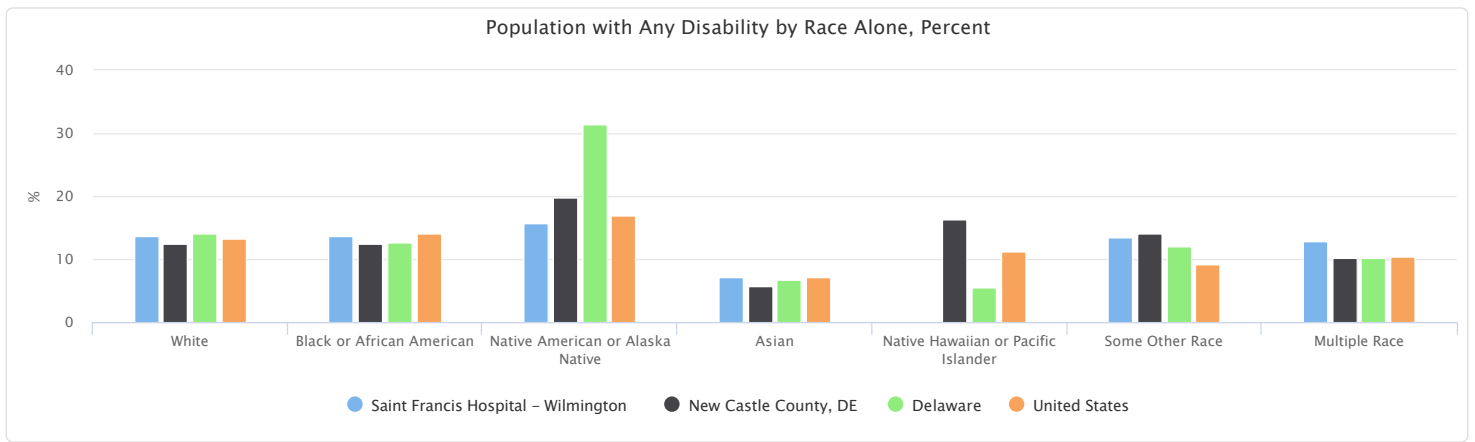

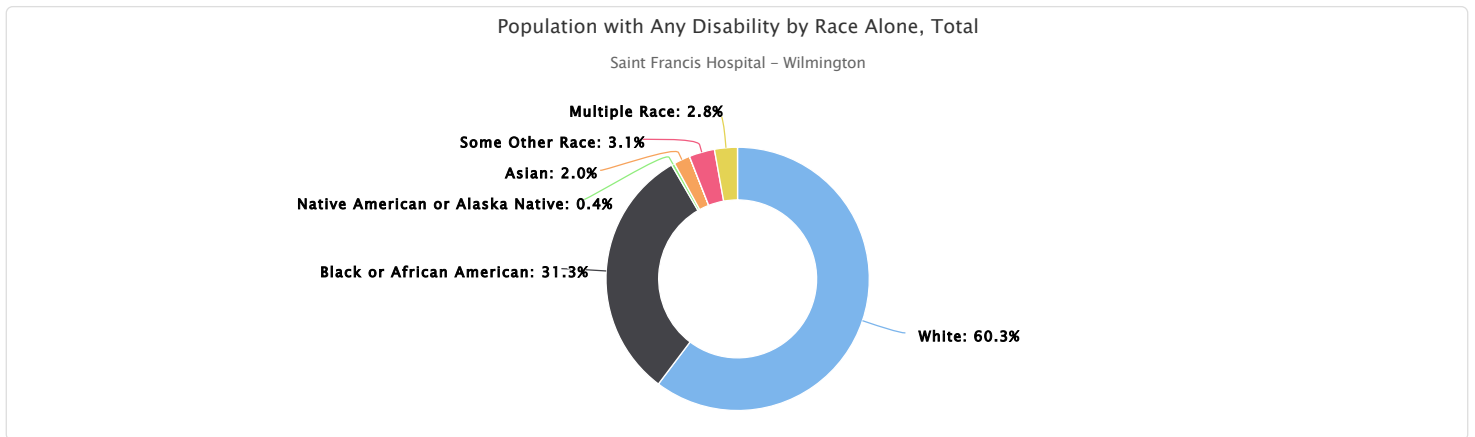

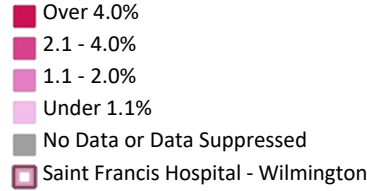

Population with Limited English Proficiency, Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20

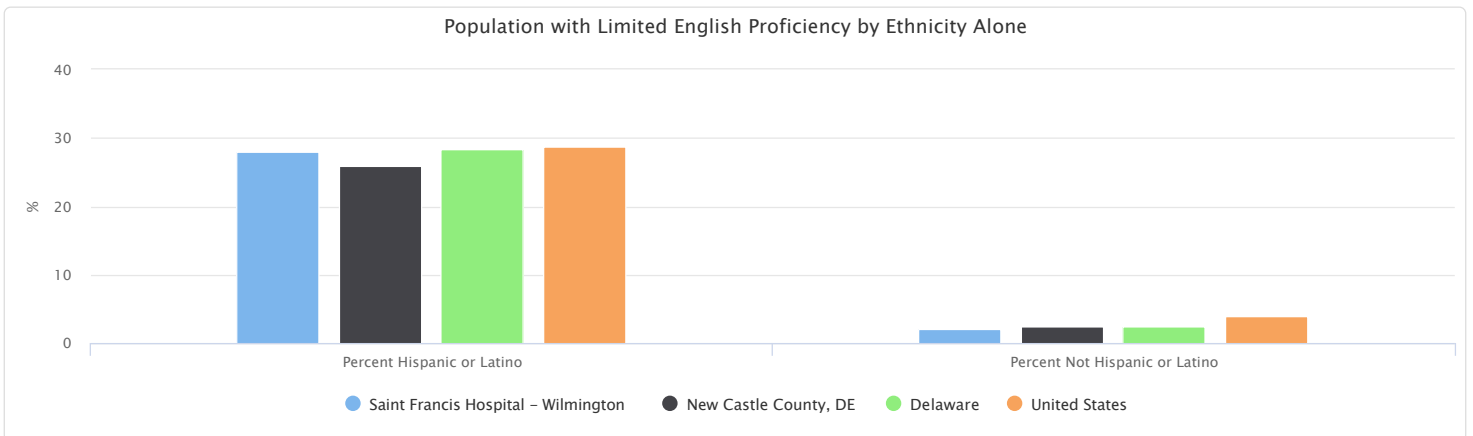

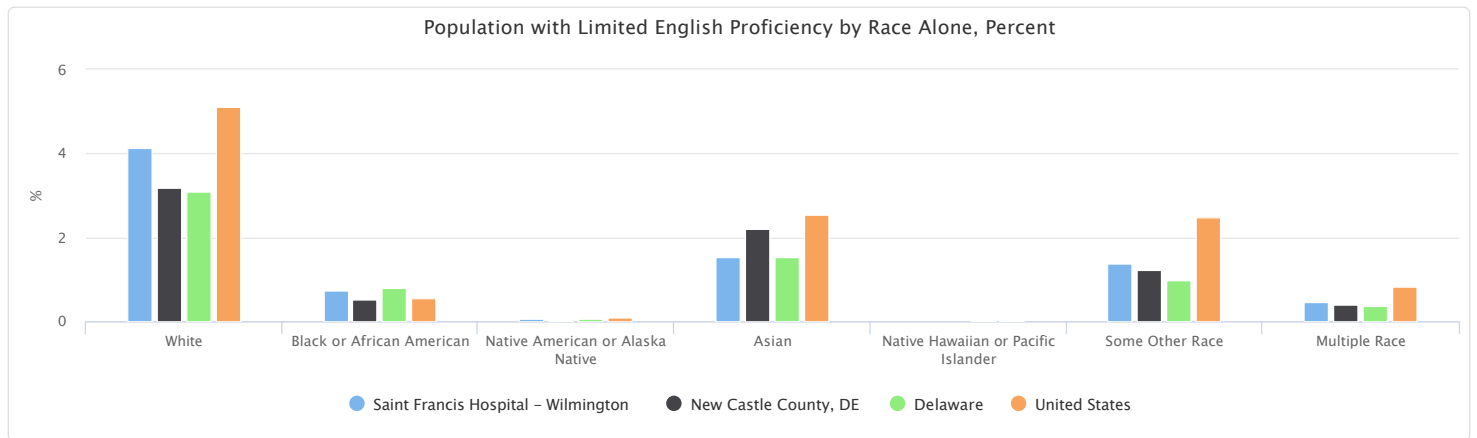

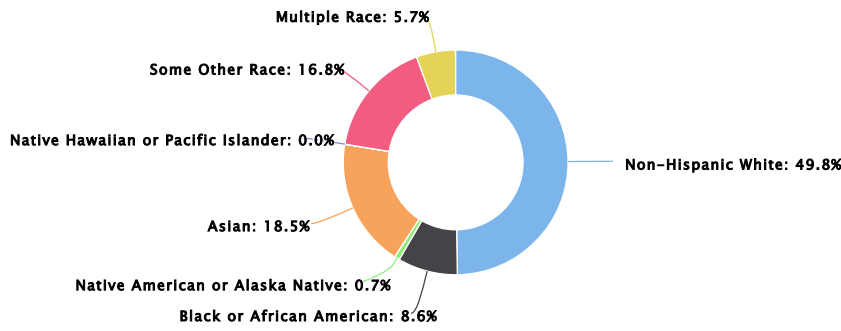

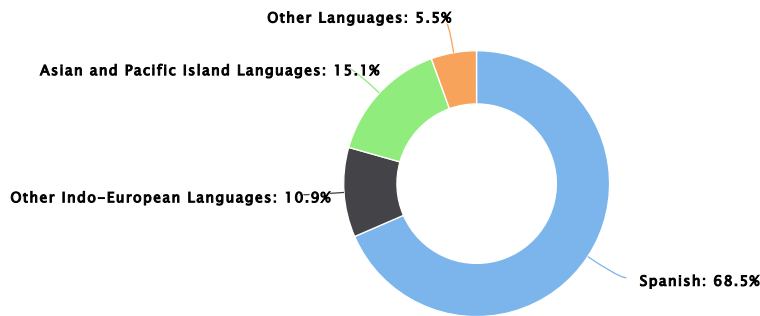

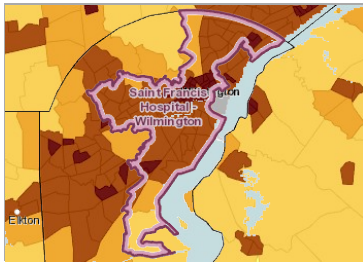

Population, Density (Persons per Sq Mile) by Tract, ACS 2016-20



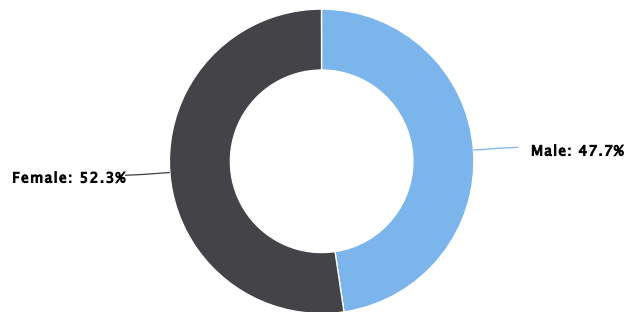

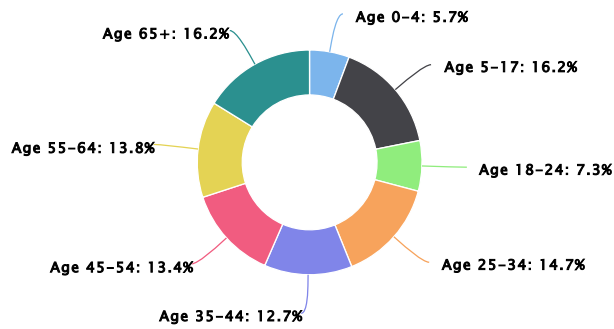

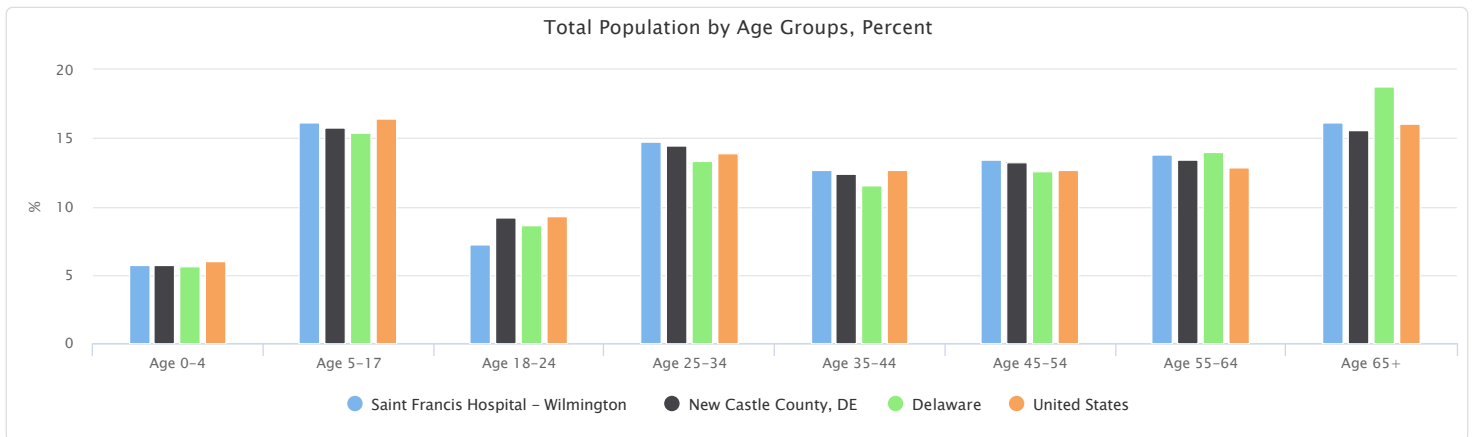

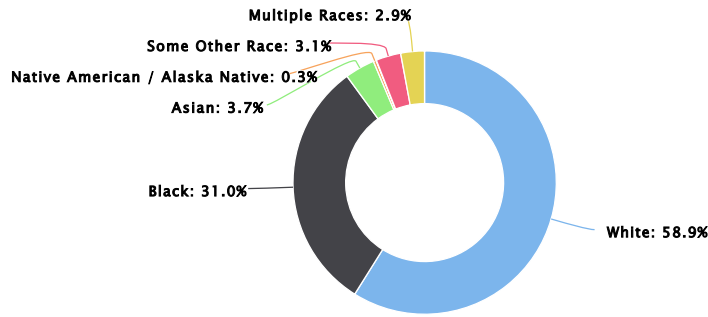

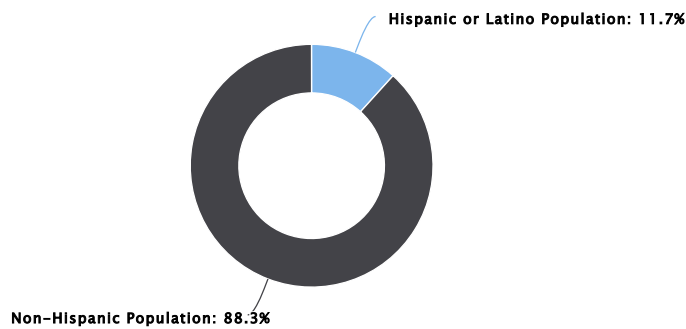

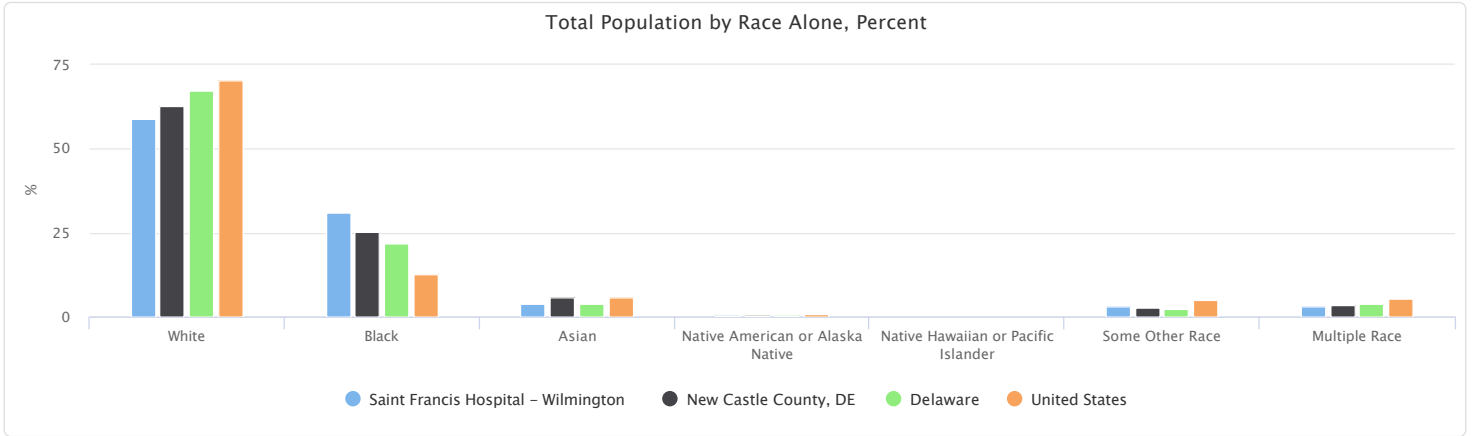

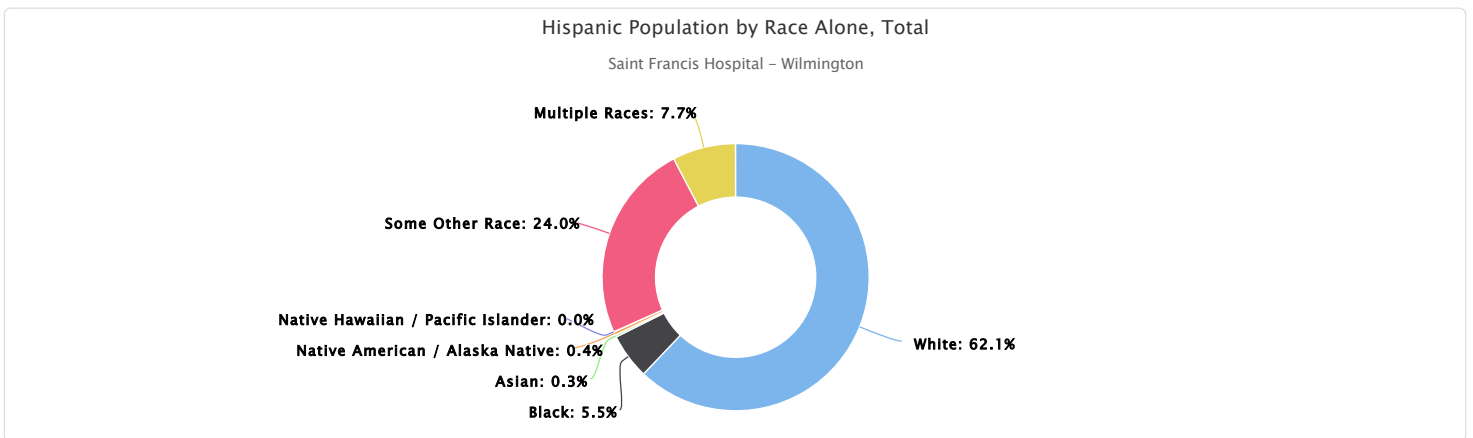

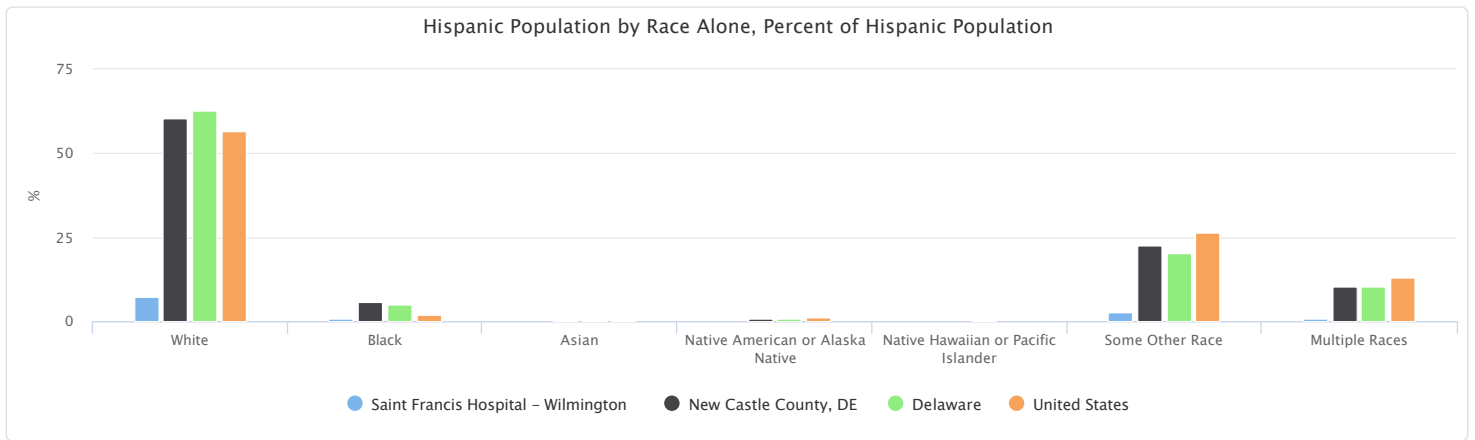

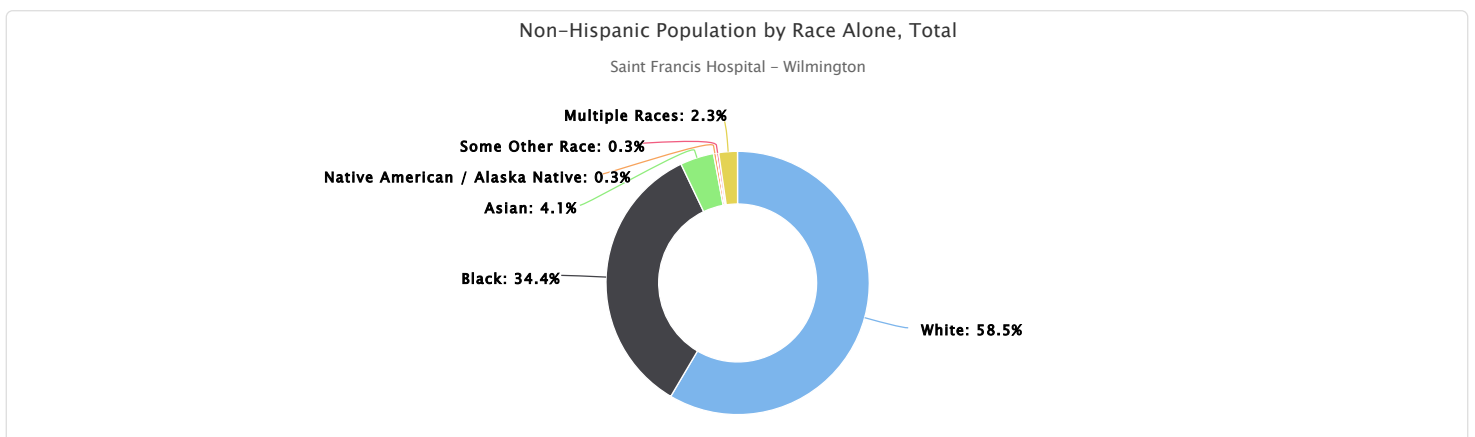

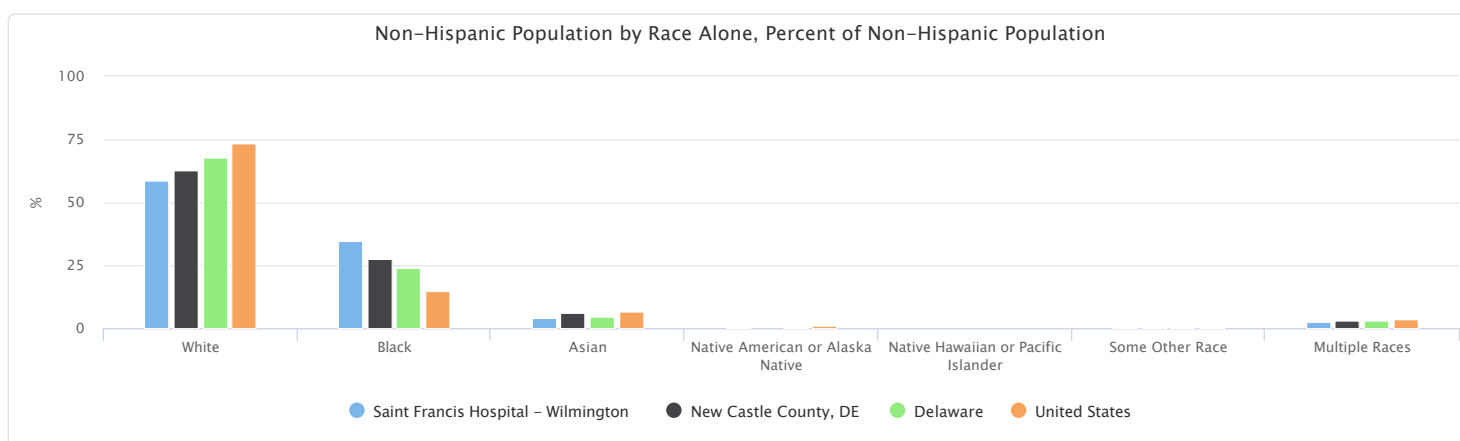

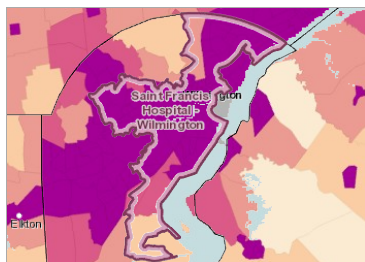

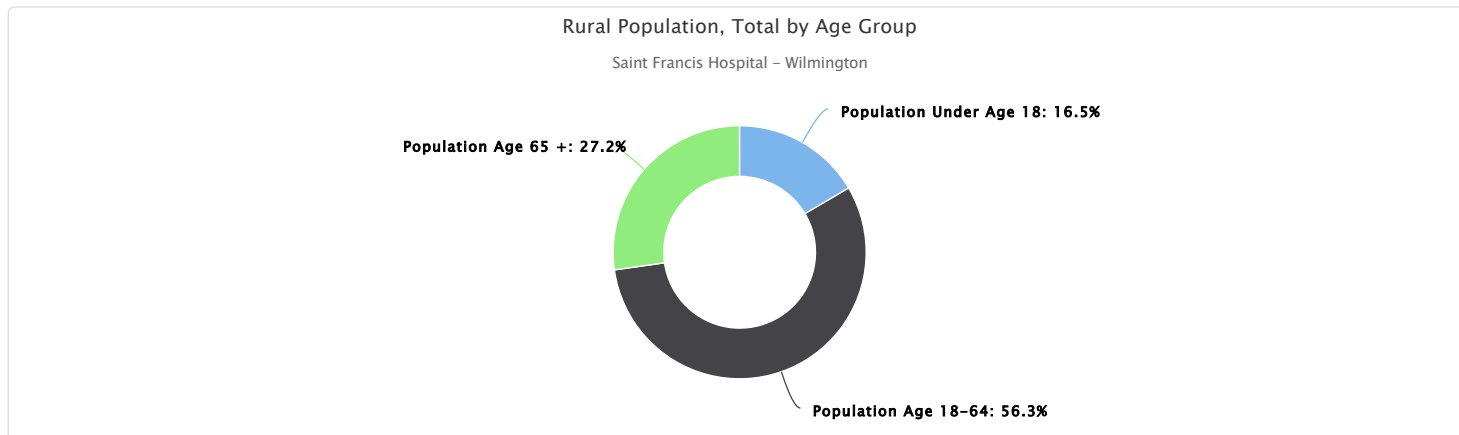
Urban Population, Percent by Tract, US Census 2010

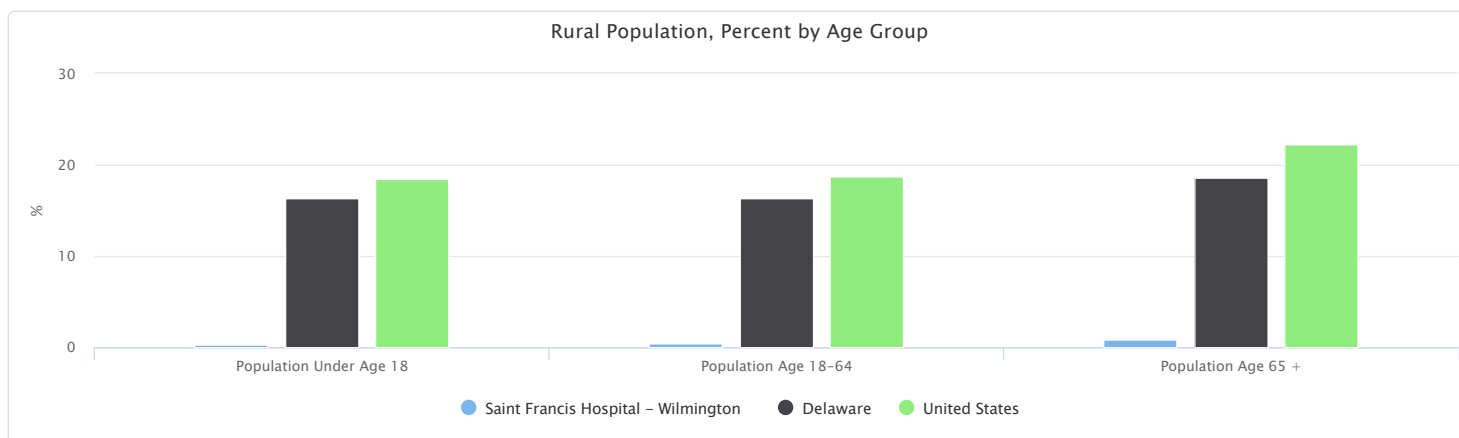

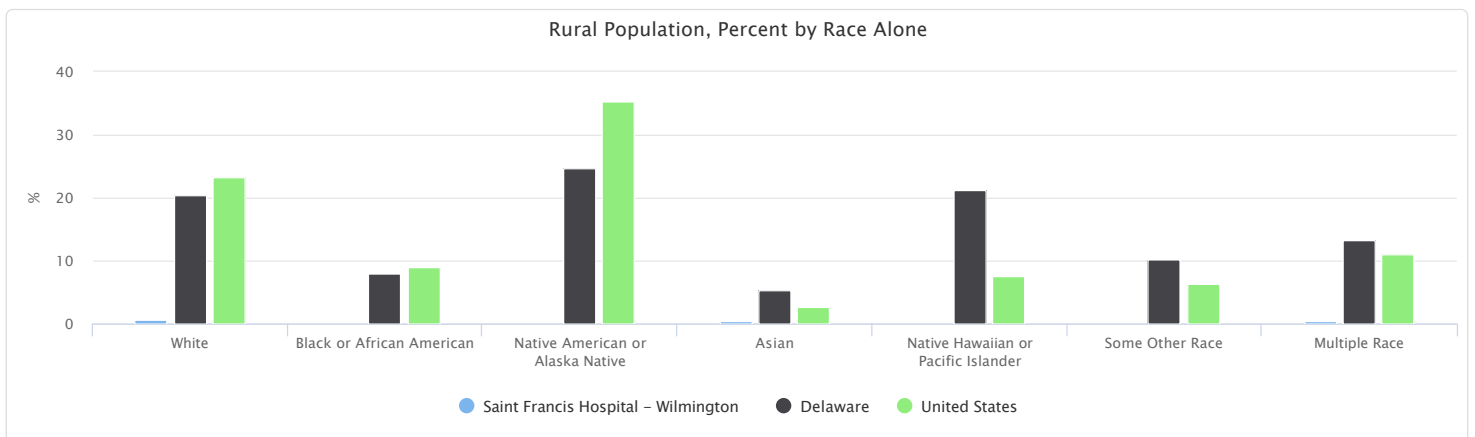

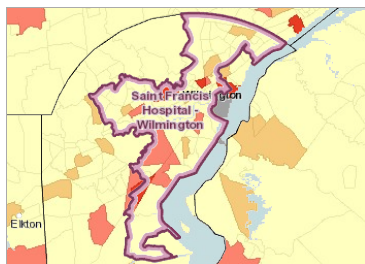

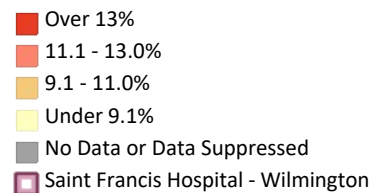

Veterans, Percent of Total Population by Tract, ACS 2016-20



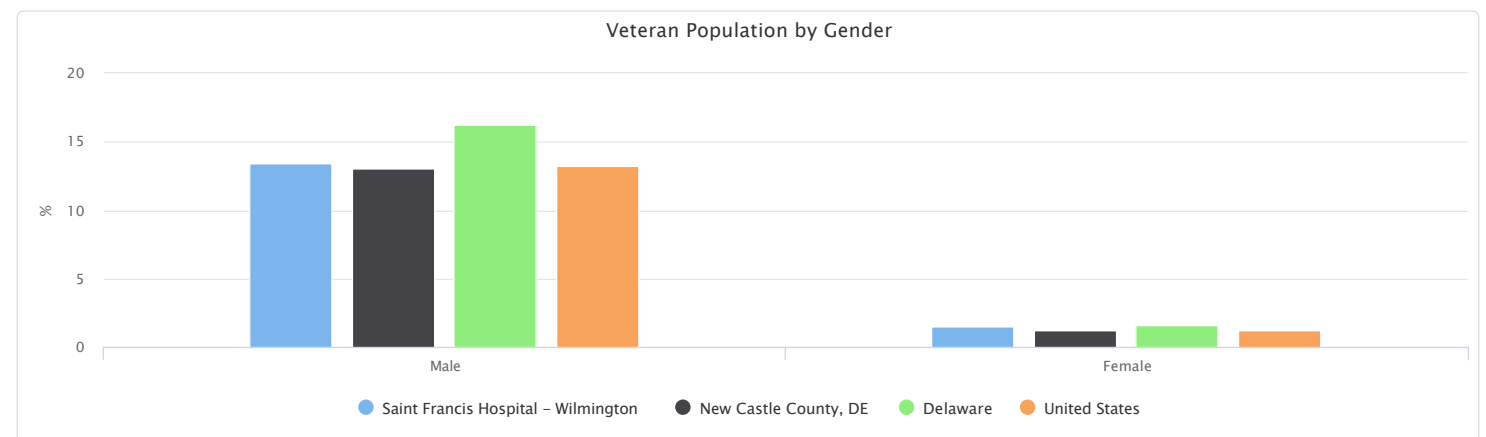

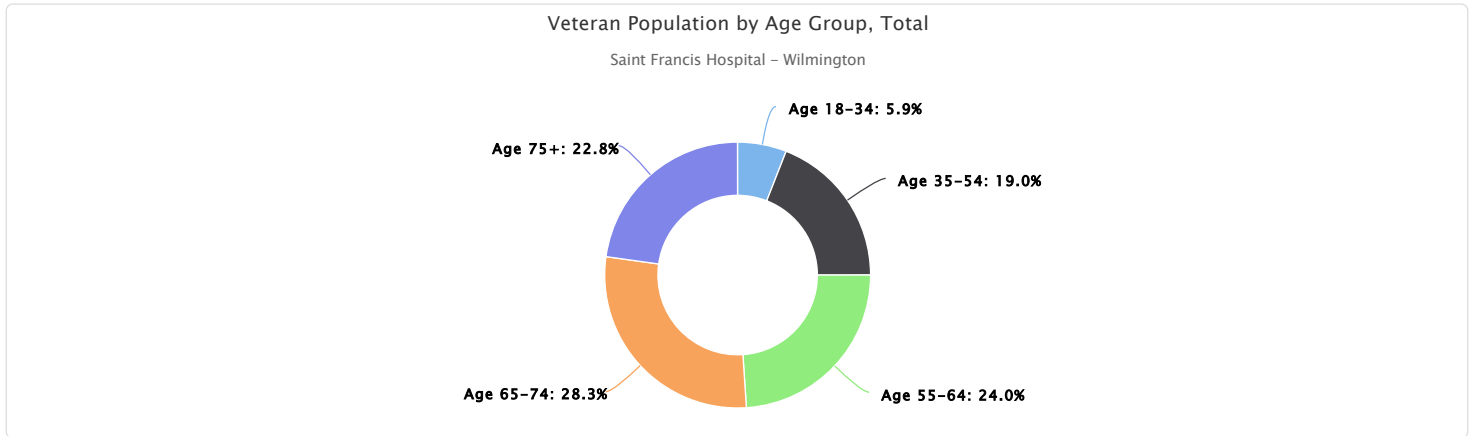

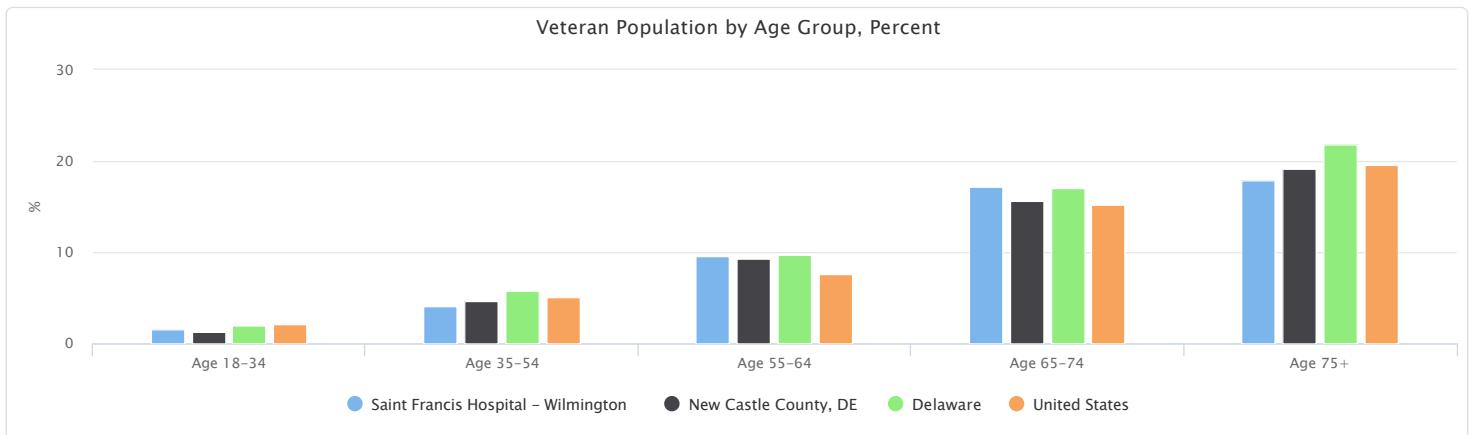

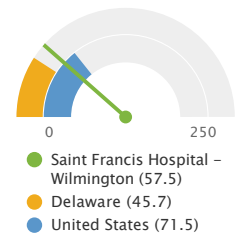

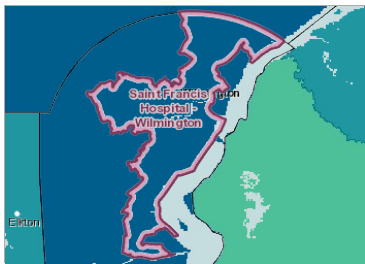
Dentists, Rate (Per 100,000 Population)

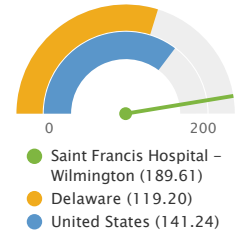

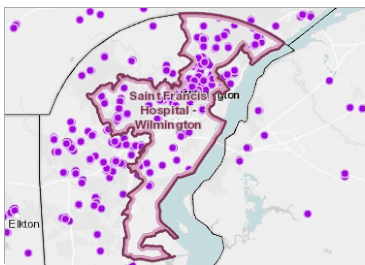

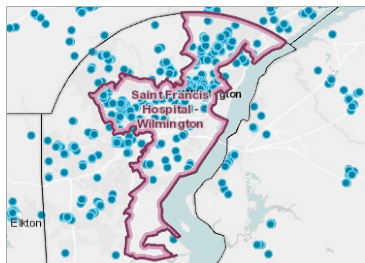

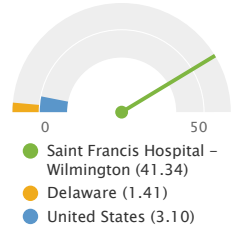

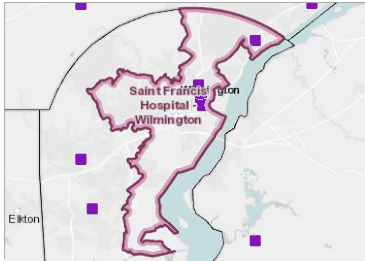

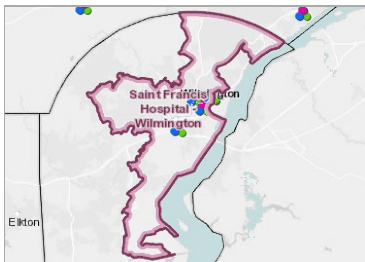

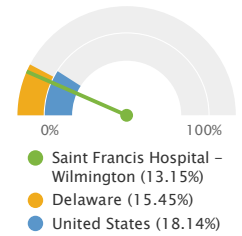

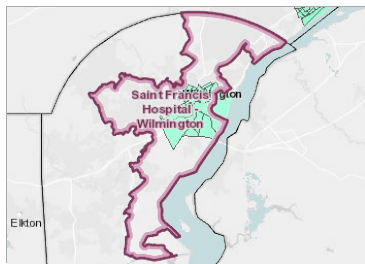

Dental Care HPSA Components, Type and Degree of Shortage by Tract / County, HRSA HPSA Database May 2021

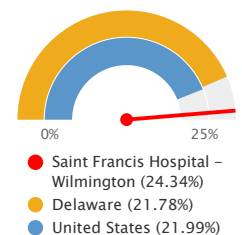

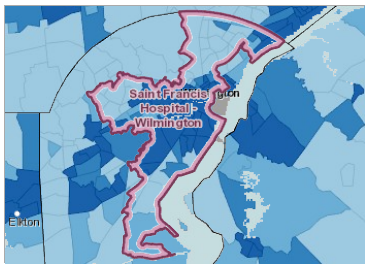

Percent of Insured Population Receiving Medicaid



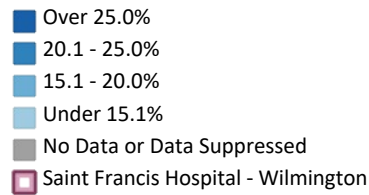

Insured, Medicaid / Means-Tested Coverage, Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20

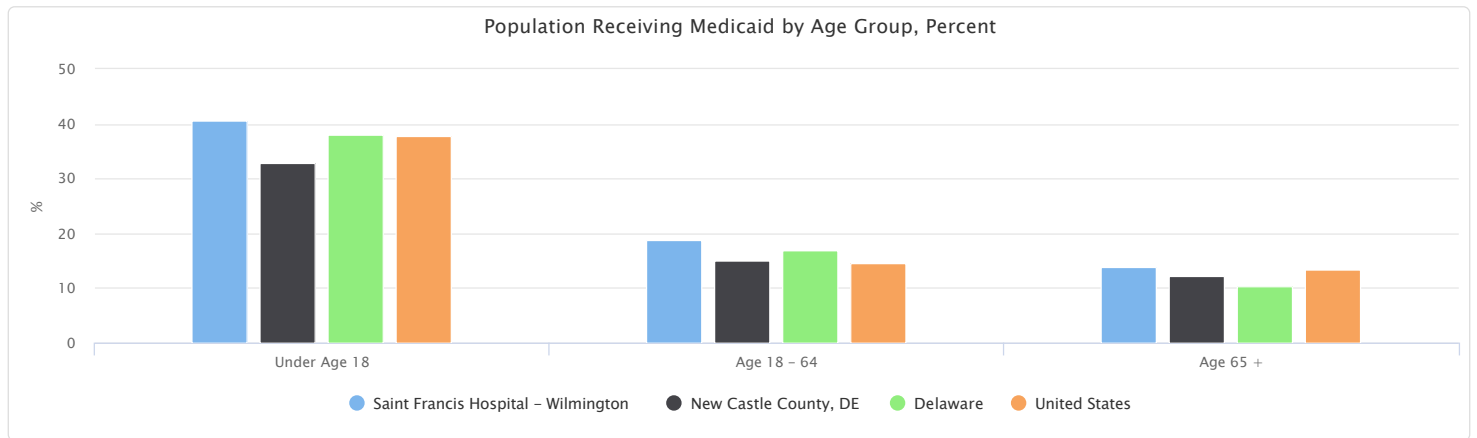

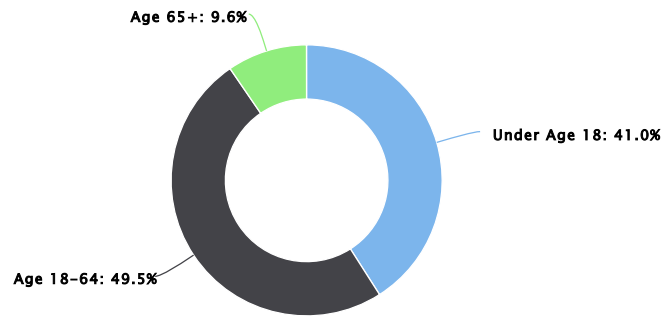

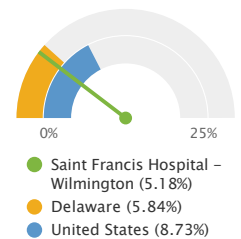

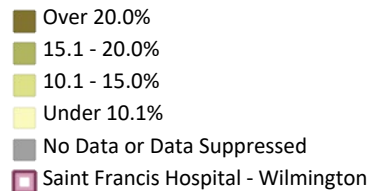

Uninsured Population, Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20



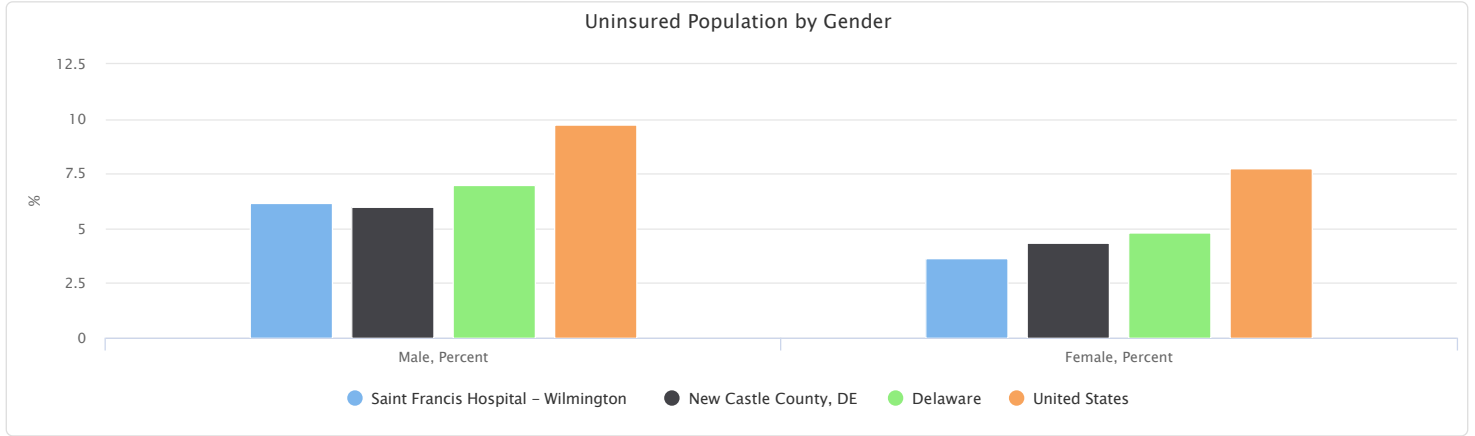

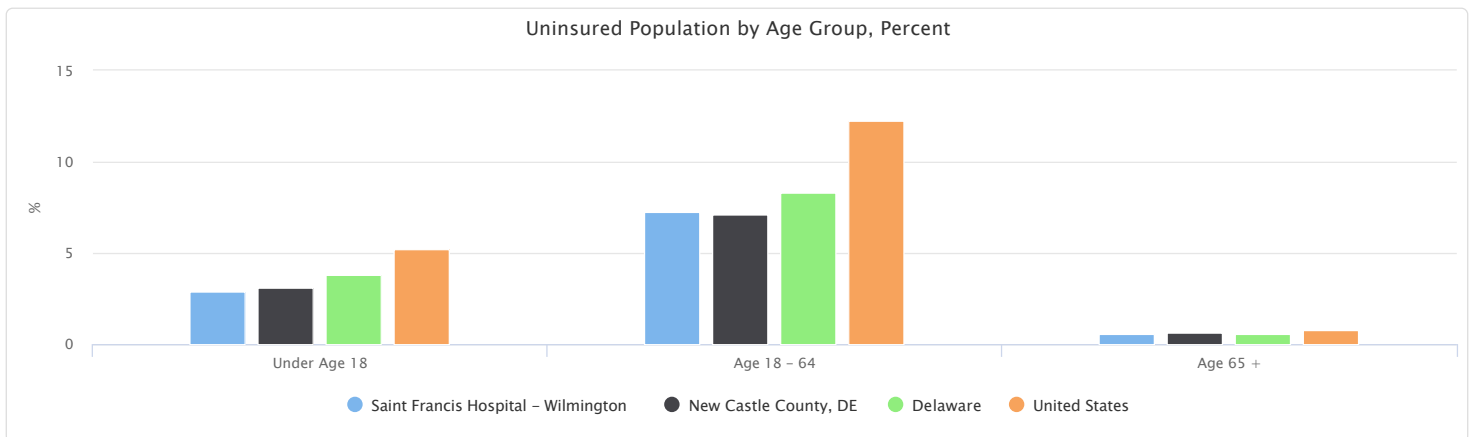

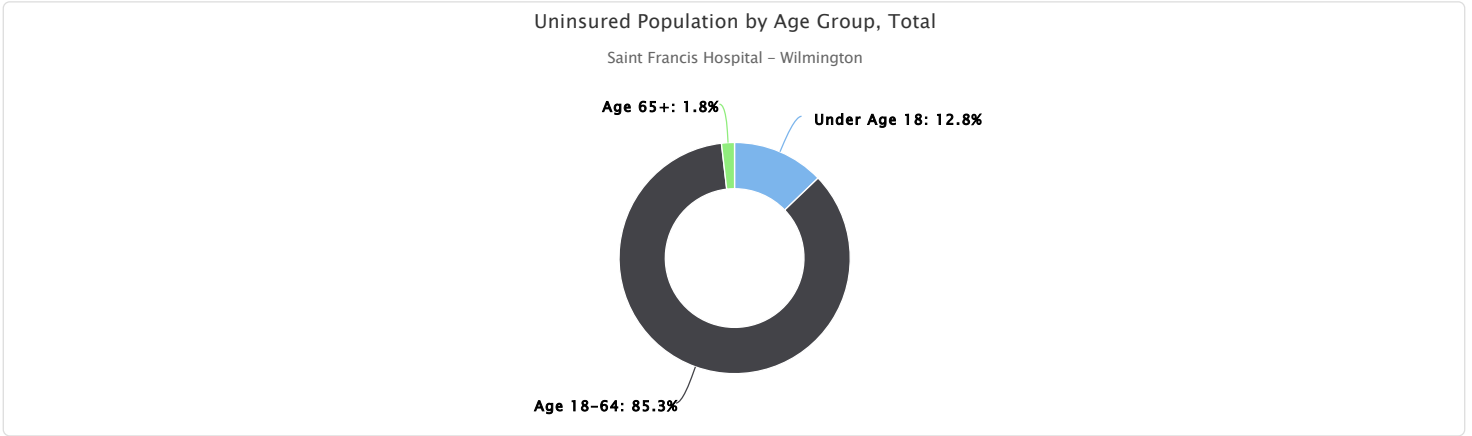

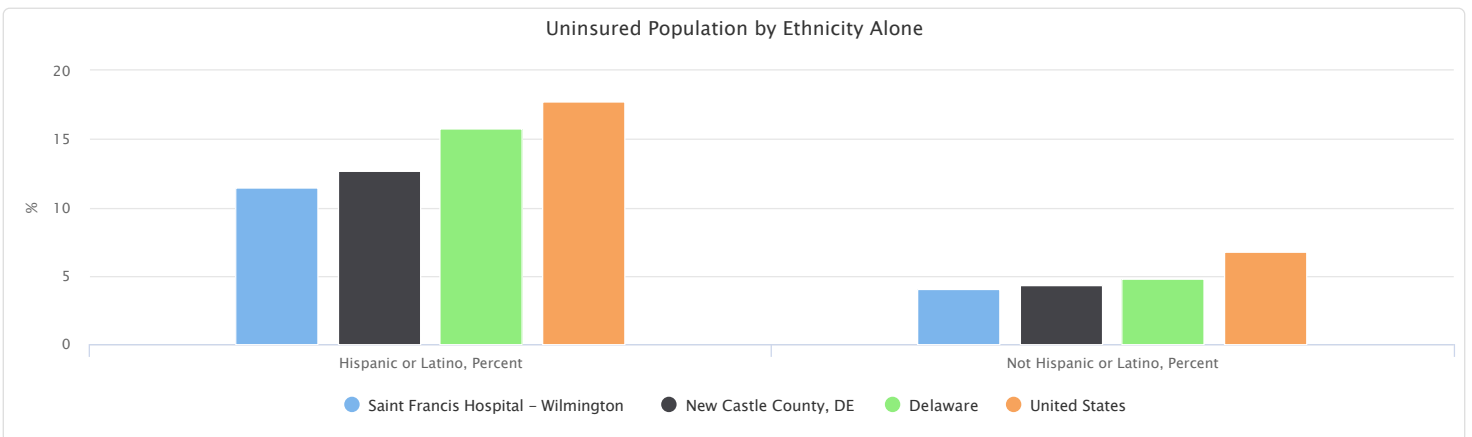

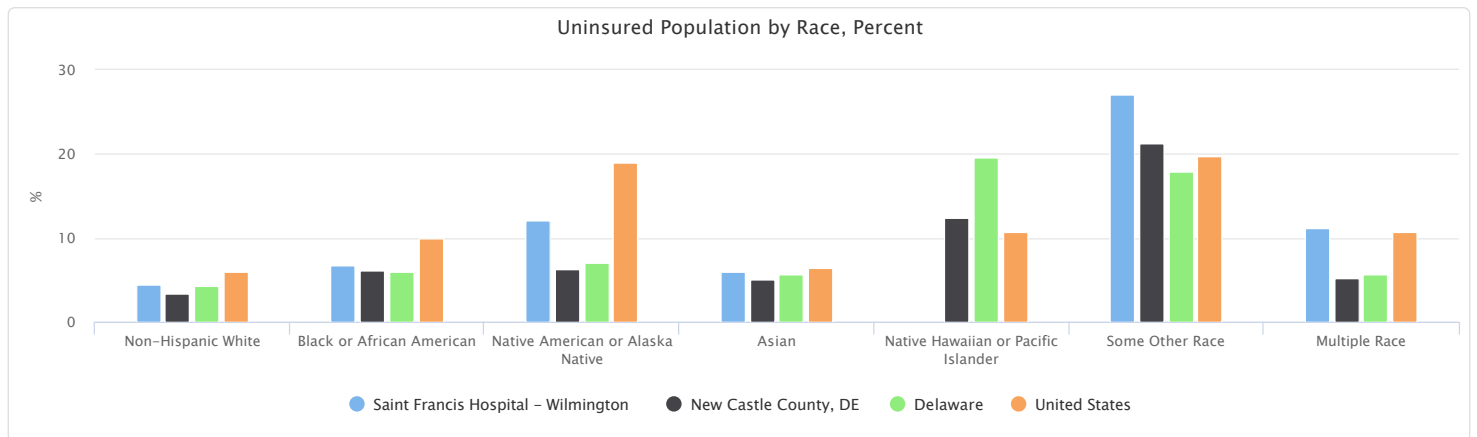

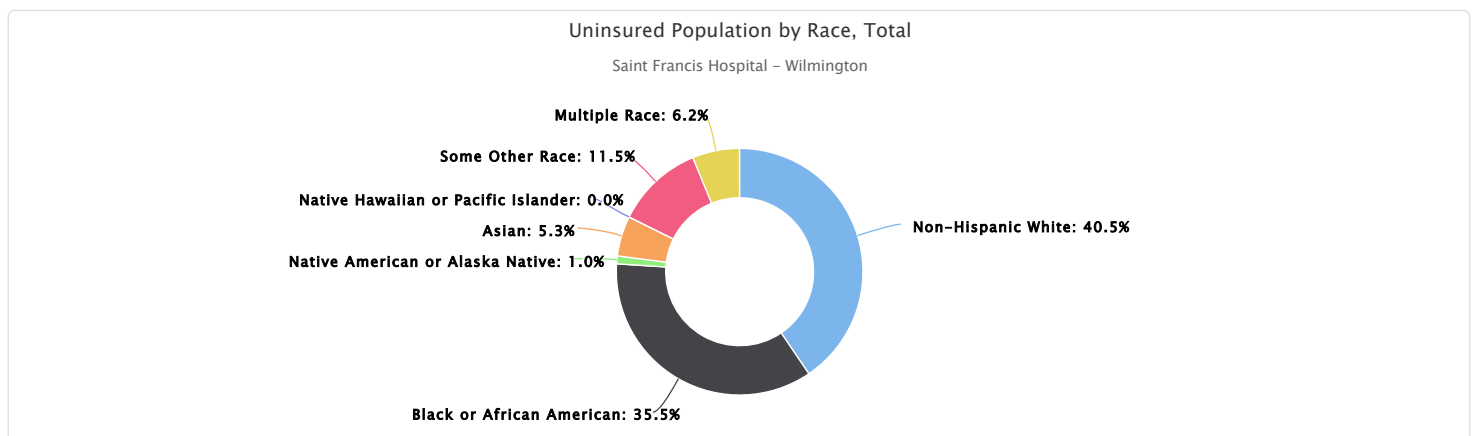

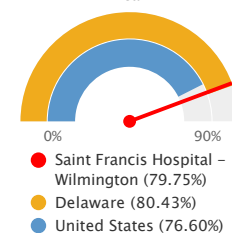

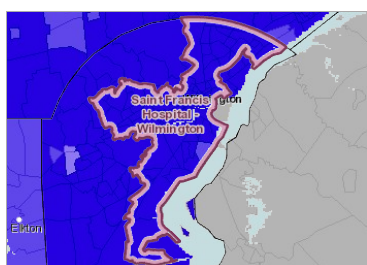

Percentage of Adults Age 18+ with Routine Checkup in Past 1 Year



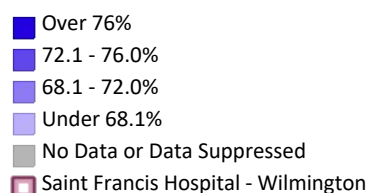

Primary Care Physician Visit (Past 1 Year), Percentage of Adults Age 18+ by Tract, CDC BRFSS PLACES Project 2019



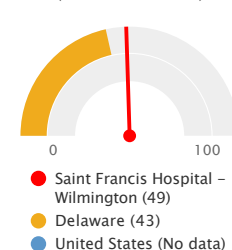

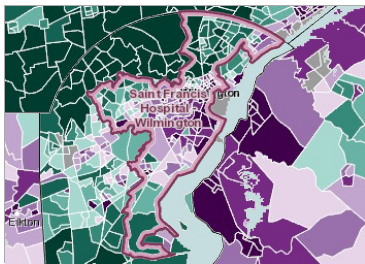

Area Deprivation Index Score (National Percentile)



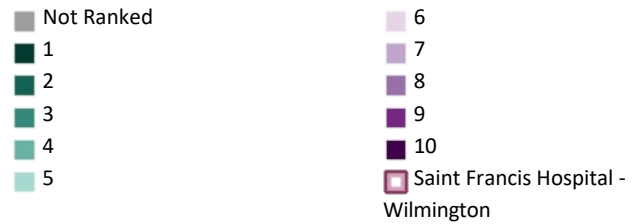

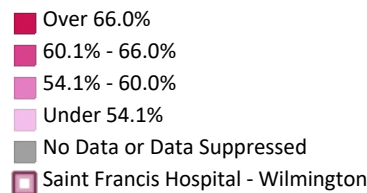

Labor Force, Participation Rate by Tract, ACS 2016-20

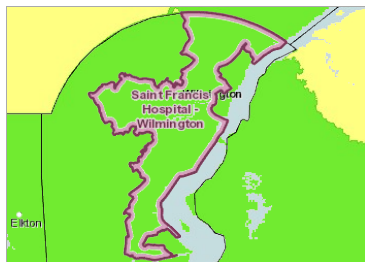
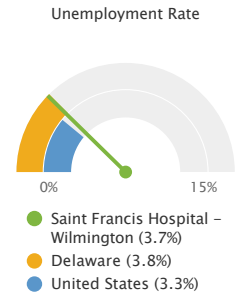

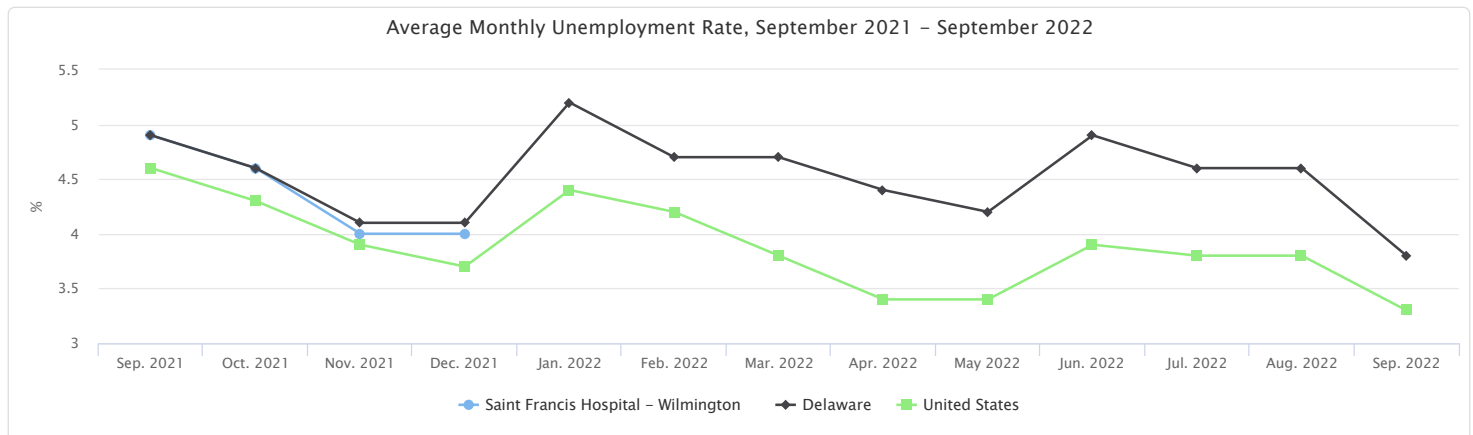

Unemployment, Rate by County, BLS 2022 - September



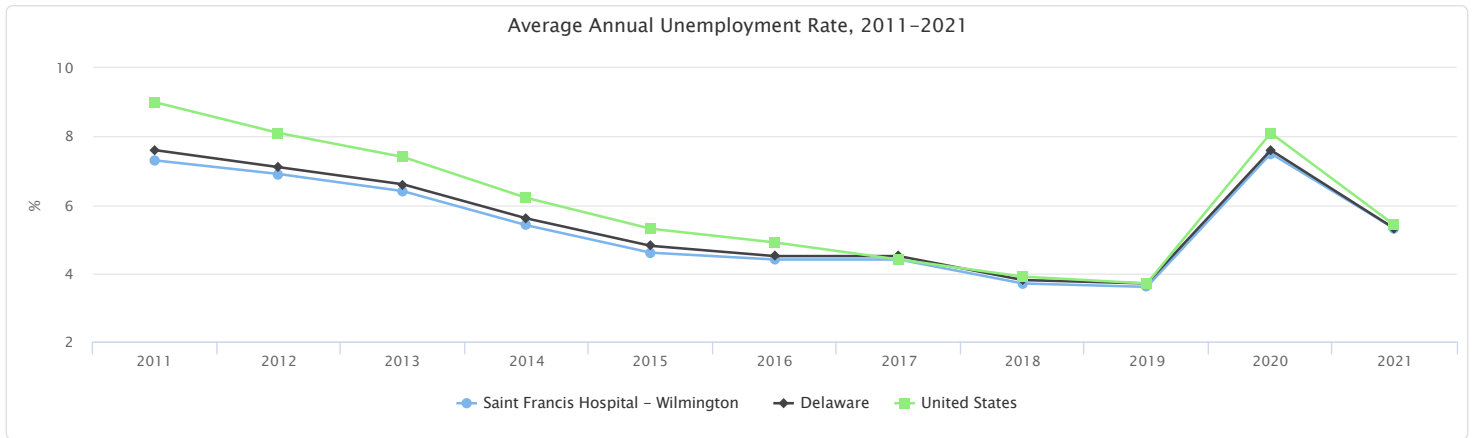

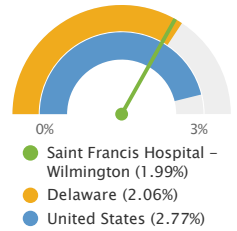

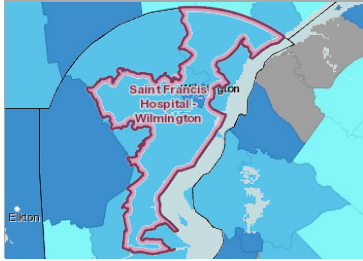

Rate of Homelessness Among Public School Students (in Reported Districts)

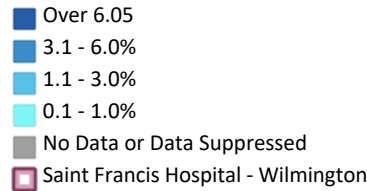

Homeless Students, Percent by School District (Elementary), EDFacts 2019-20



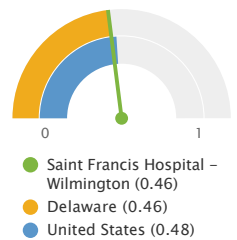

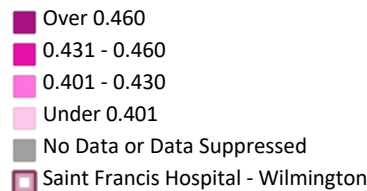

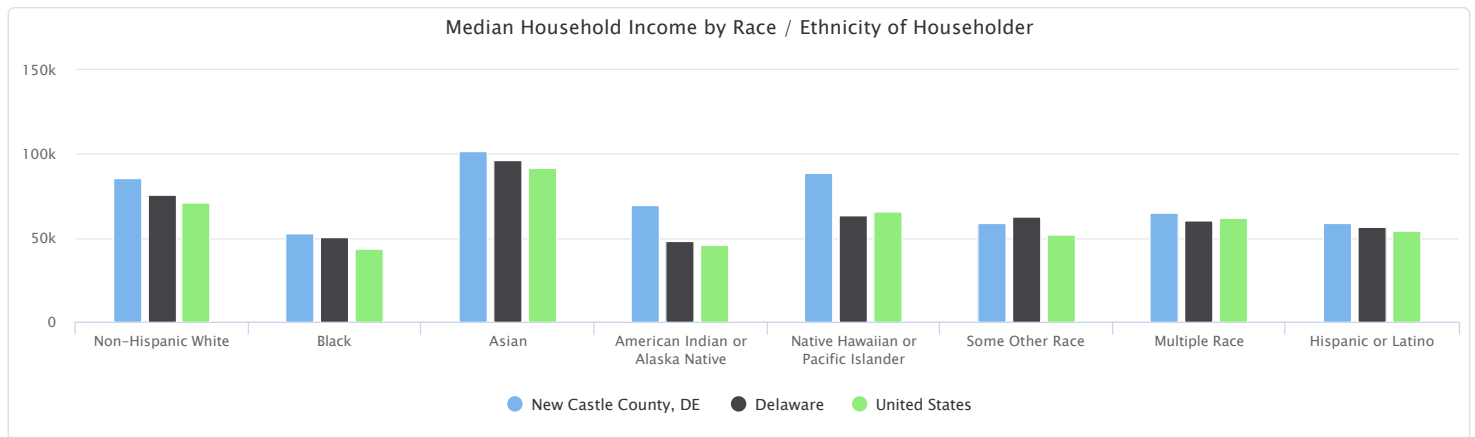

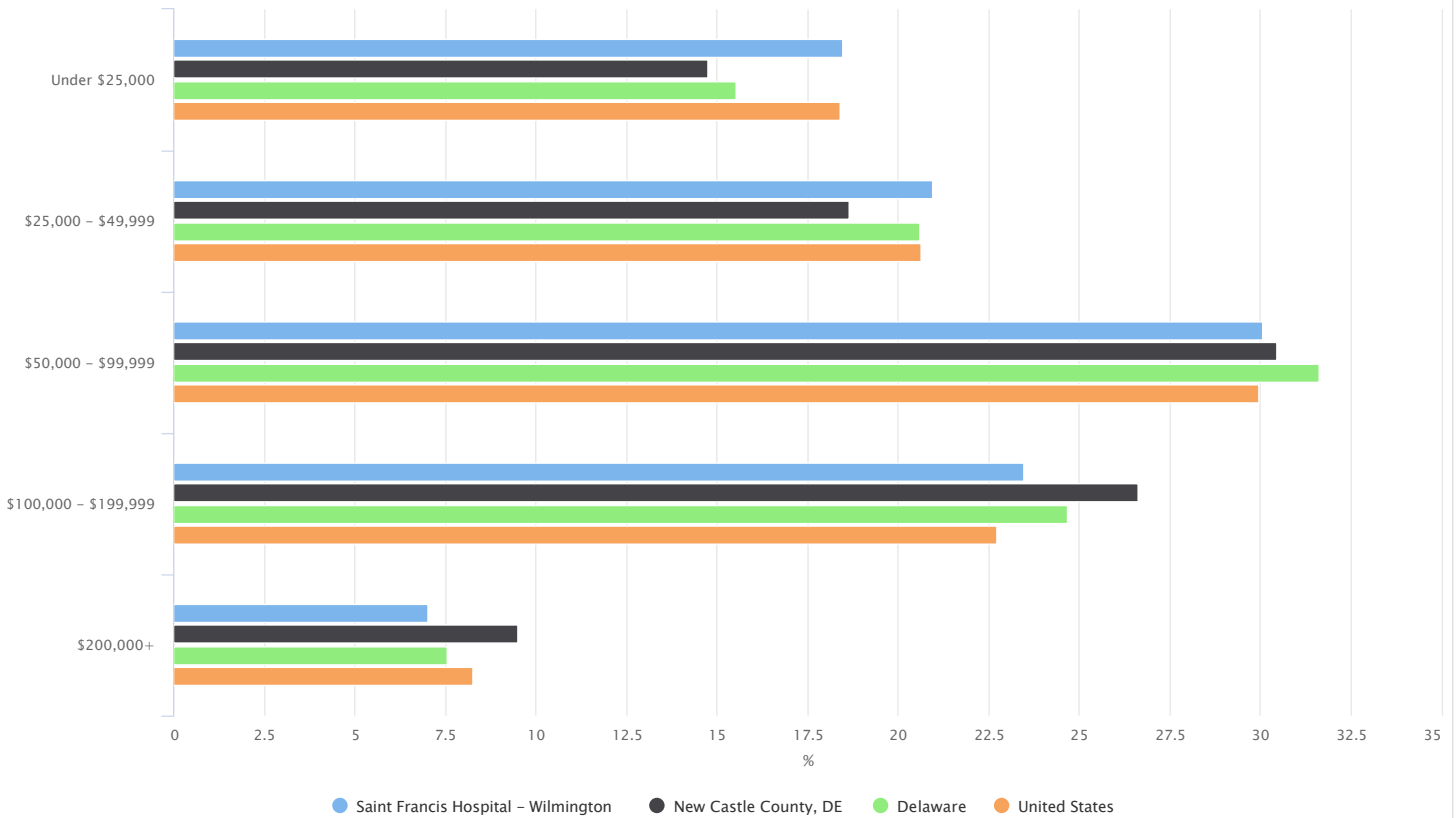

Households by Household Income Levels, Percent



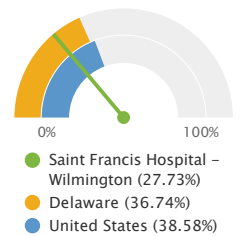

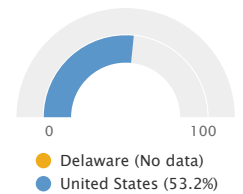

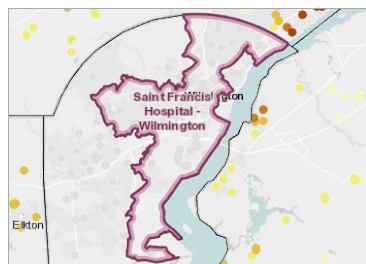

Percentage of Students Eligible for Free or Reduced Price School Lunch



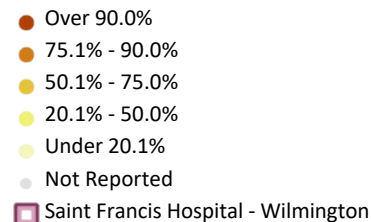

Students Eligible for Free or Reduced-Price Lunch, NCES CCD 2020-21



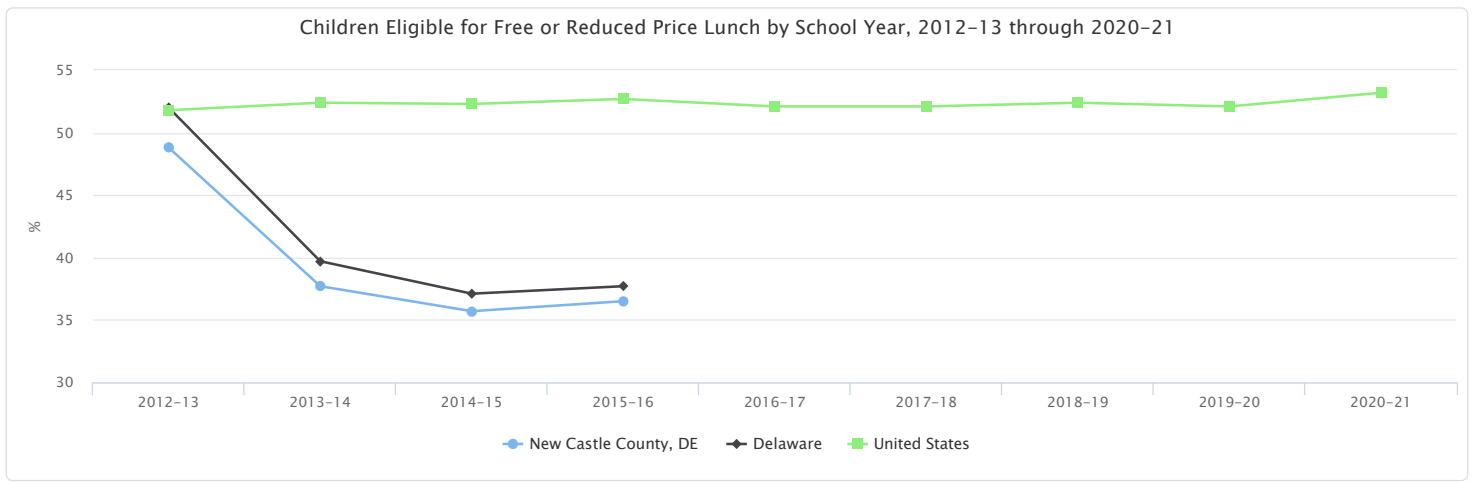

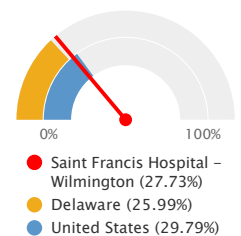

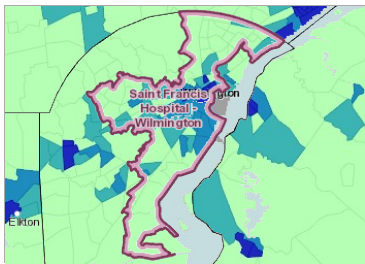

Percent Population with Income at or Below 200% FPL



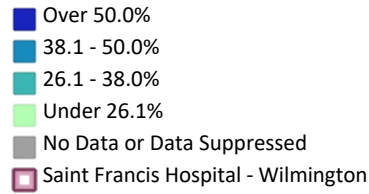

Population Below 200% Poverty Level, Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20

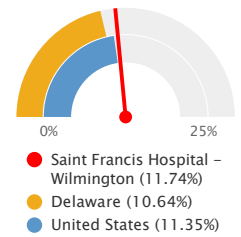

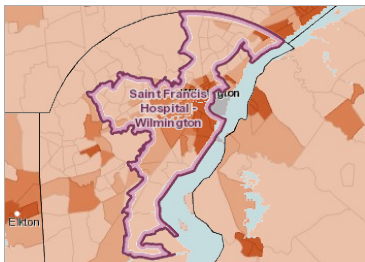

Percent Households Receiving SNAP Benefits

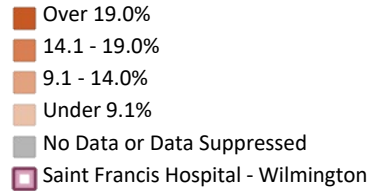

Households Receiving SNAP Benefits, Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20

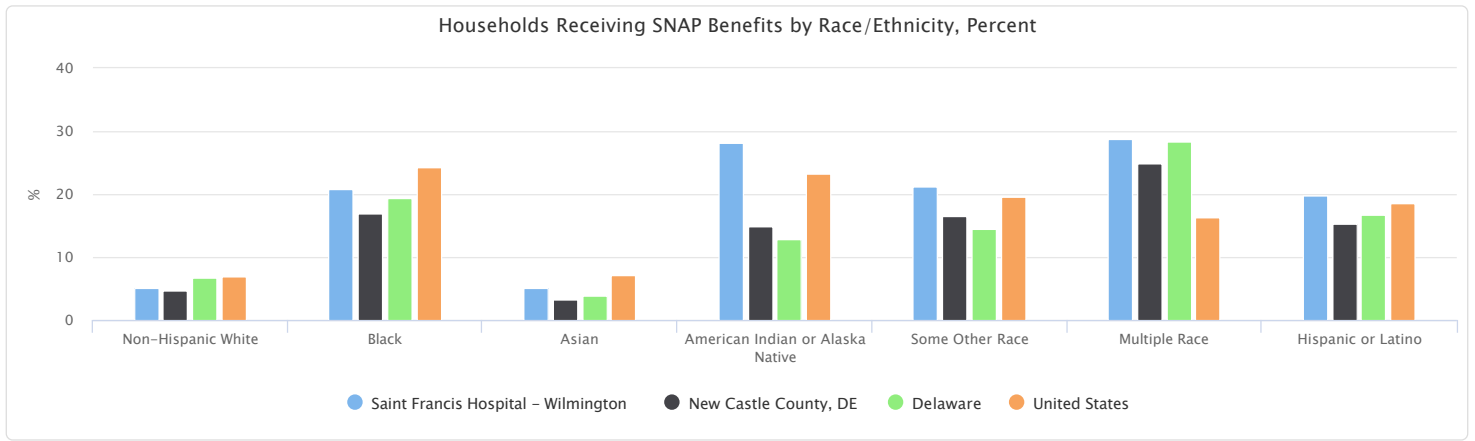

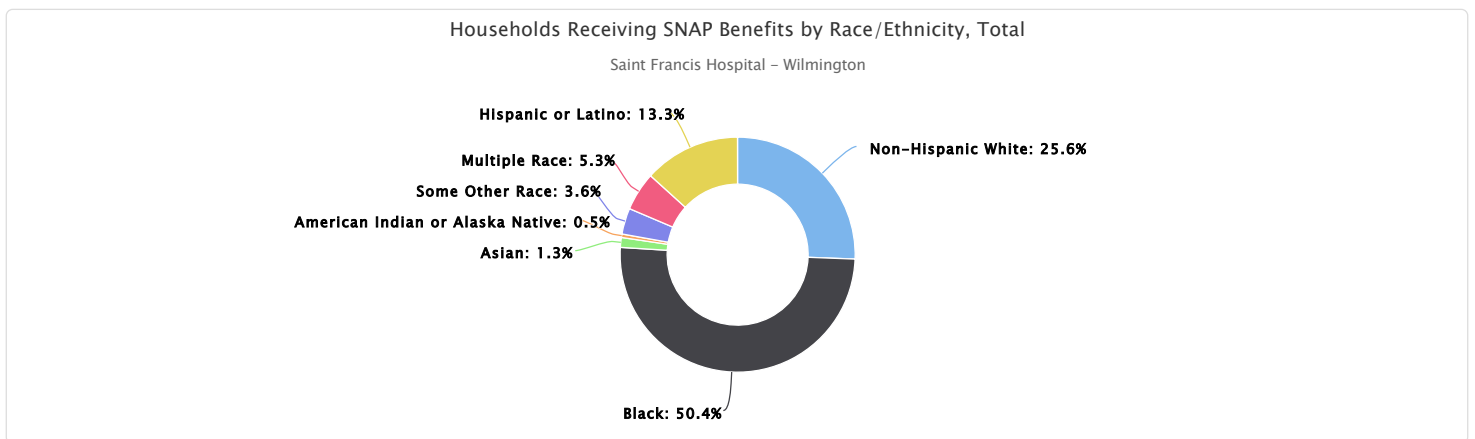

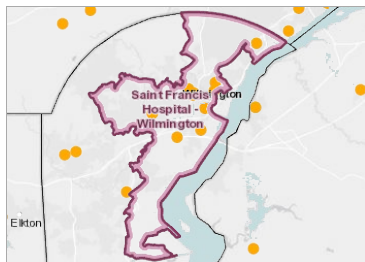

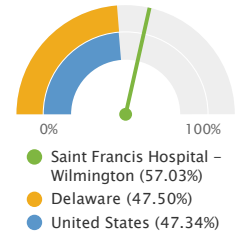

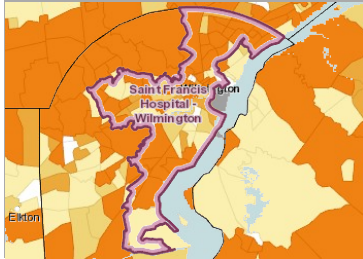

Percentage of Population Age 3-4 Enrolled in School



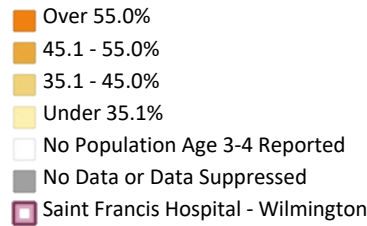

Enrollment in School, Children (Age 3-4), Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20

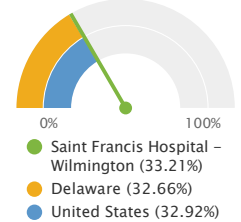

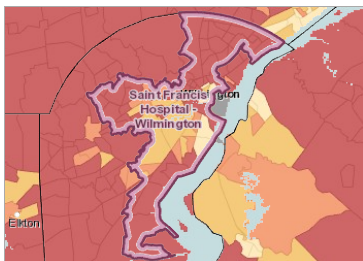

Population Age 25+ with Bachelor's Degree or Higher, Percent



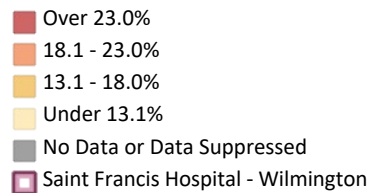

Population with a Bachelor's Degree or Higher, Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20

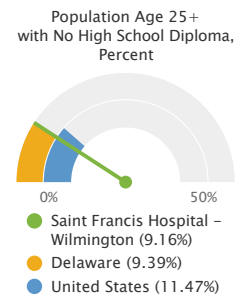

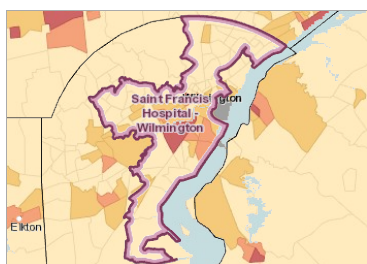

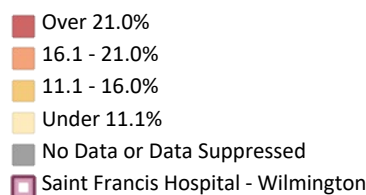

Population with No High School Diploma (Age 25+), Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20

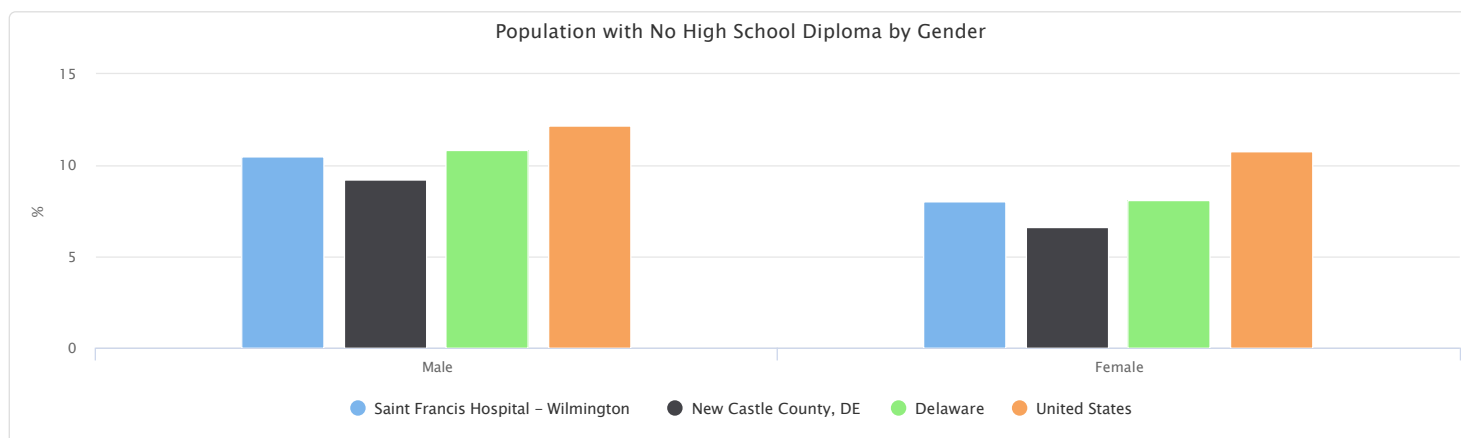

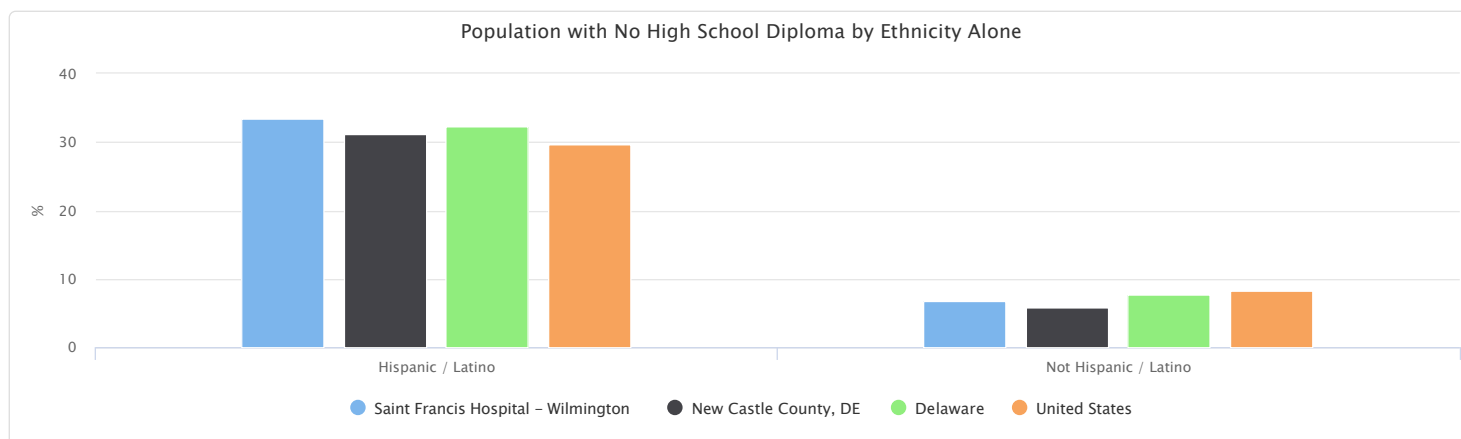

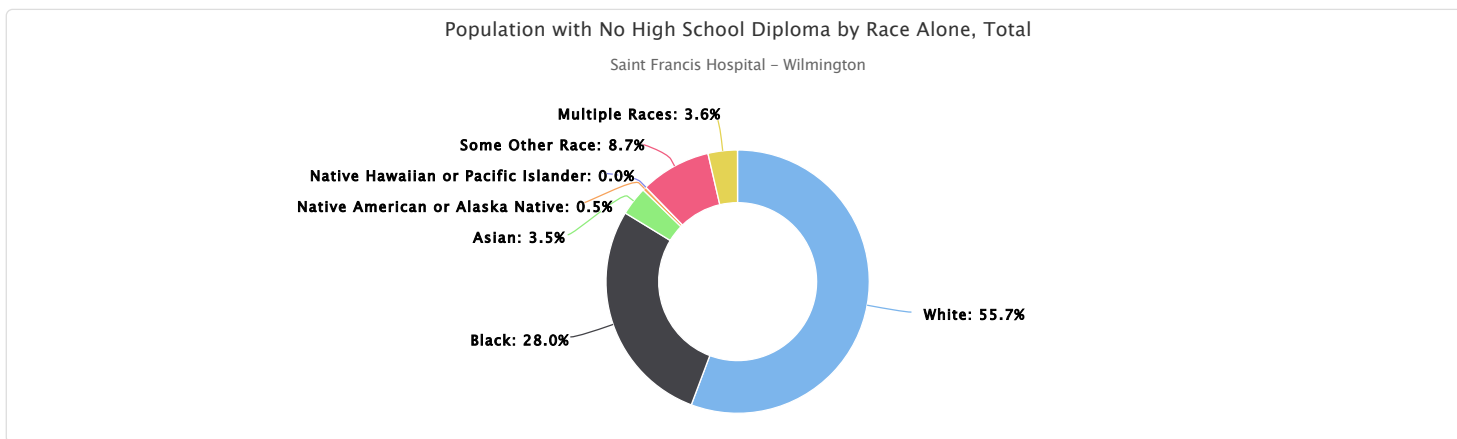

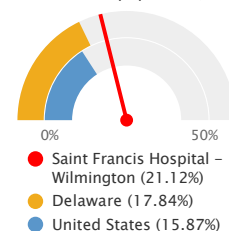

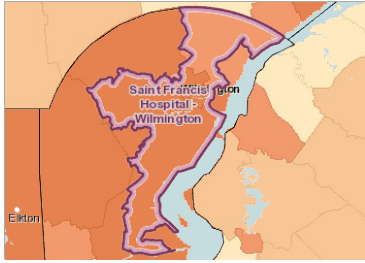

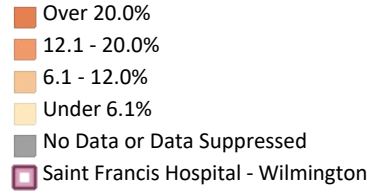
Chronic Absence Rate (Percentage of Students Absent 15 or More School Days per Year).





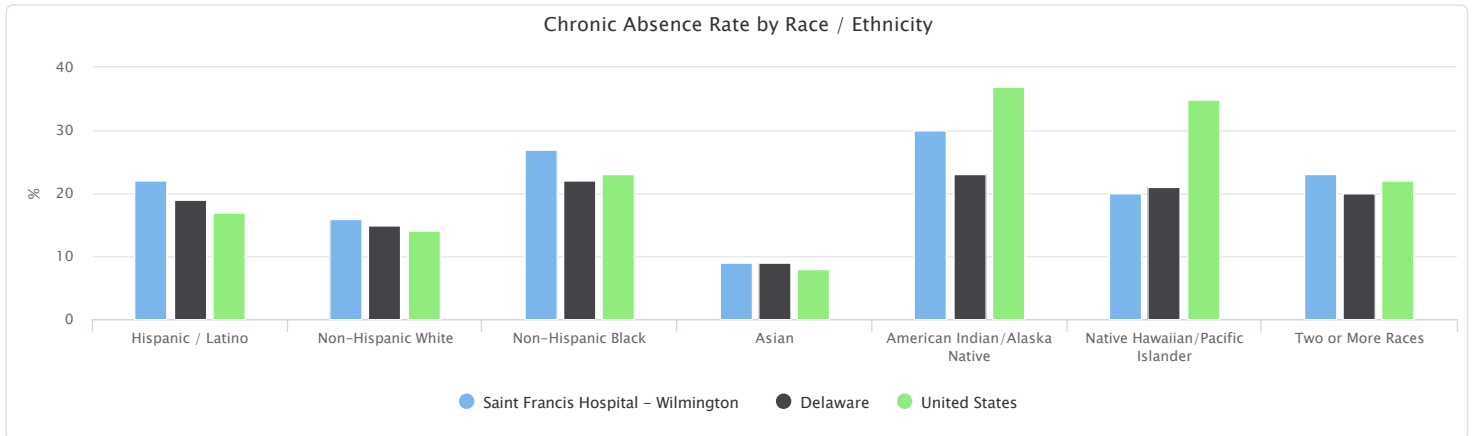

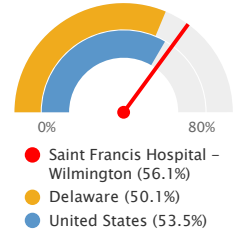

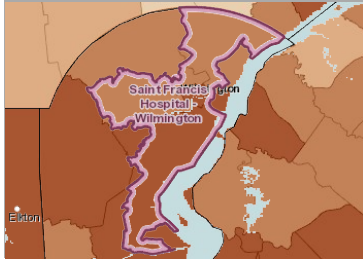

Students Scoring 'Not Proficient' or Worse, Percent



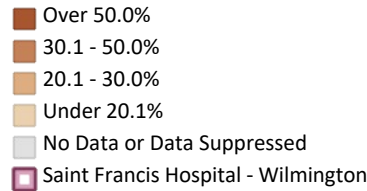

Language Arts Test Scores, Grade 4, Percent Not Proficient by School District (Elementary), EDFacts 2018-19



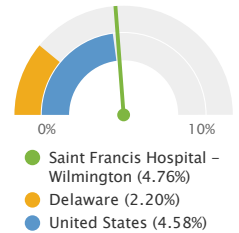

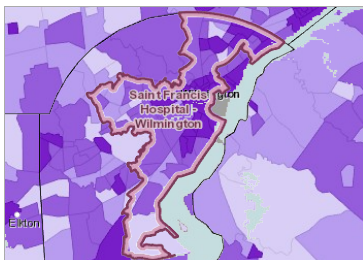

Percent Population Using Public Transit for Commute to Work



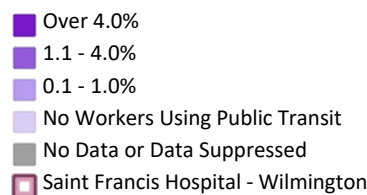

Workers Traveling to Work Using Public Transit, Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20

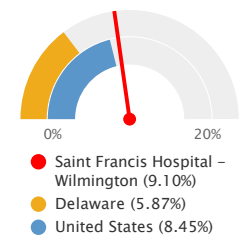

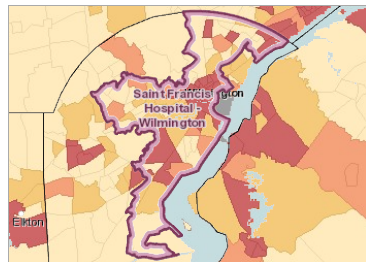

Percentage of Households with No Motor Vehicle

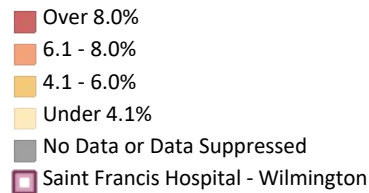

Households with No Vehicle, Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20



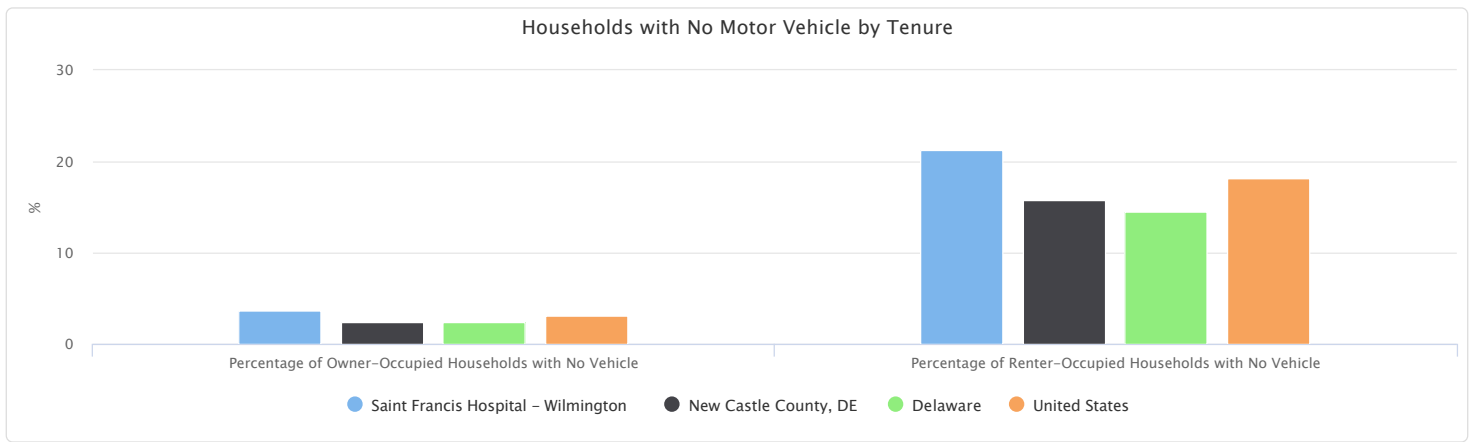

Incarceration Rate, Total by Tract, Opportunity Insights 2018

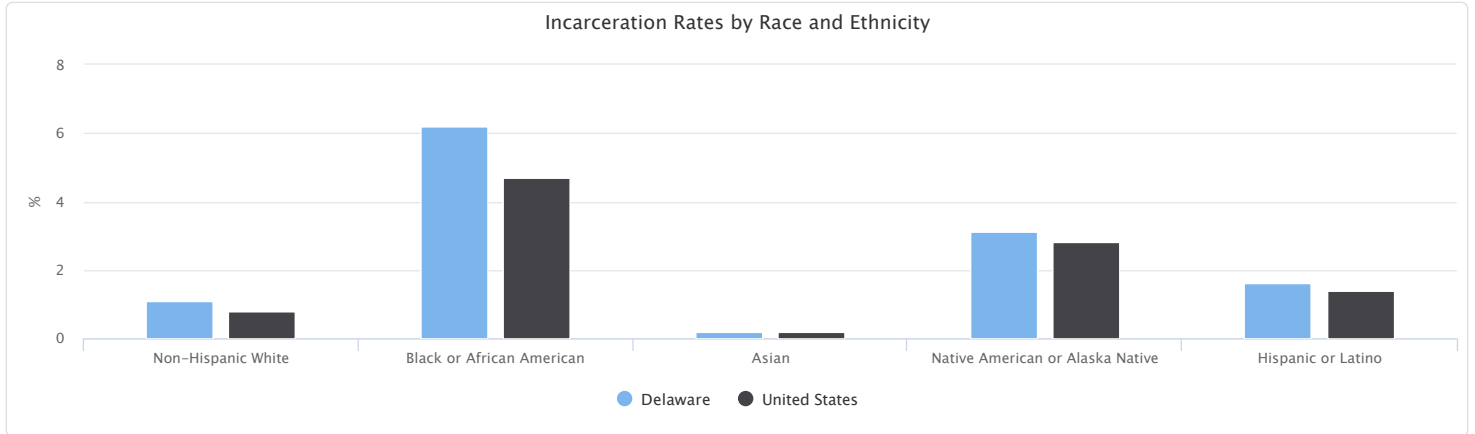

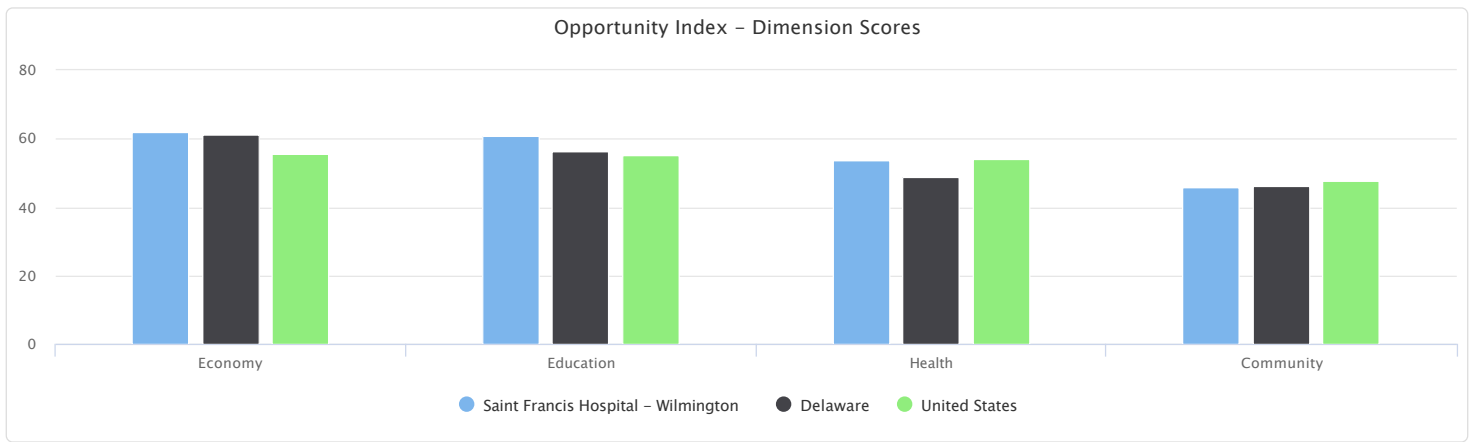

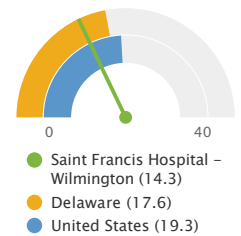

Teen birth rate per 1,000 female population, ages 15-19

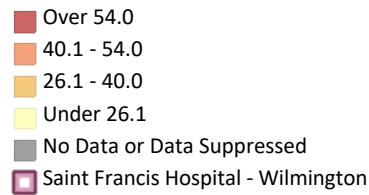

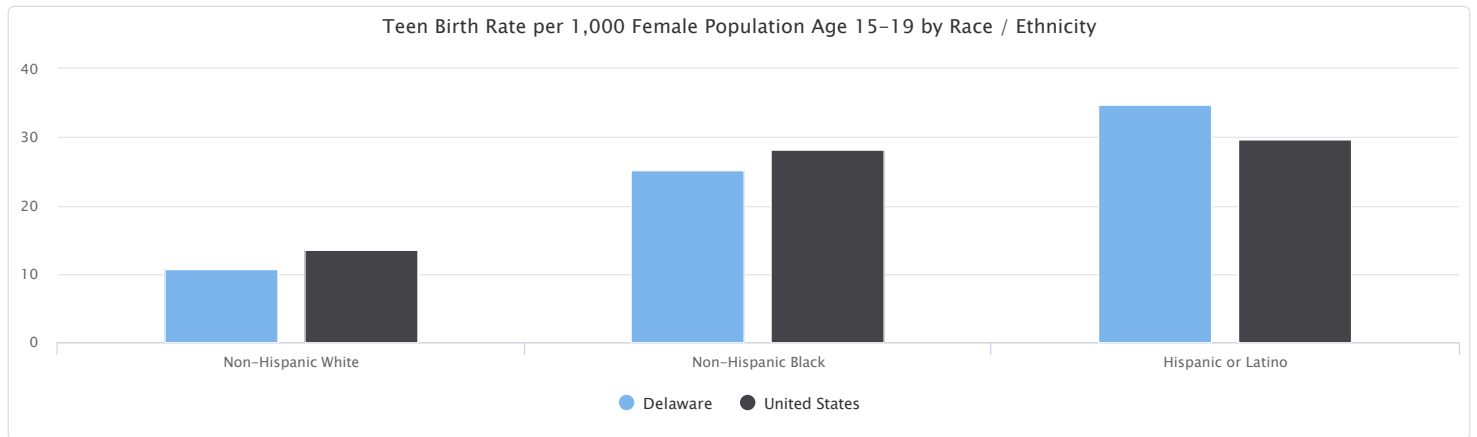
Teen Births, Rate Per 1,000 Females Age 15-19 by County, CDC NVSS 2014-2020

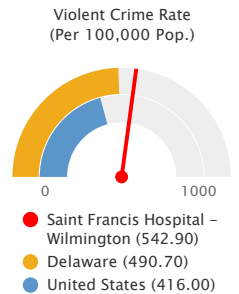

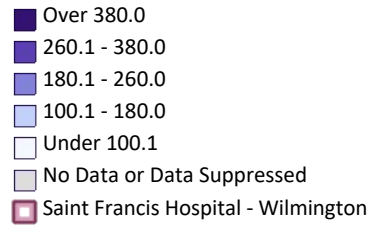

Violent Crimes, All, Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, FBI UCR 2015-2017

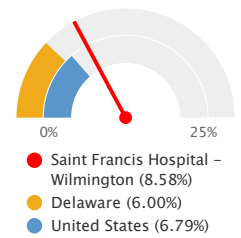

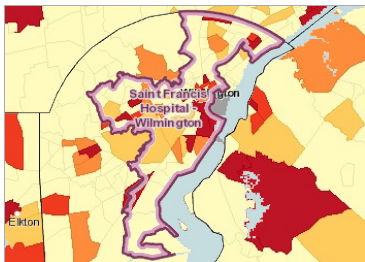

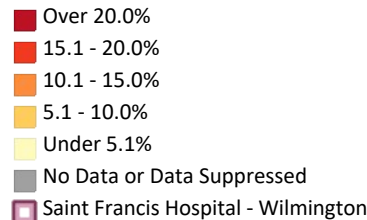

Youths Not Enrolled in School and Not Employed, Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20



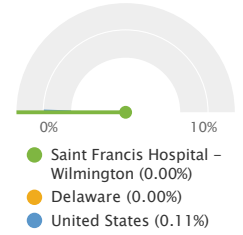

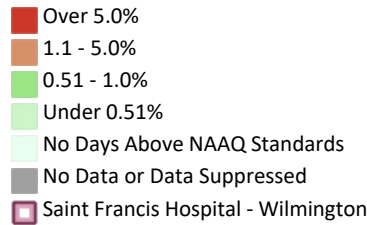

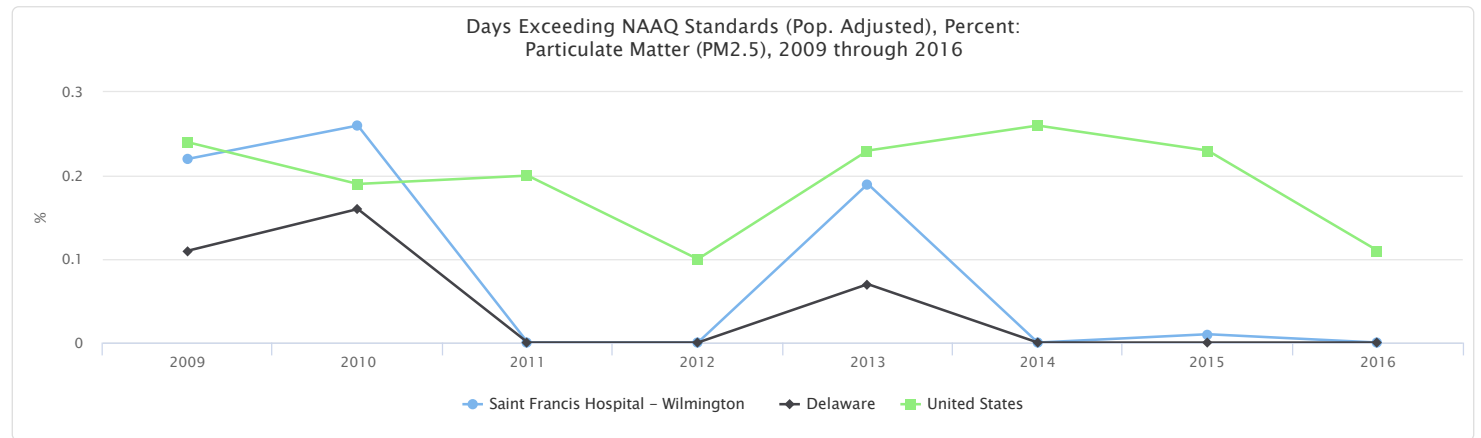

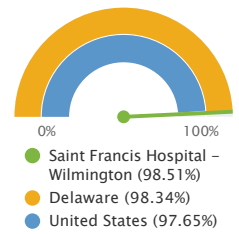

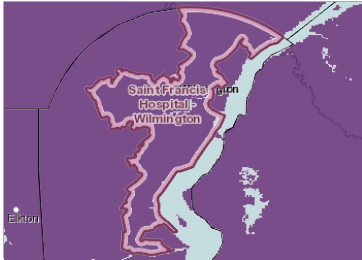

Percentage of Population with Access to Broadband Internet (DL Speeds > 25MBPS)

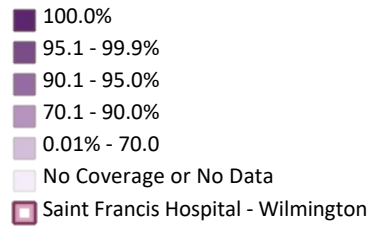

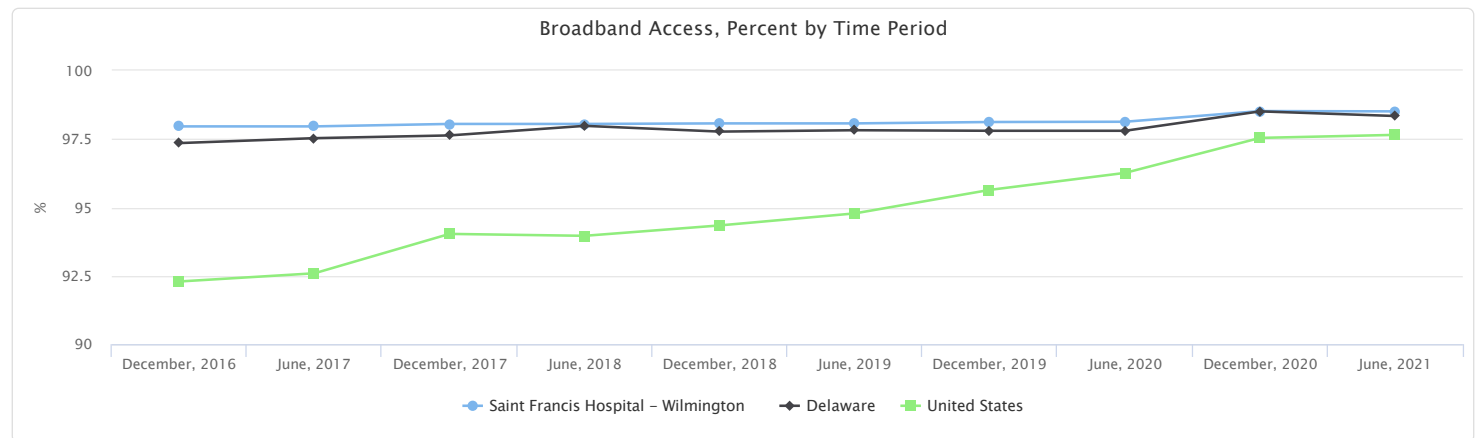
Broadband Access, Pct. Population in a High-Speed Internet Service Area by County, FCC June 2021

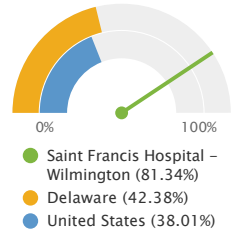

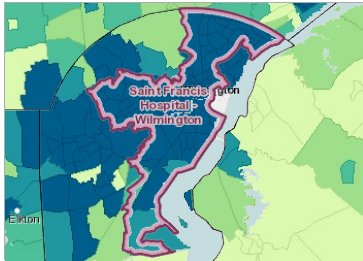

Percent Population Within 1/2 Mile of a Park

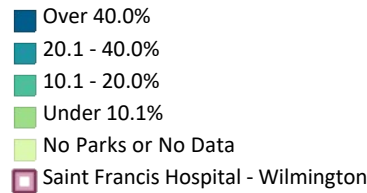

Population With Park Access (Within 1/2 Mile), Percent by Tract, ESRI/OSM 2013

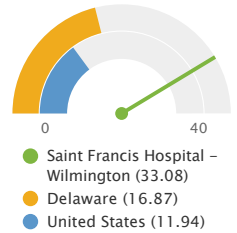

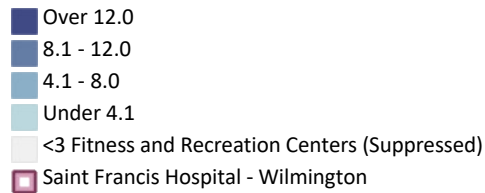

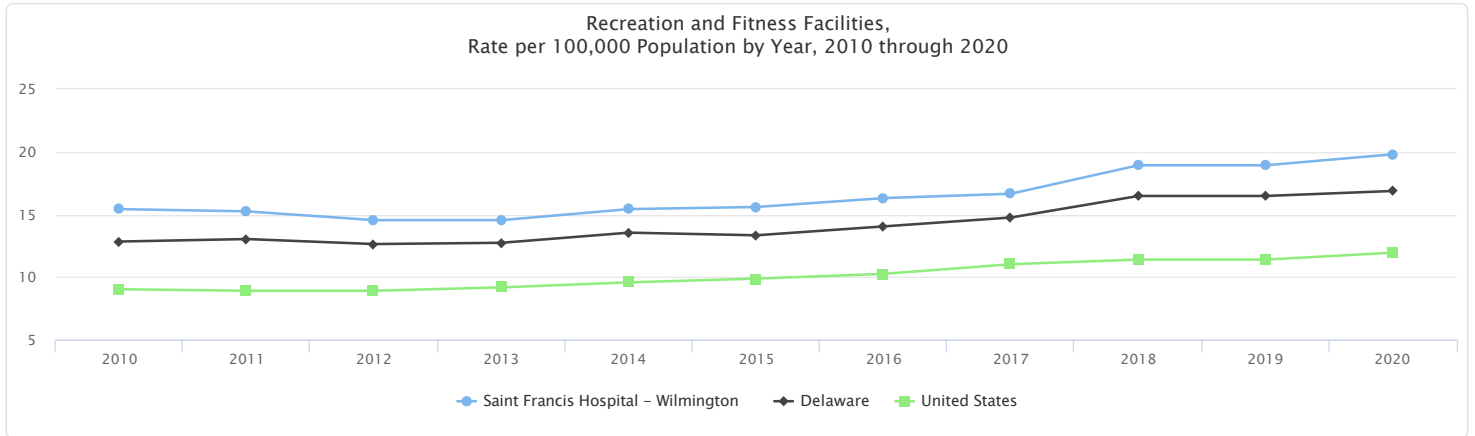

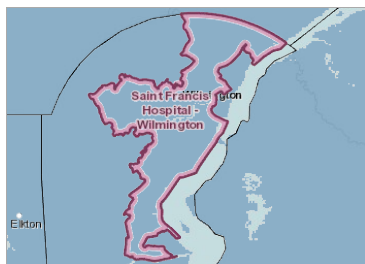

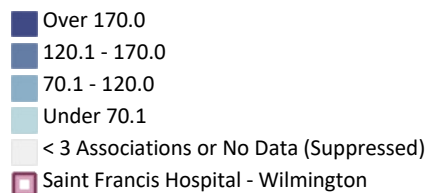

Social Associations, Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, CBP 2020



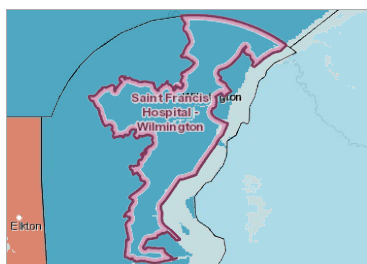

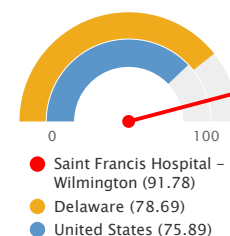

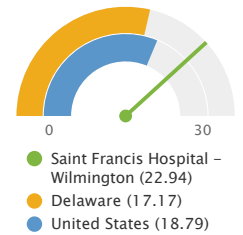

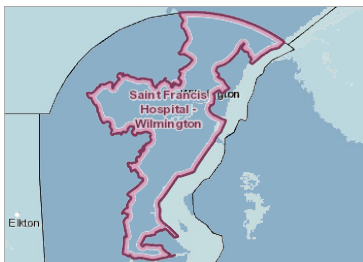

Grocery Stores, Rate per 100,000 Population



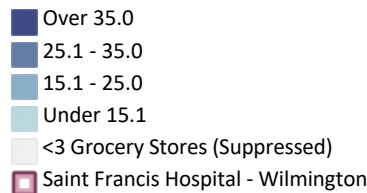

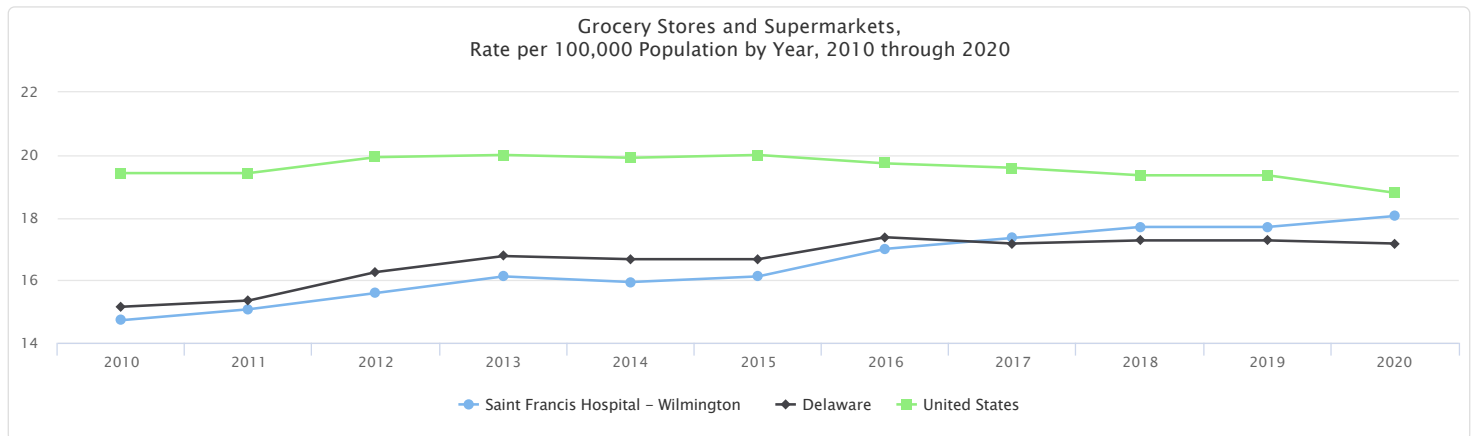

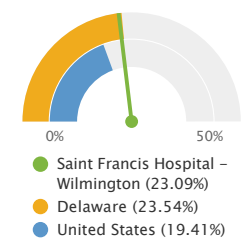

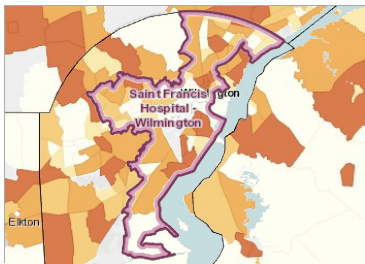

Percent Low Income Population with Low Food Access

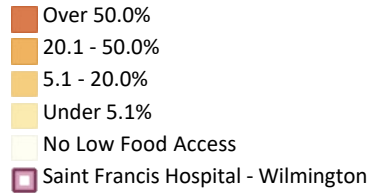

Population with Limited Food Access, Low Income, Percent by Tract, USDA - FARA 2019

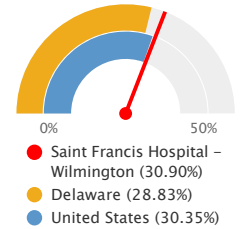

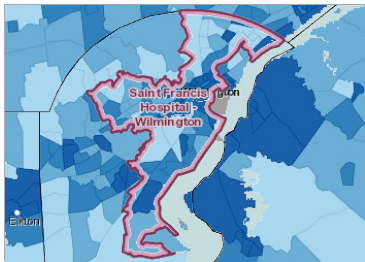

Percentage of Households where Housing Costs Exceed 30% of Income

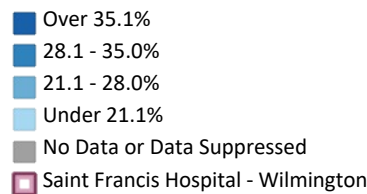

Cost Burdened Households (Housing Costs Exceed 30% of Household Income), Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20

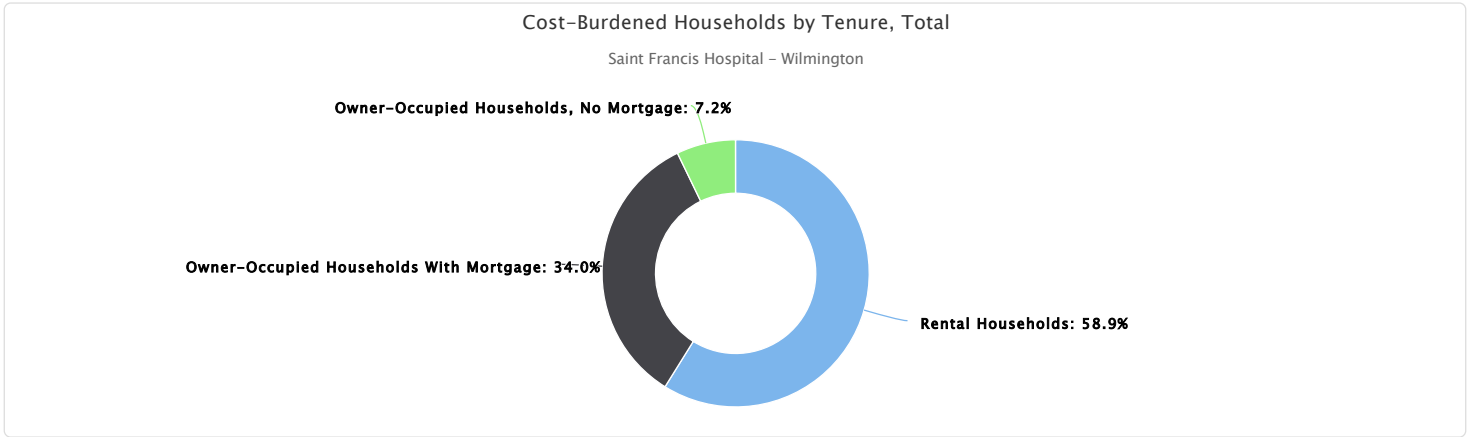

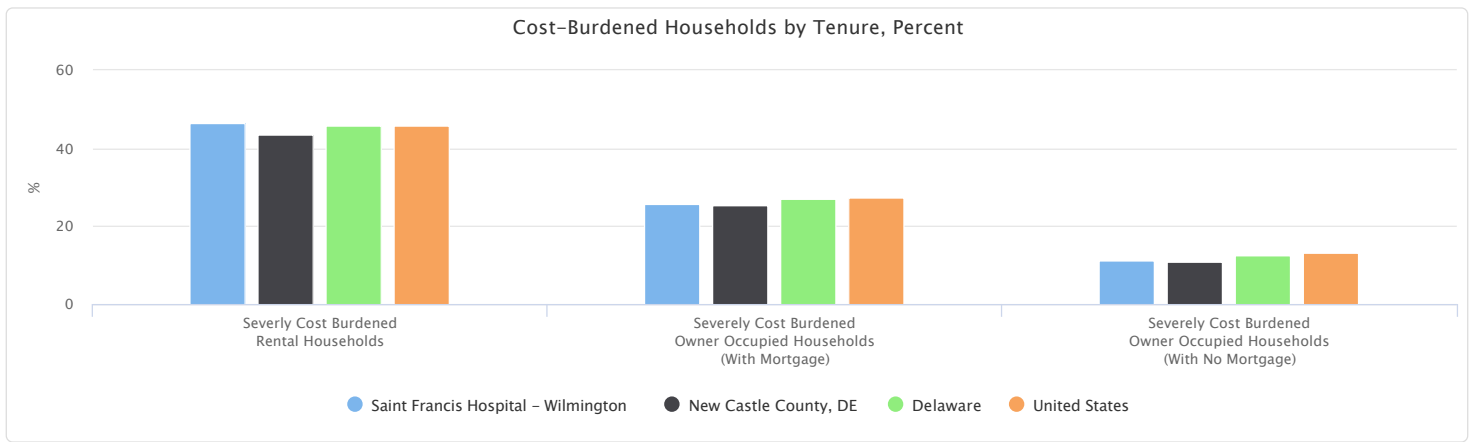

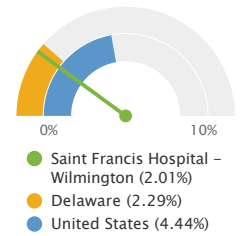

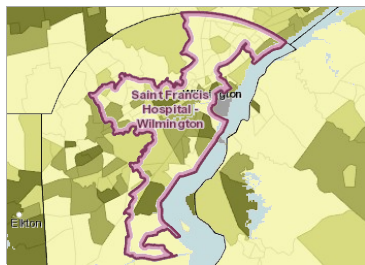

Percentage of Housing Units Overcrowded



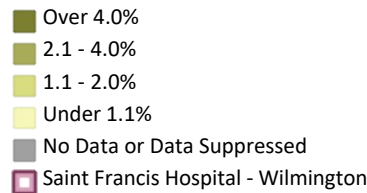

Overcrowded Housing (Over 1 Person/Room), Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20

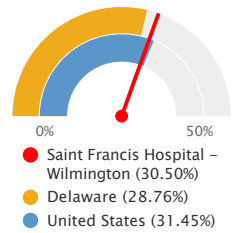

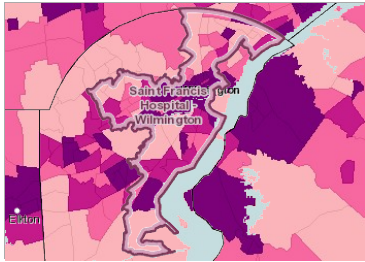

Occupied Housing Units with One or More Substandard Conditions, Percent

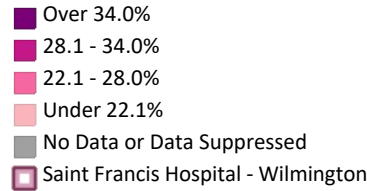

Substandard Housing Units, Percent of Total by Tract, ACS 2016-20



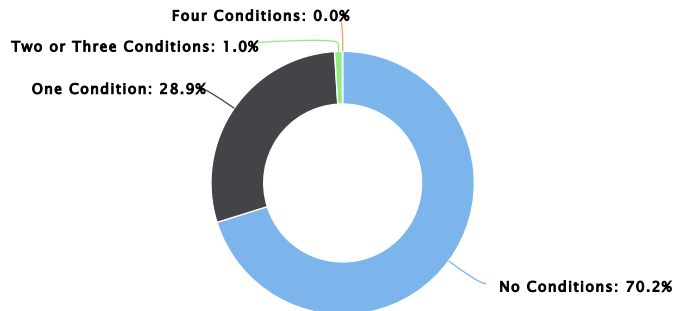

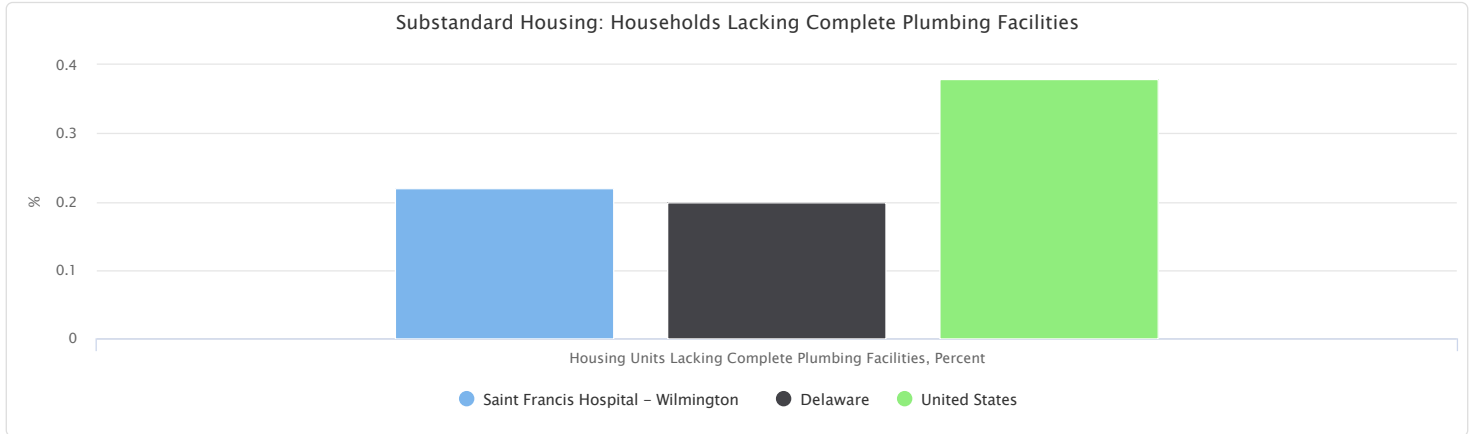

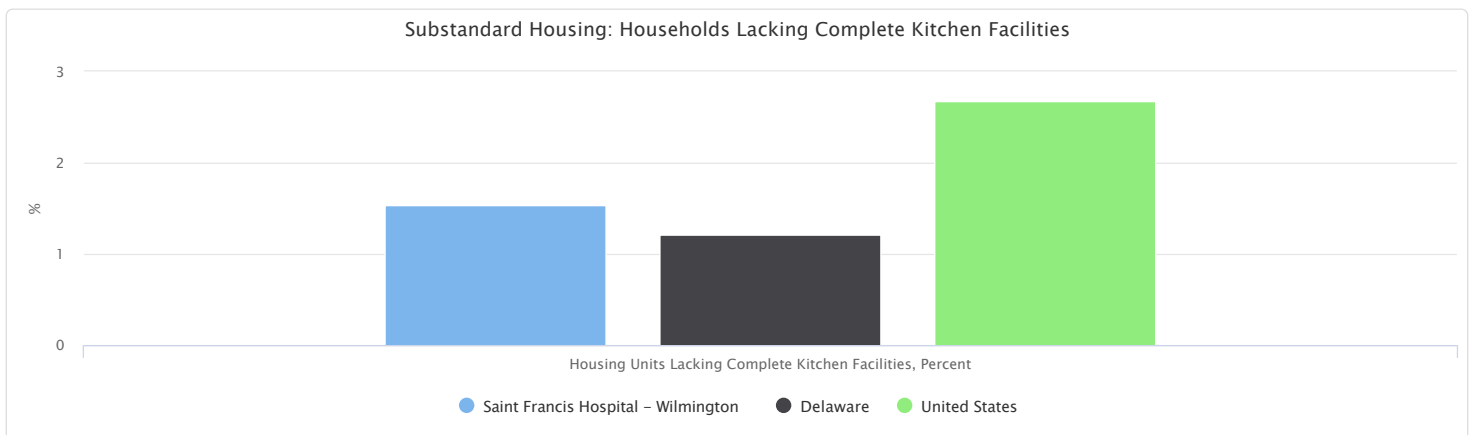

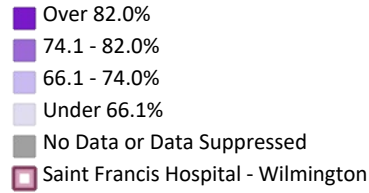

Owner-Occupied Housing Units, Percent by Tract, ACS 2016-20



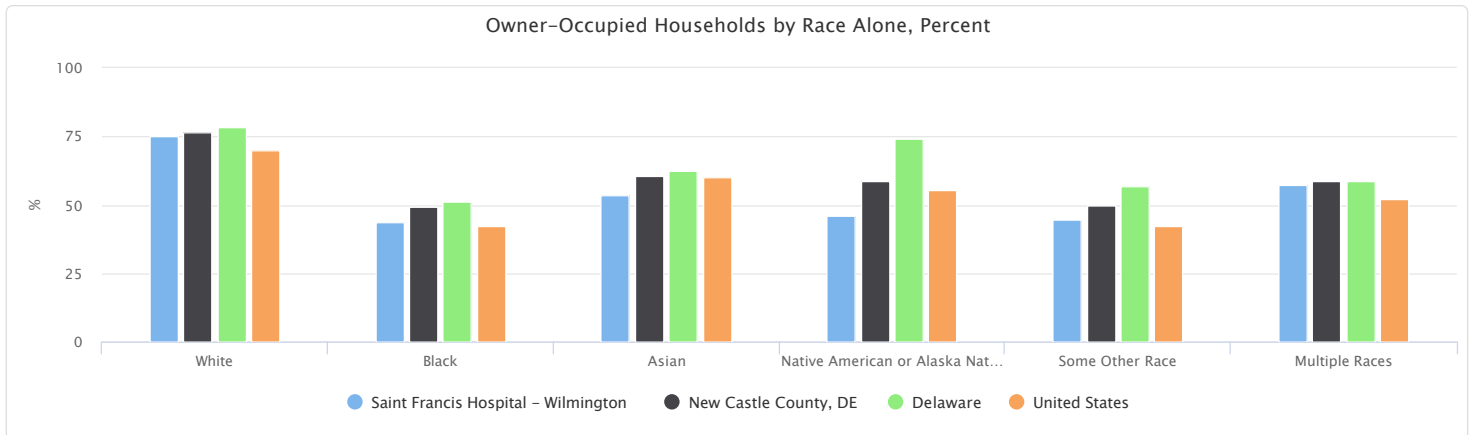

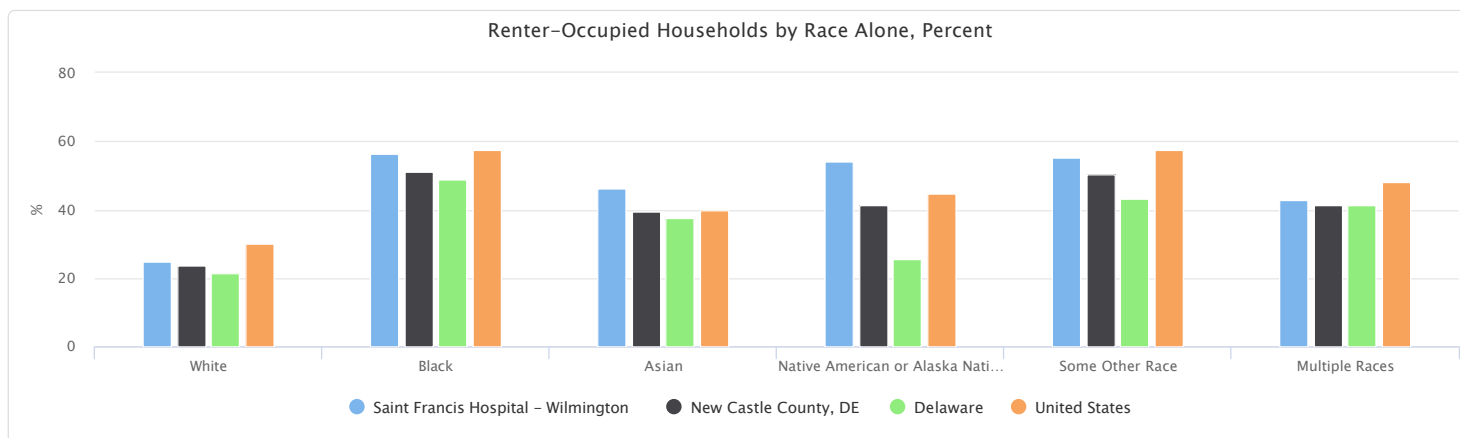

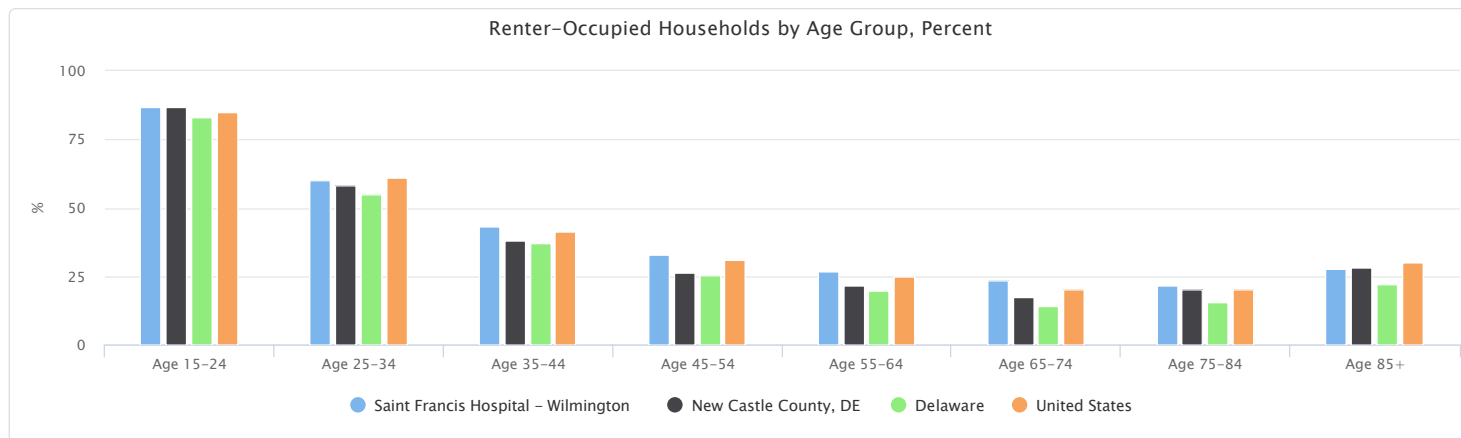

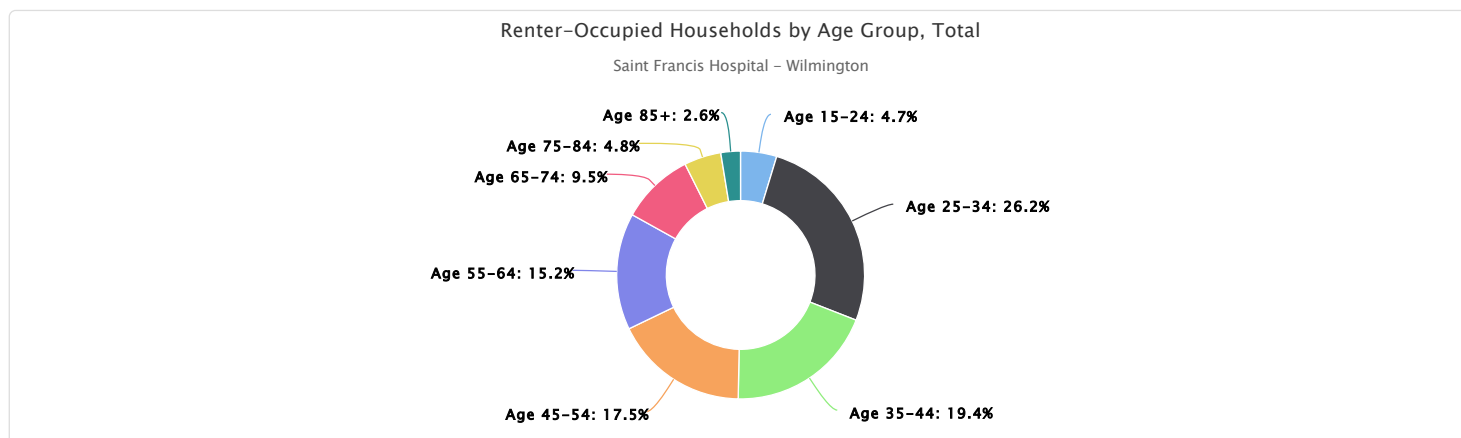

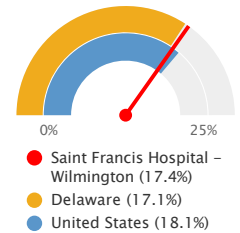
30-Day Hospital Readmissions

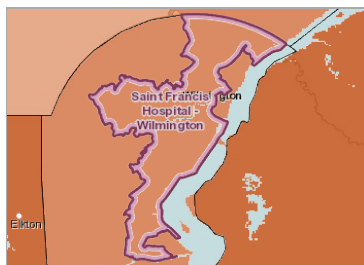

Medicare Beneficiaries, 30-Day Readmission Rate

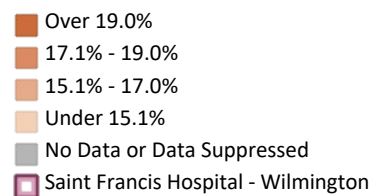

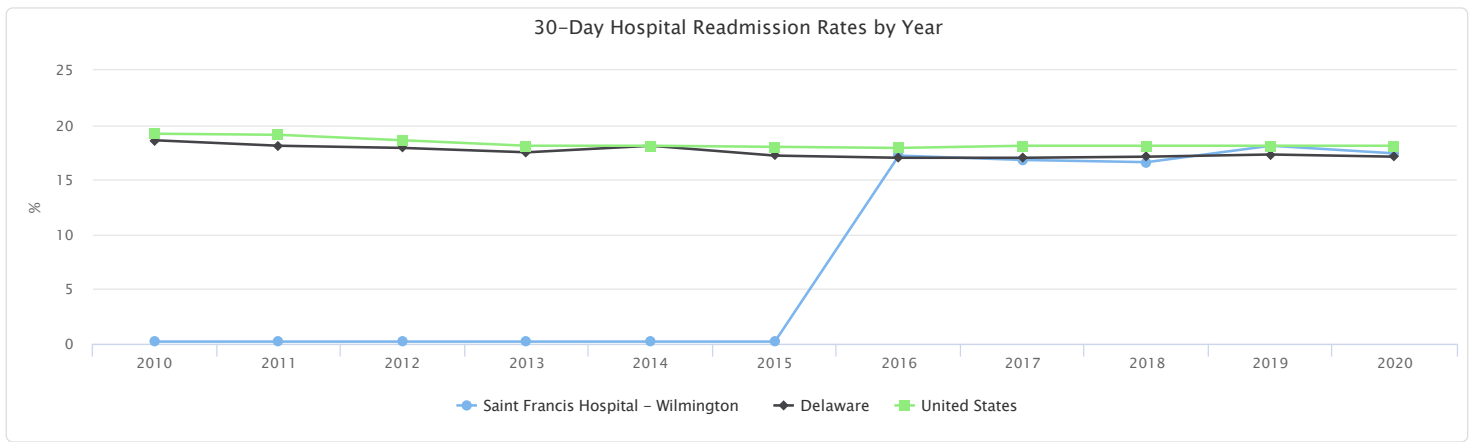
30-Day Hospital Readmissions, Rate (%) by County, CMS 2020

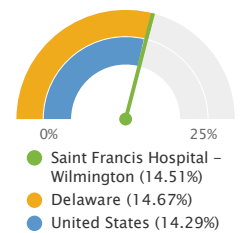

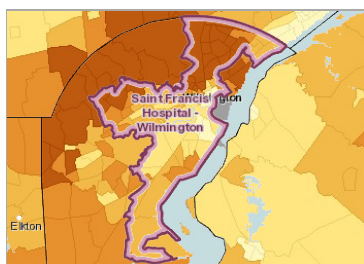

Alcoholic Beverage Expenditures, Percent of Food-At-Home Expenditures, National Rank by Tract, Nielsen 2014

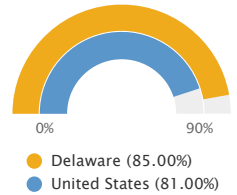

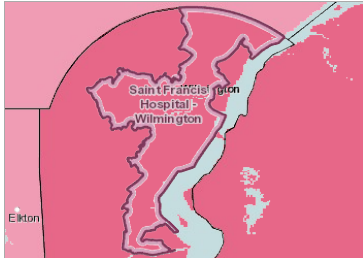

Percentage of Children Ever Breastfed



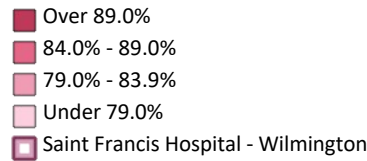

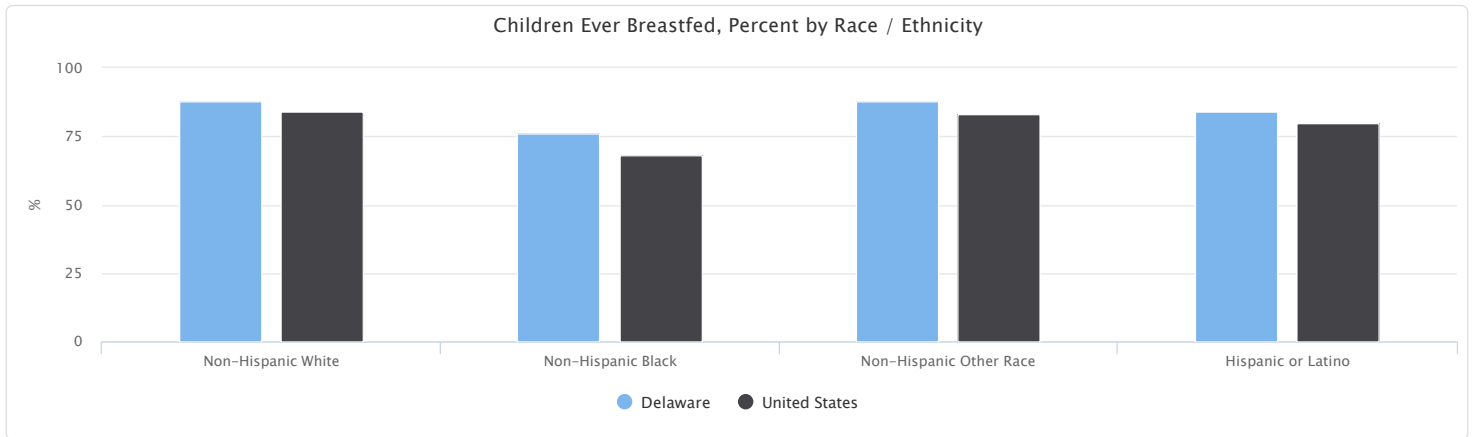
Children Age 0-5 Ever Breastfed, Percent by State, NSCH 2018

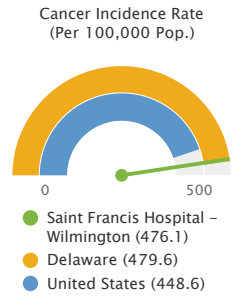

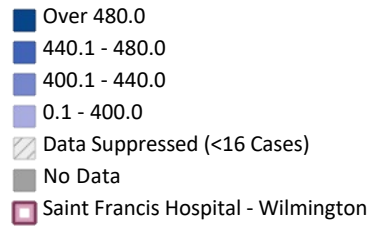

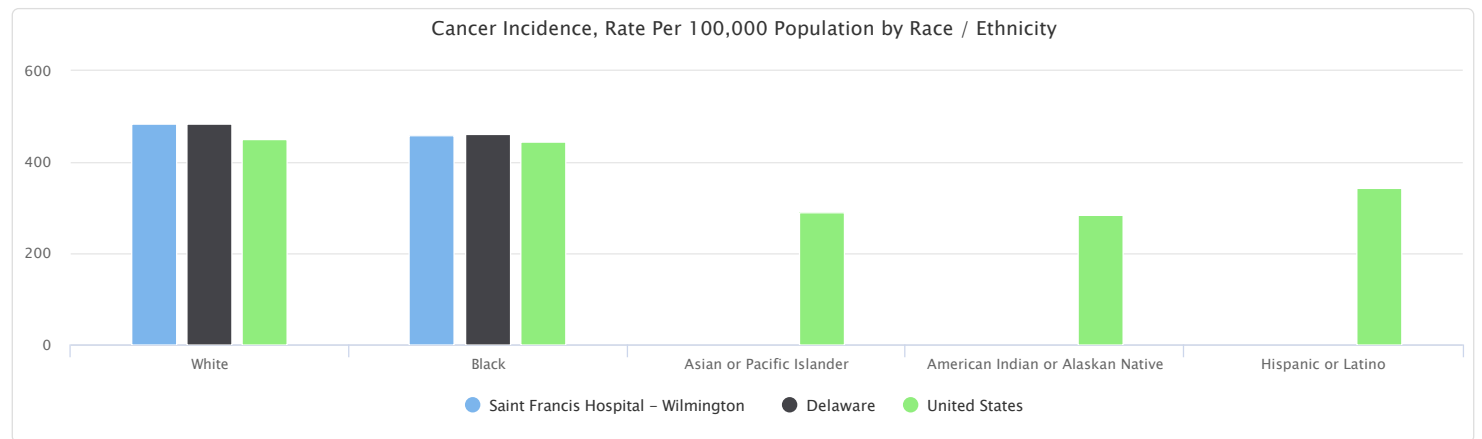
Cancer (All Sites), Incidence Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, State Cancer Profiles 2014-18

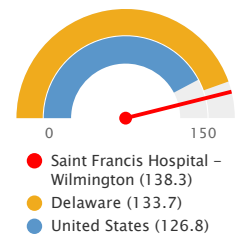

Breast Cancer Incidence Rate (Per 100,000 Females)

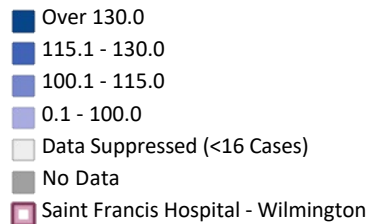

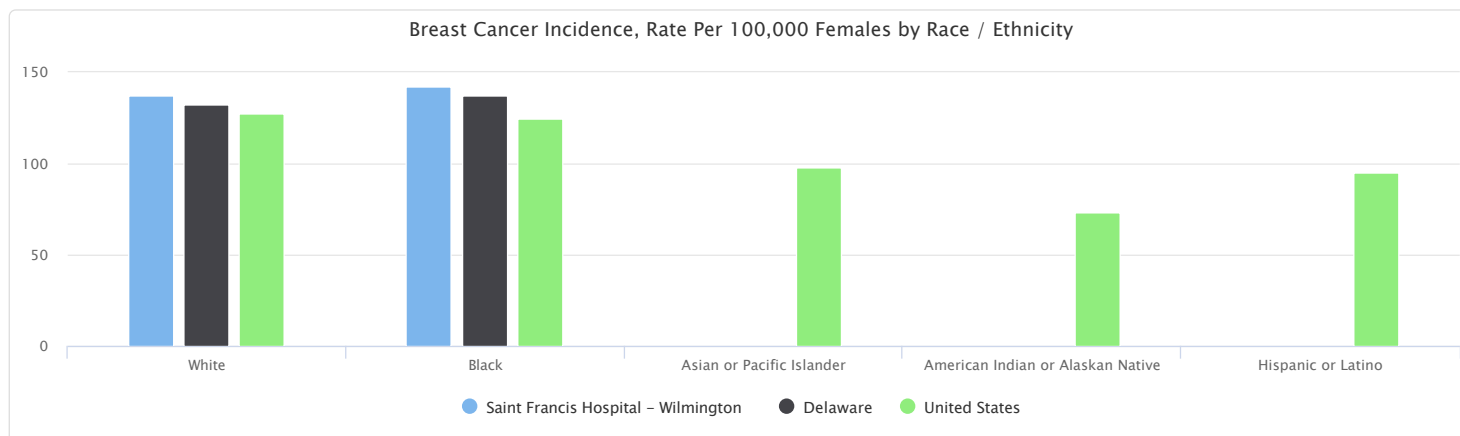
Breast Cancer, Incidence Rate (Per 100,000 Females) by County, State Cancer Profiles 2014-18

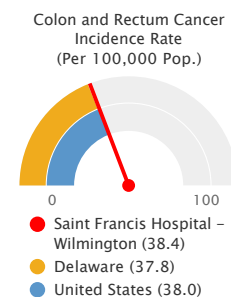

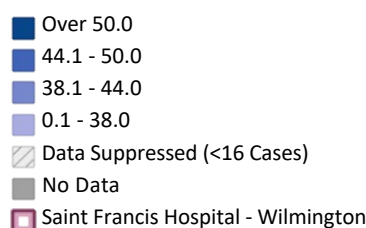

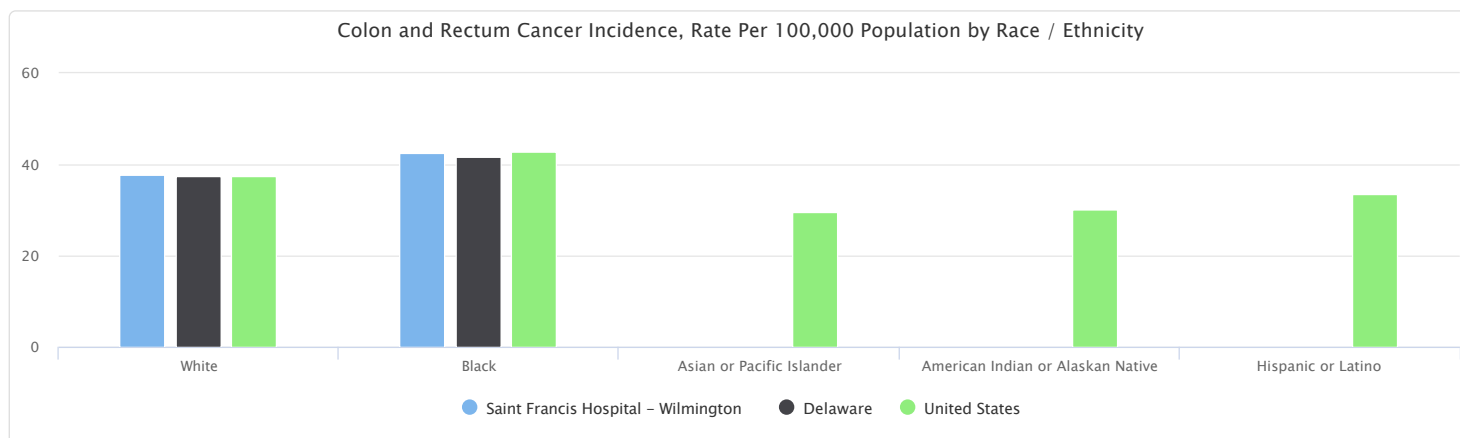
Colon-Rectal Cancer, Incidence Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, State Cancer Profiles 2014-18

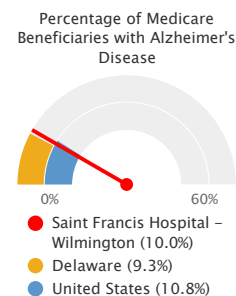

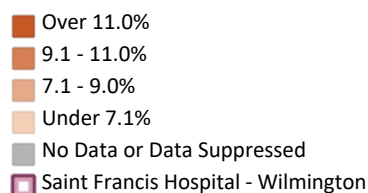

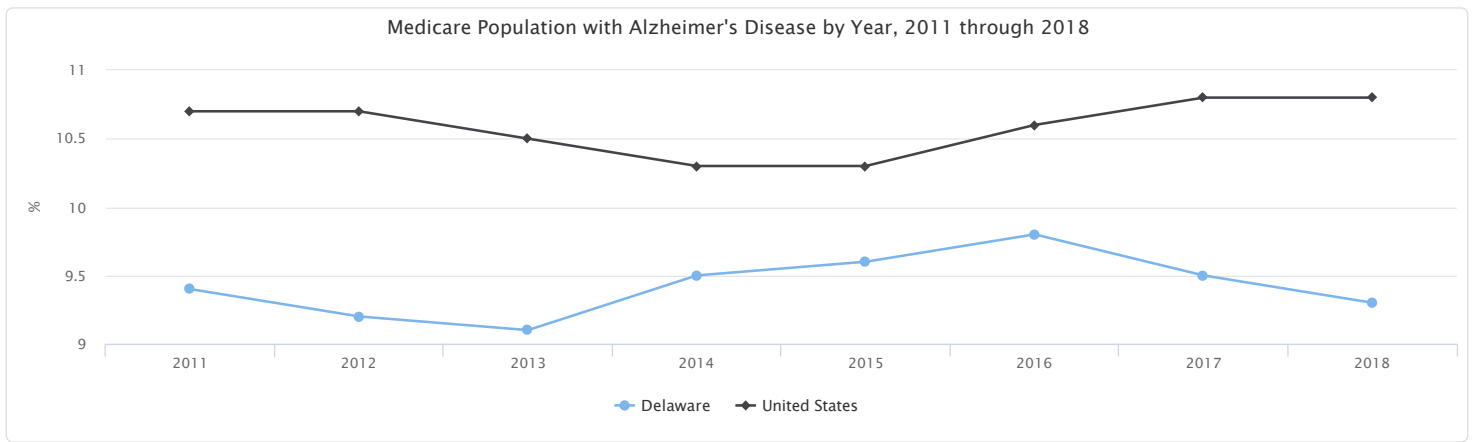
Beneficiaries with Alzheimer's Disease, Percent by County, CMS 2018

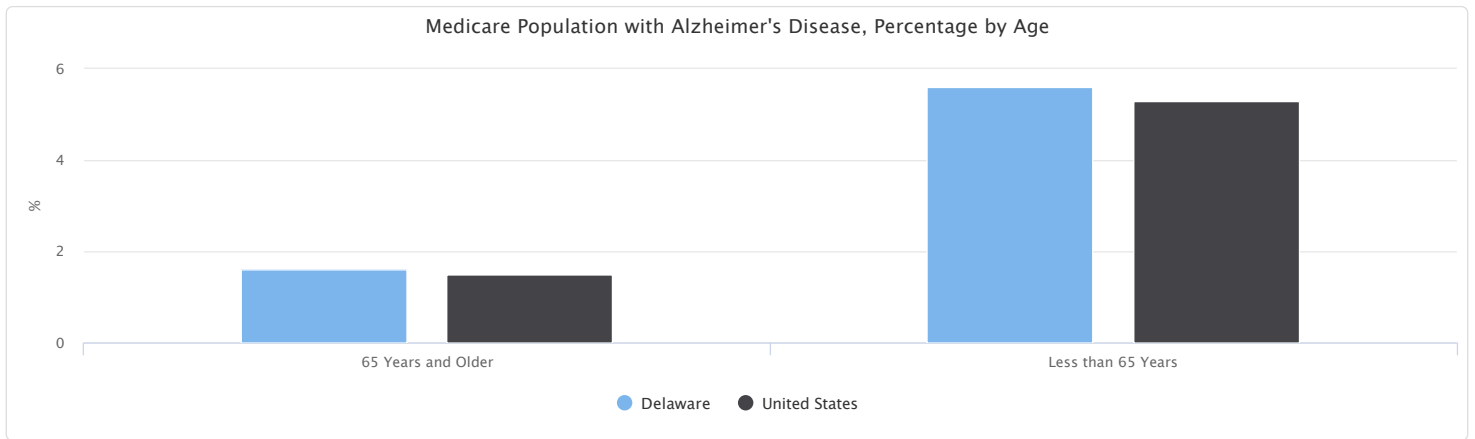


Medicare Population with Alzheimer's Disease, Percentage by Age

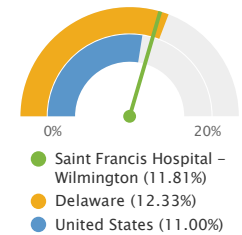

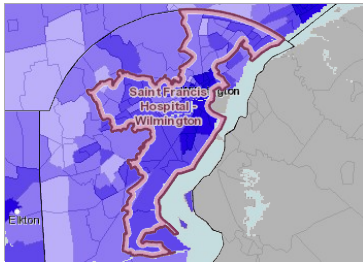

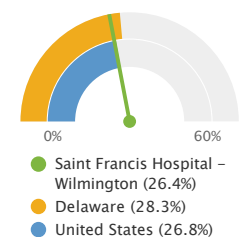

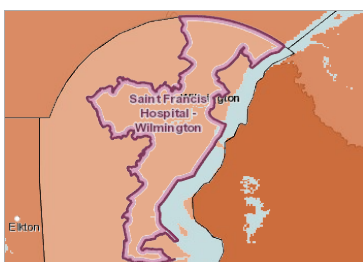

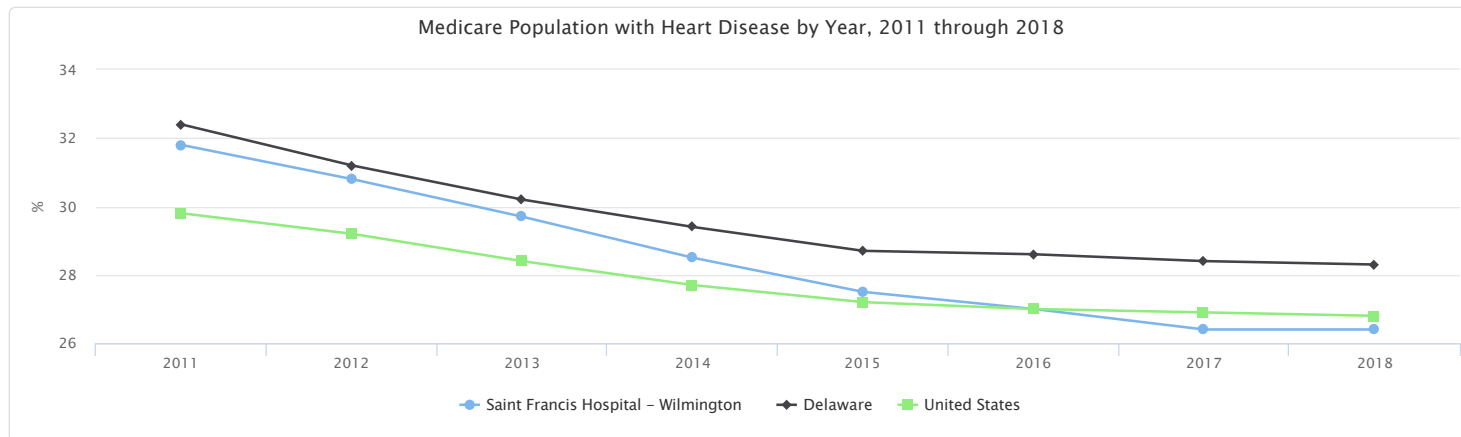

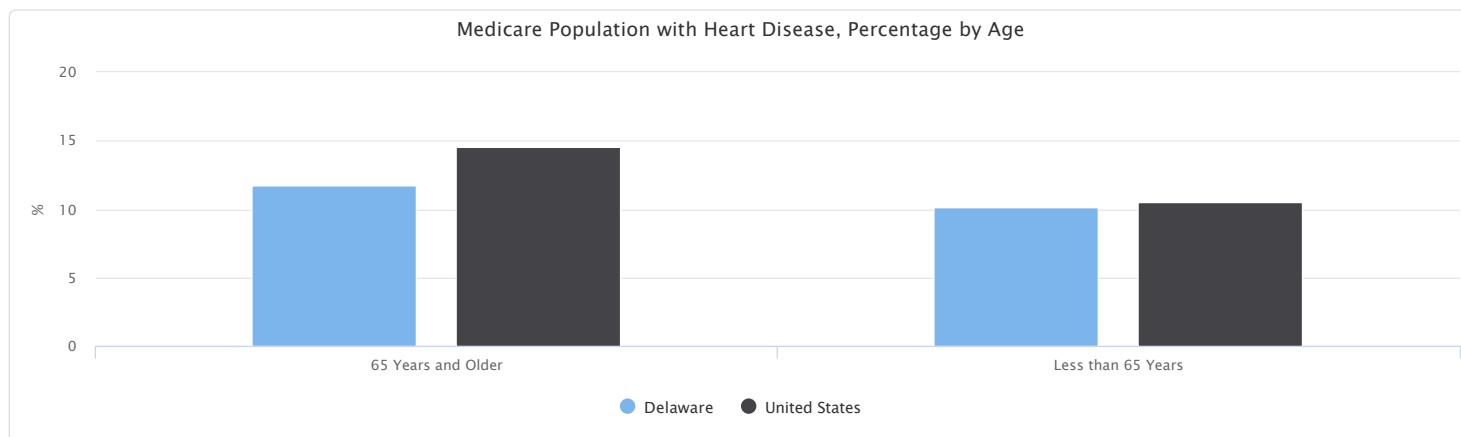

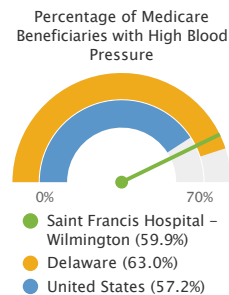

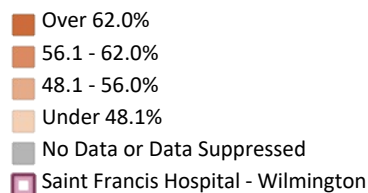

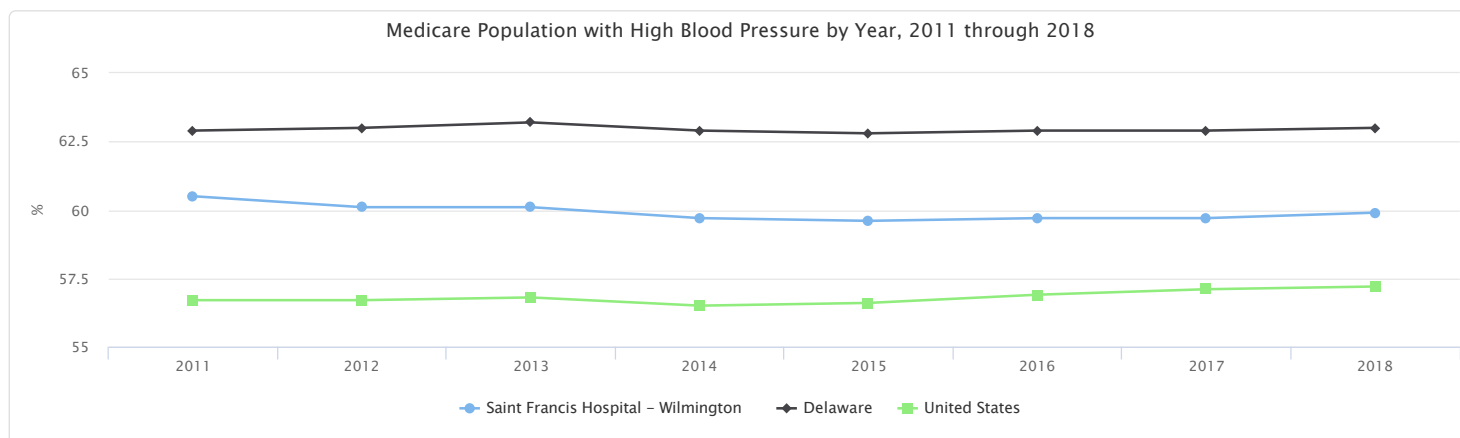
Beneficiaries with High Blood Pressure, Percent by County, CMS 2018

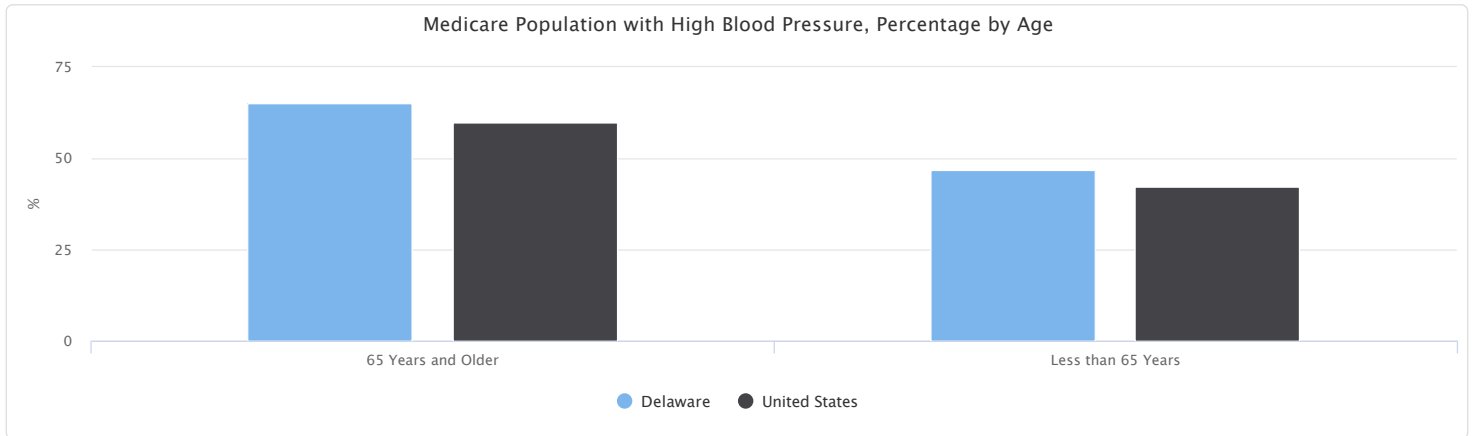

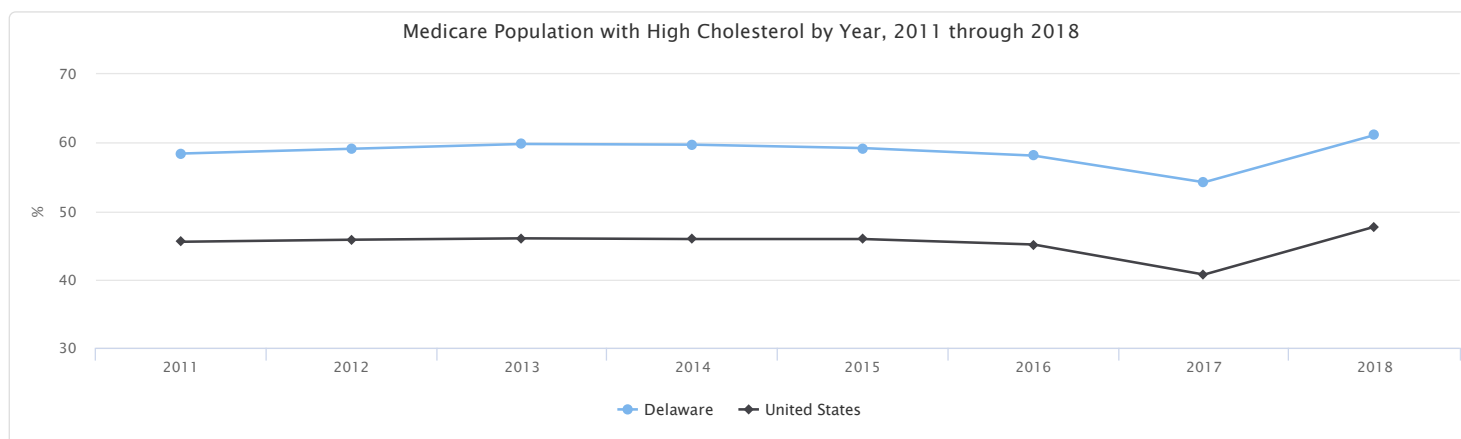

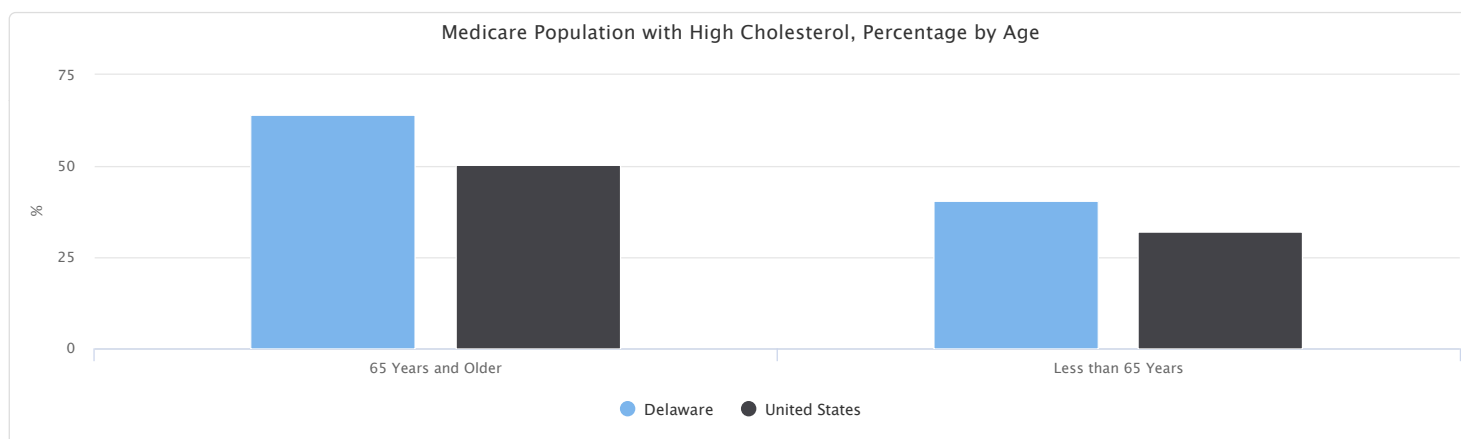

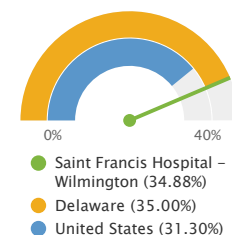

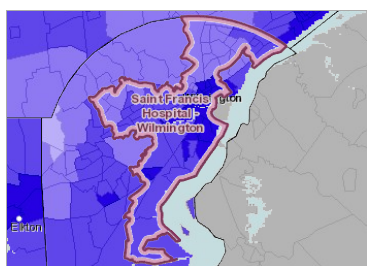

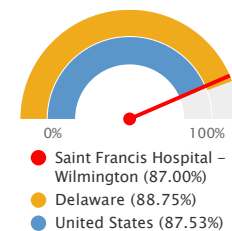

Percentage of Medicare Enrollees with Diabetes with Annual A1C Test



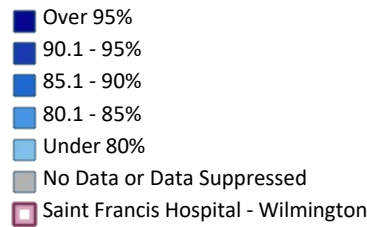

Patients with Annual HA1C Test (Diabetes), Percent of Medicare Enrollees with Diabetes by County, Dartmouth Atlas 2019

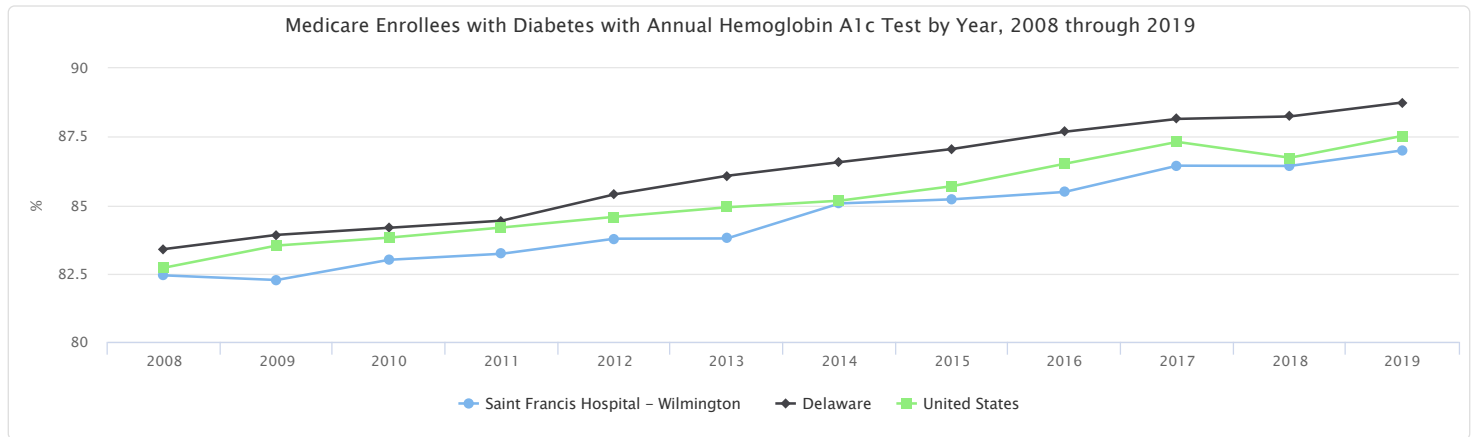

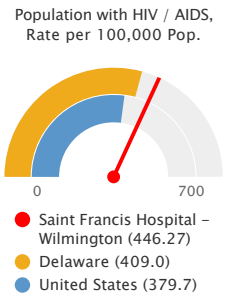
Fruit and Vegetable Expenditures, Percent of Food-At-Home Expenditures, National Rank by Tract, Nielsen 2014

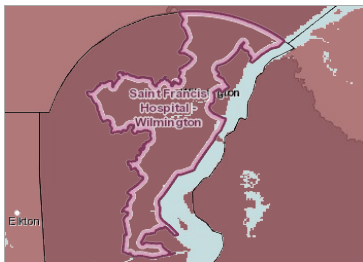

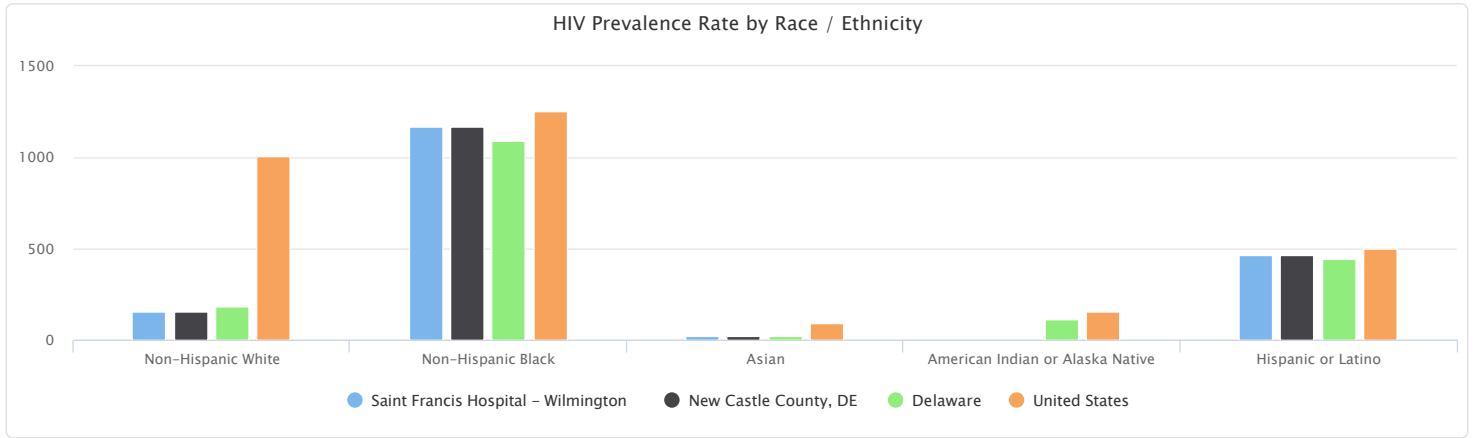

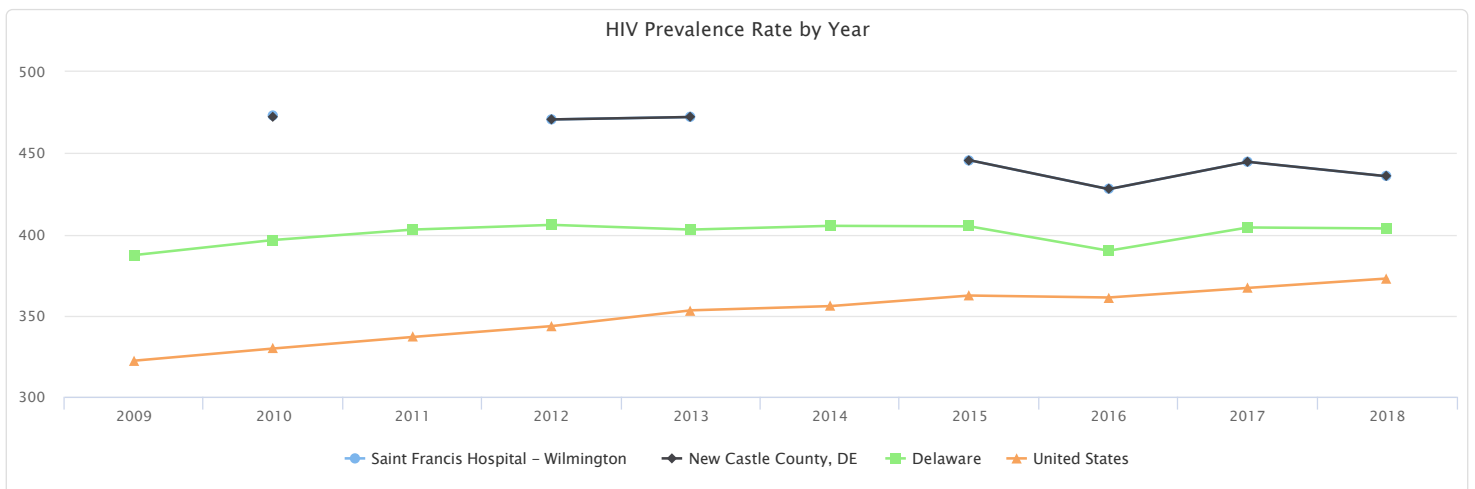

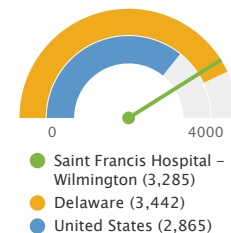

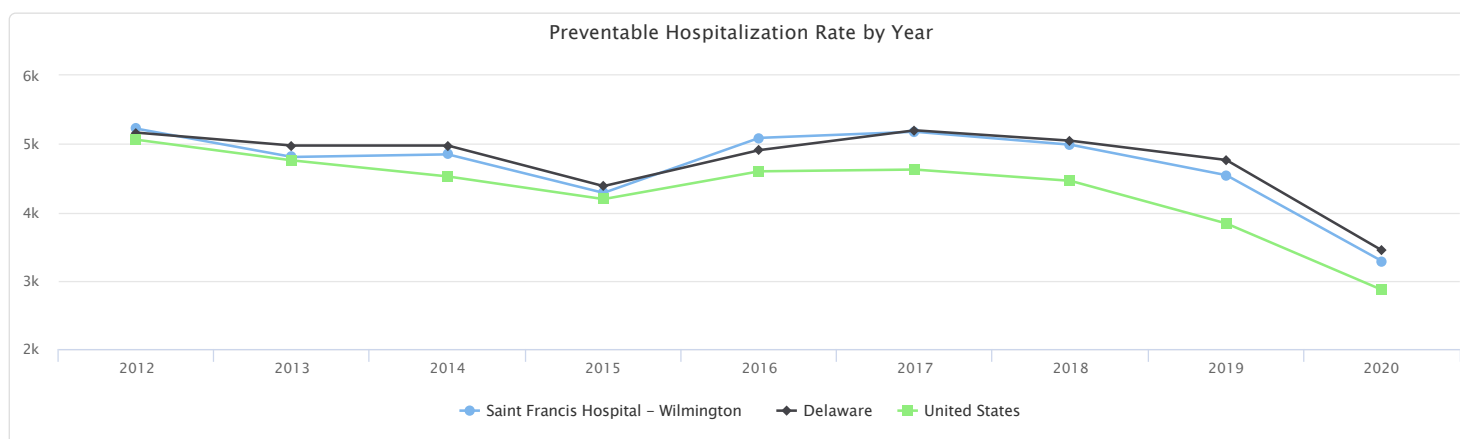

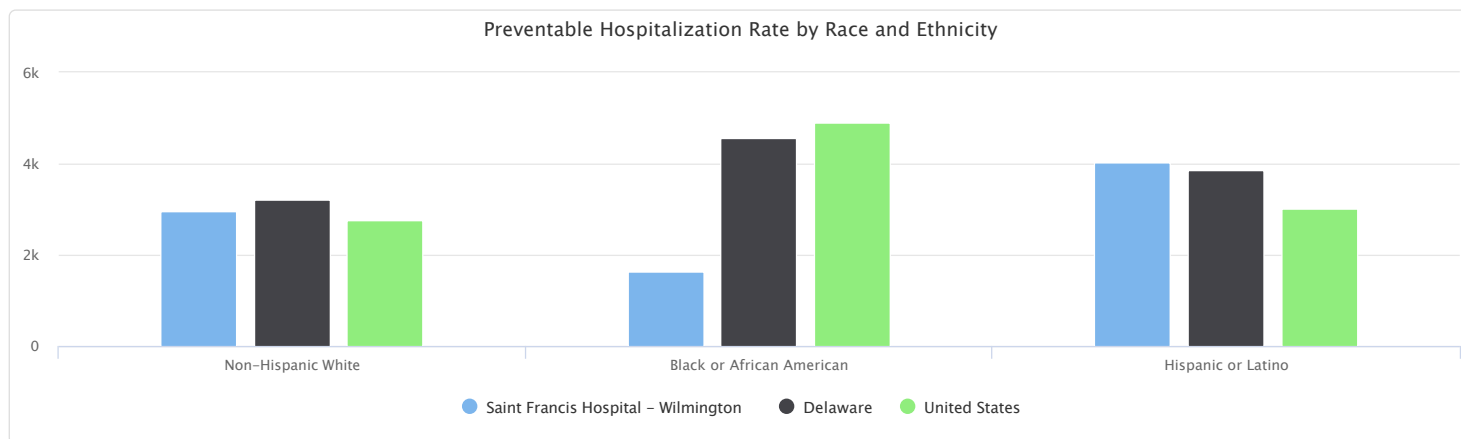

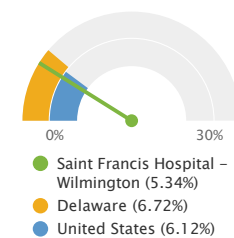

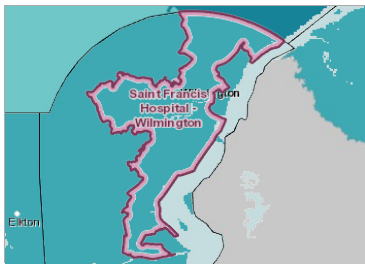

Percentage of Pregnant Women with Late or No Prenatal Care



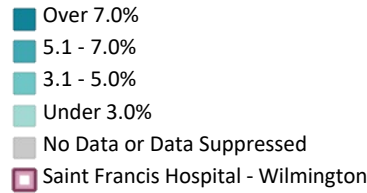

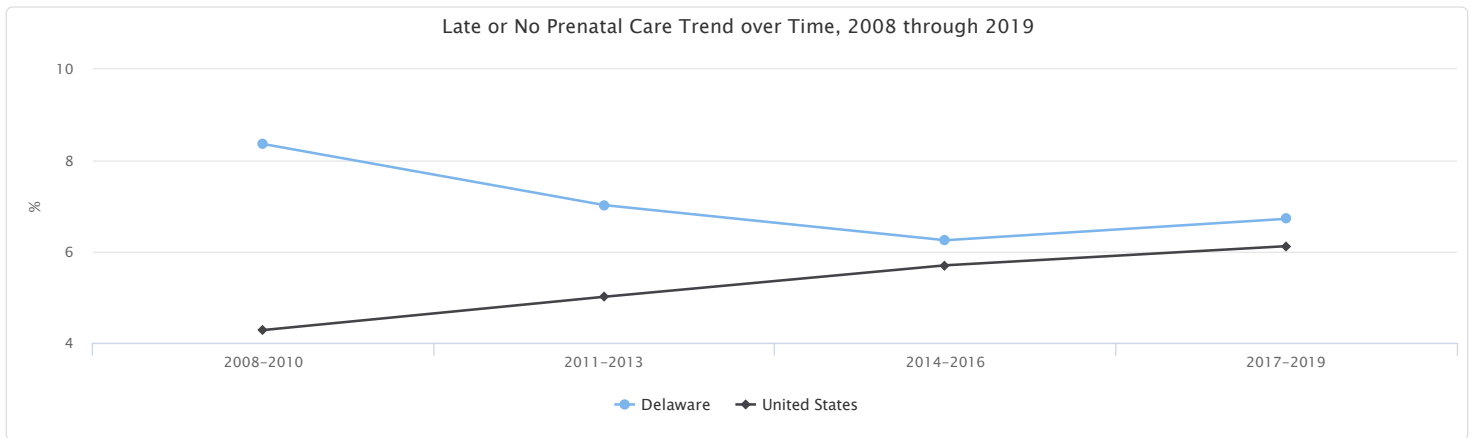
Mothers with Late or No Prenatal Care, Percent by County, CDC NVSS 2017-19

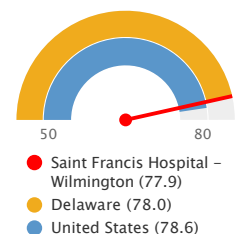

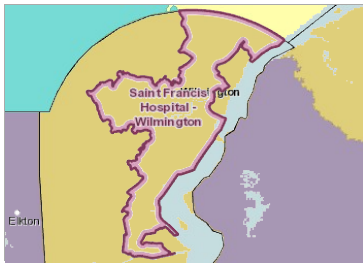

Life Expectancy at Birth, 2018-2020

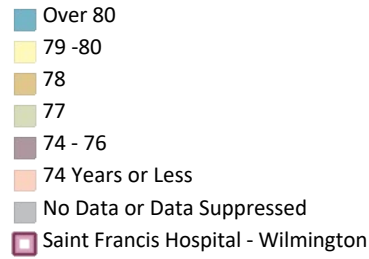

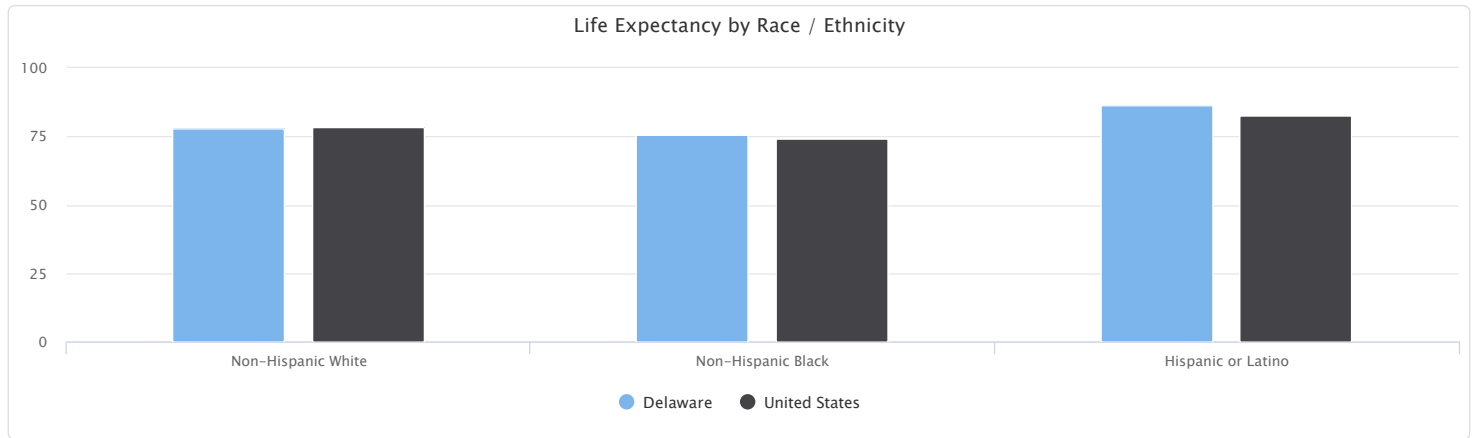
Life Expectancy, Years by County, CDC NVSS 2018-2020

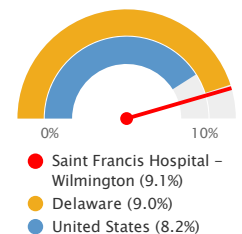

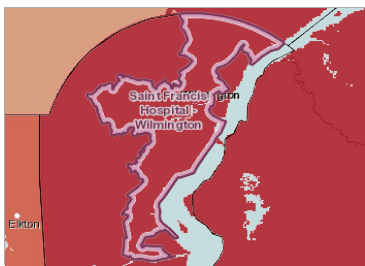

Percentage of Infants with Low Birthweight: %



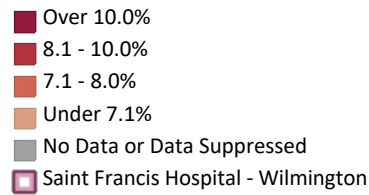

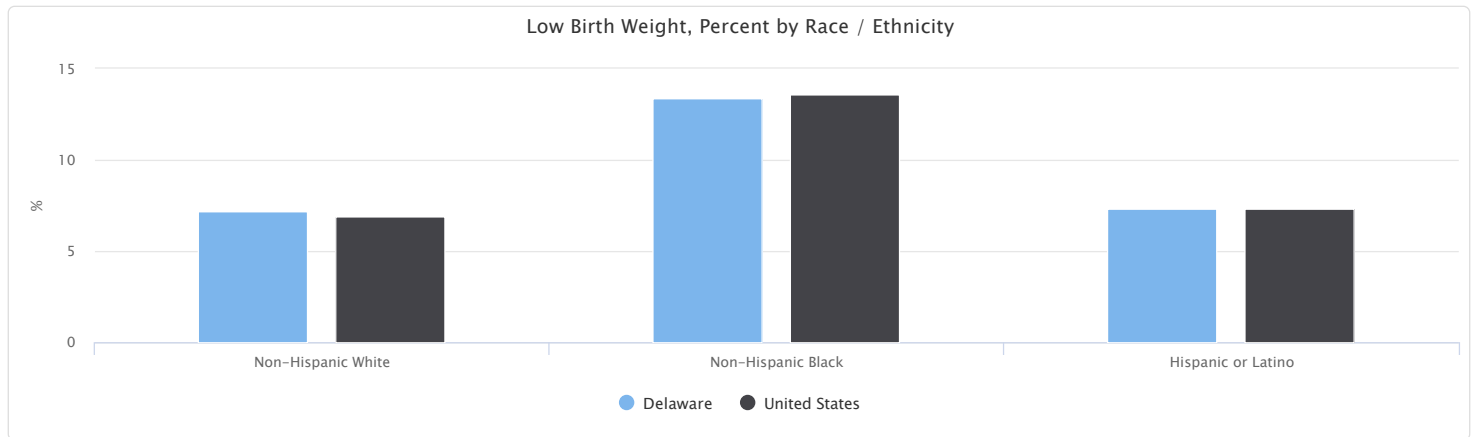
Low Birthweight, Percentage of Live Births by County, CDC NVSS 2014-2020

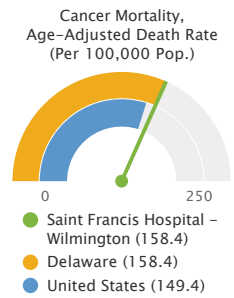

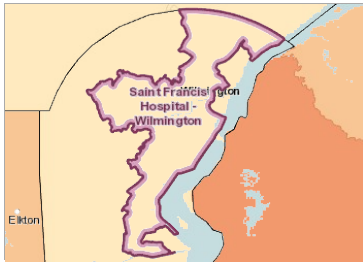

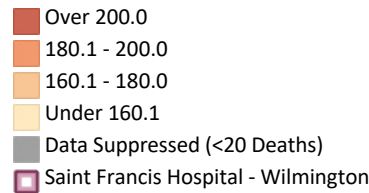

Cancer Mortality, Age Adj. Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, CDC NVSS 2016-20



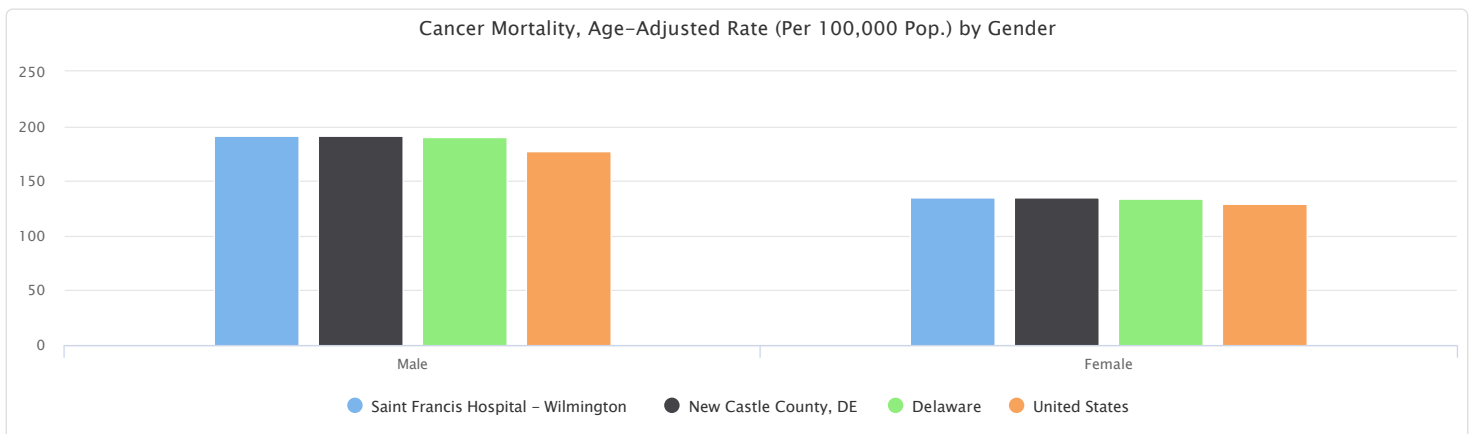

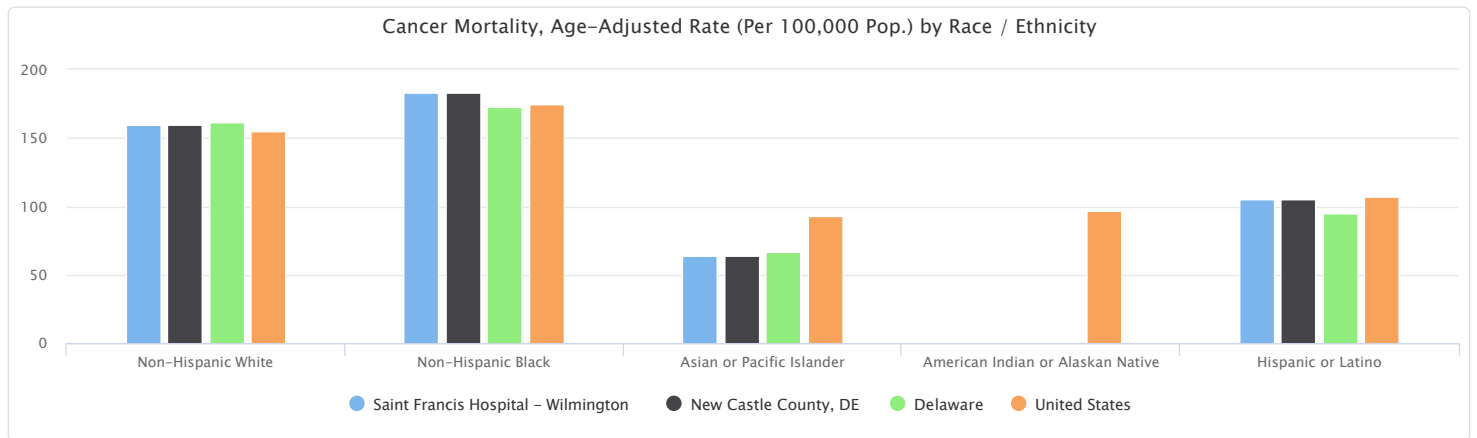

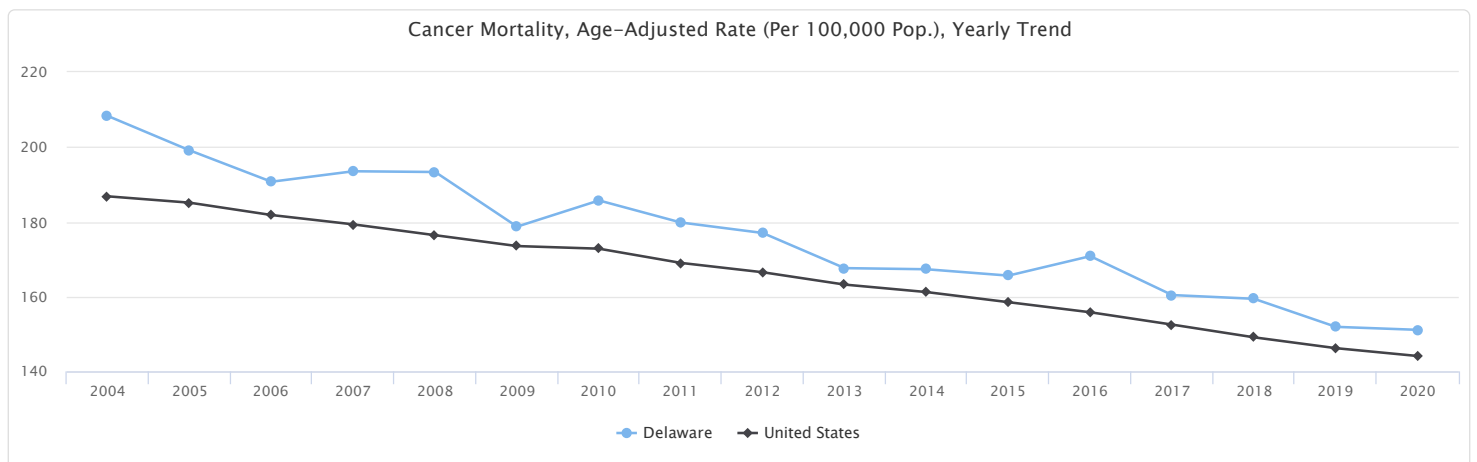

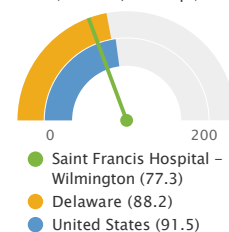

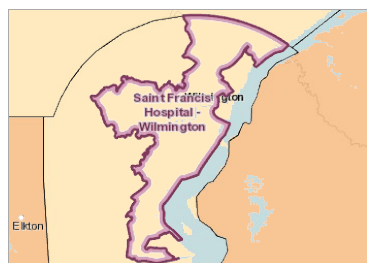

Coronary Heart Disease Mortality, Age-Adjusted Death Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.)



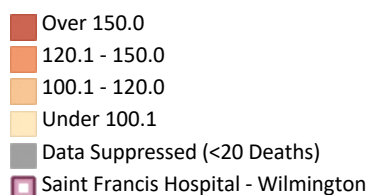

Coronary Heart Disease Mortality, Age Adj. Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, CDC NVSS 2016-20

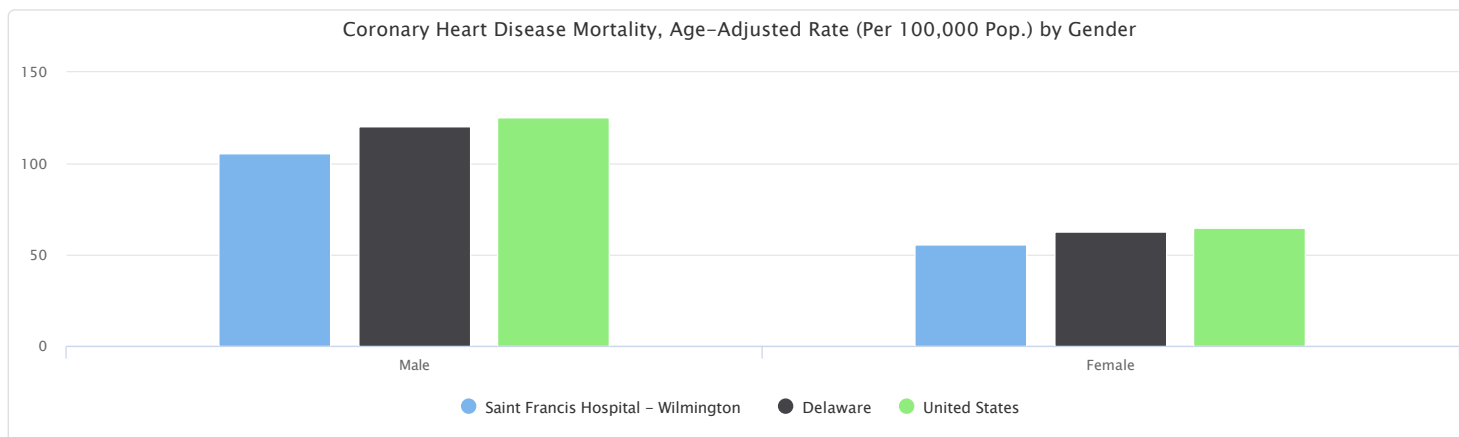

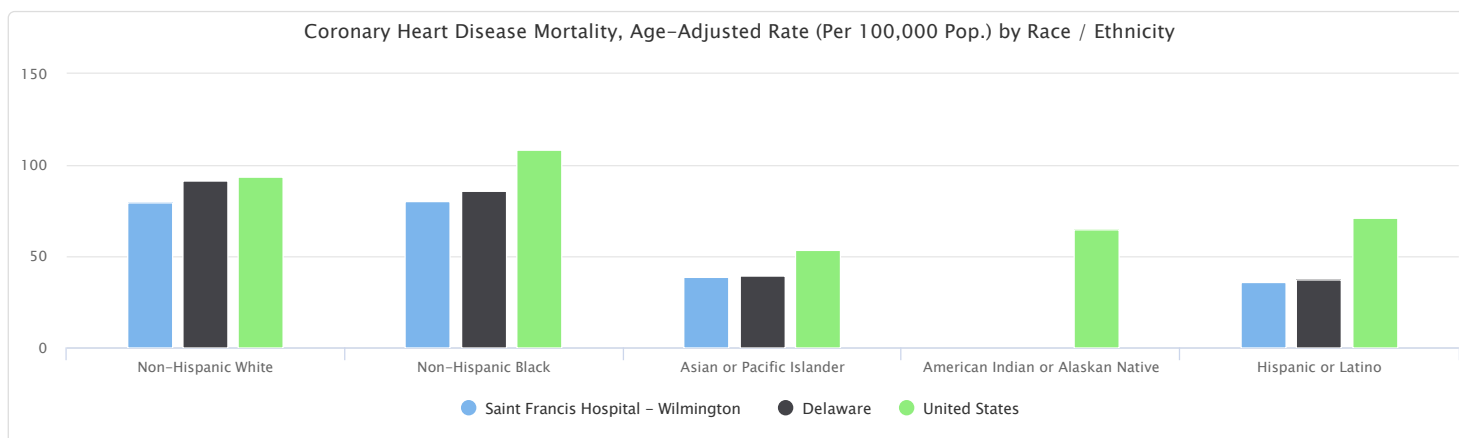

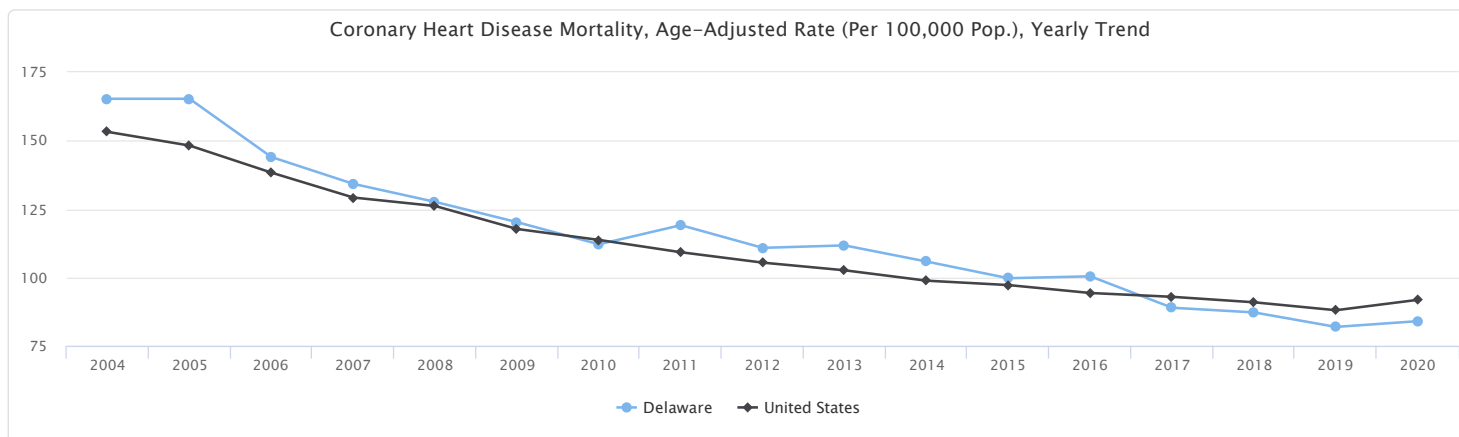

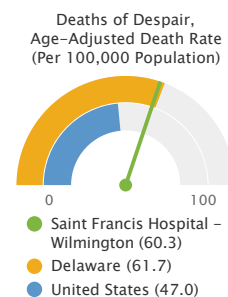

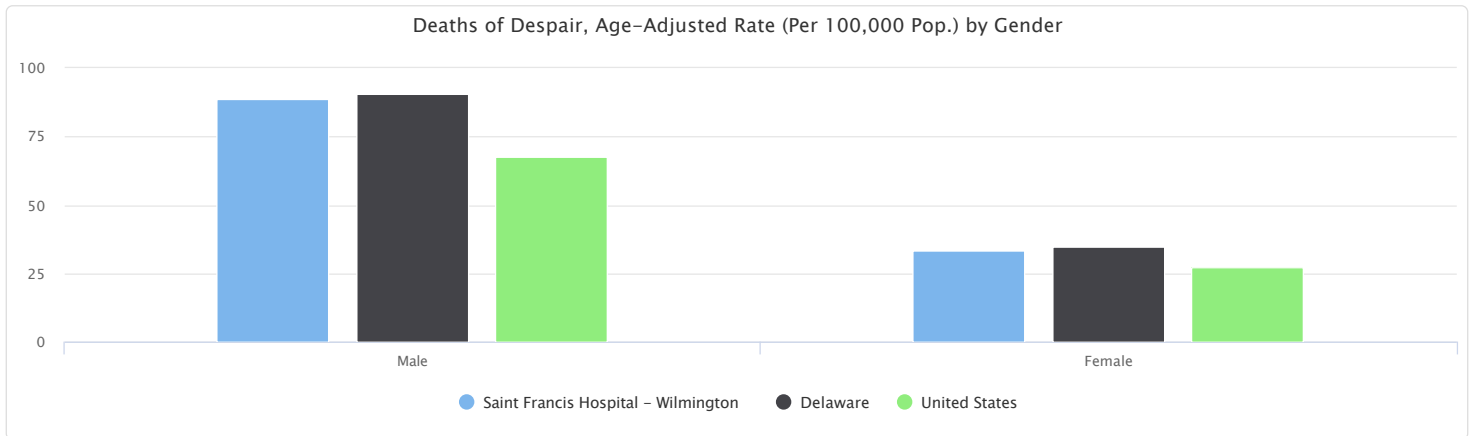
Deaths of Despair, Age Adj. Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, CDC NVSS 2016-20

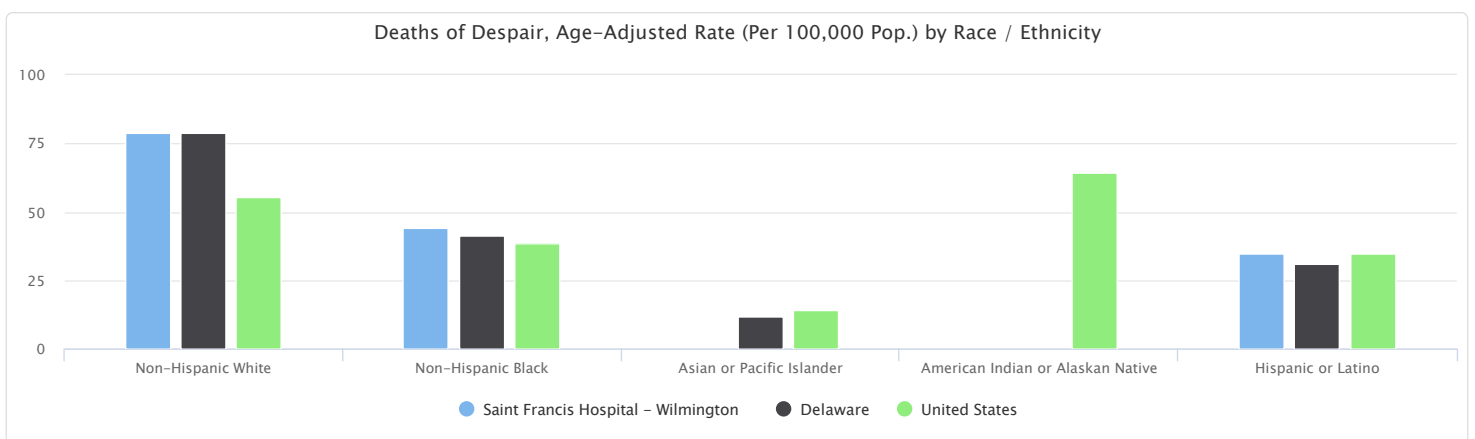

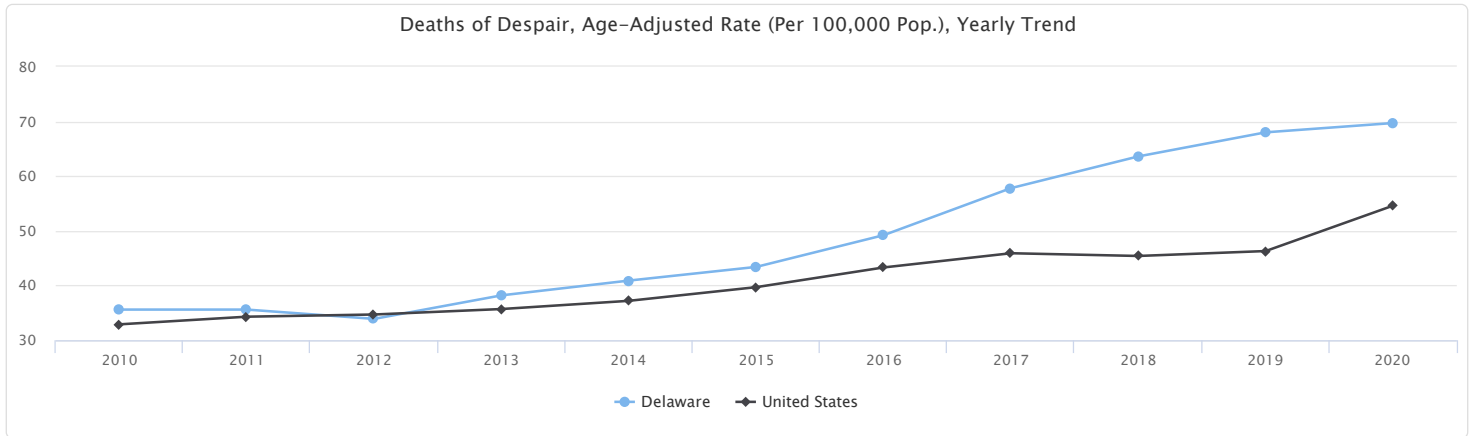

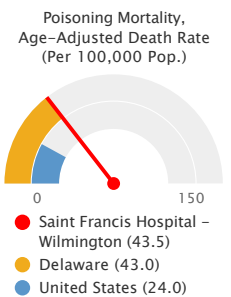

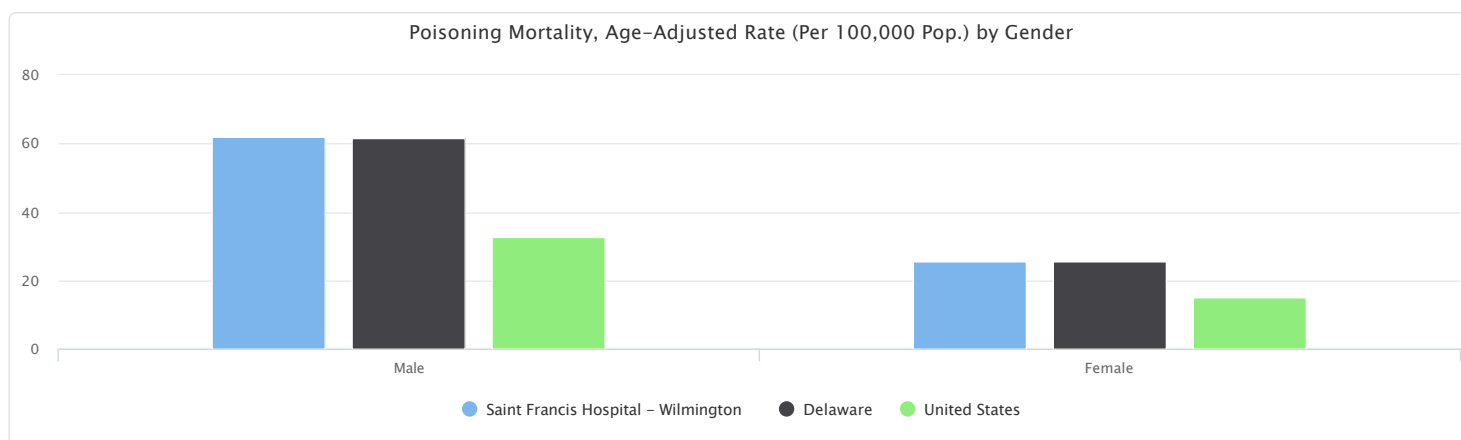

Homicide Mortality, Age Adj. Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, CDC NVSS 2016-20

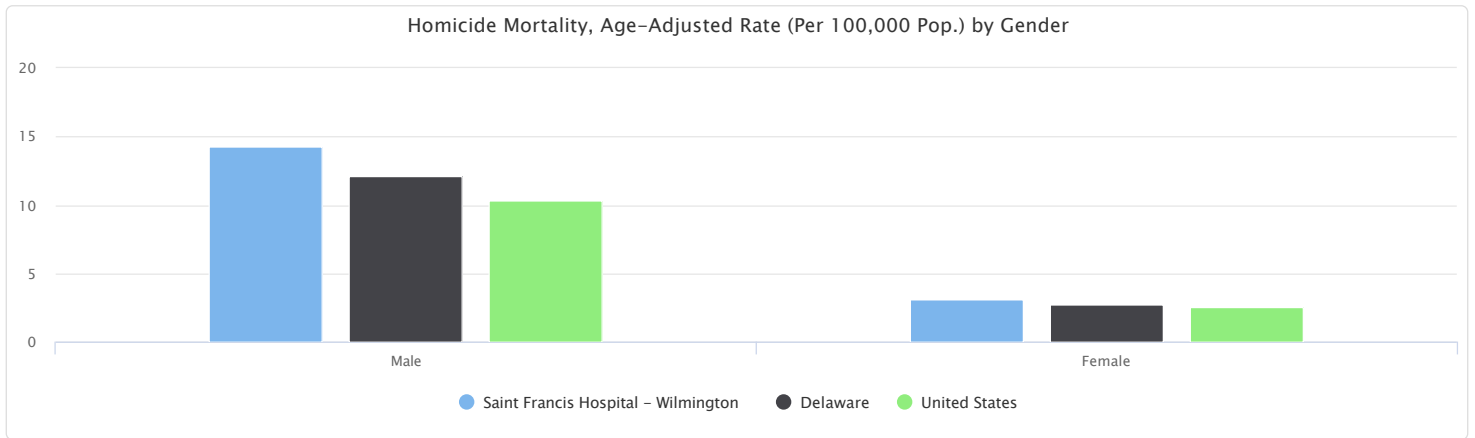

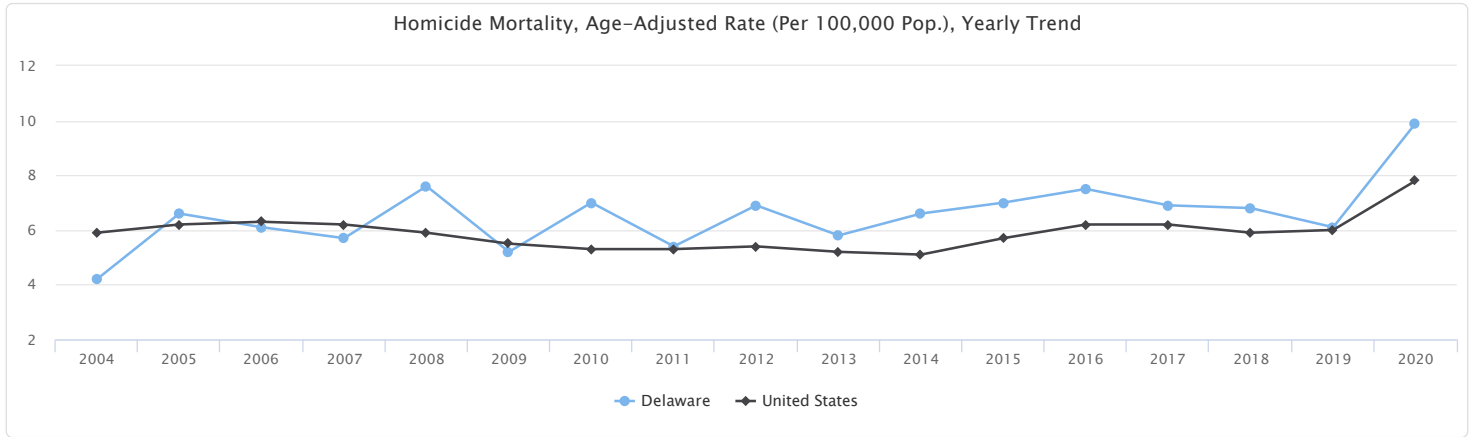

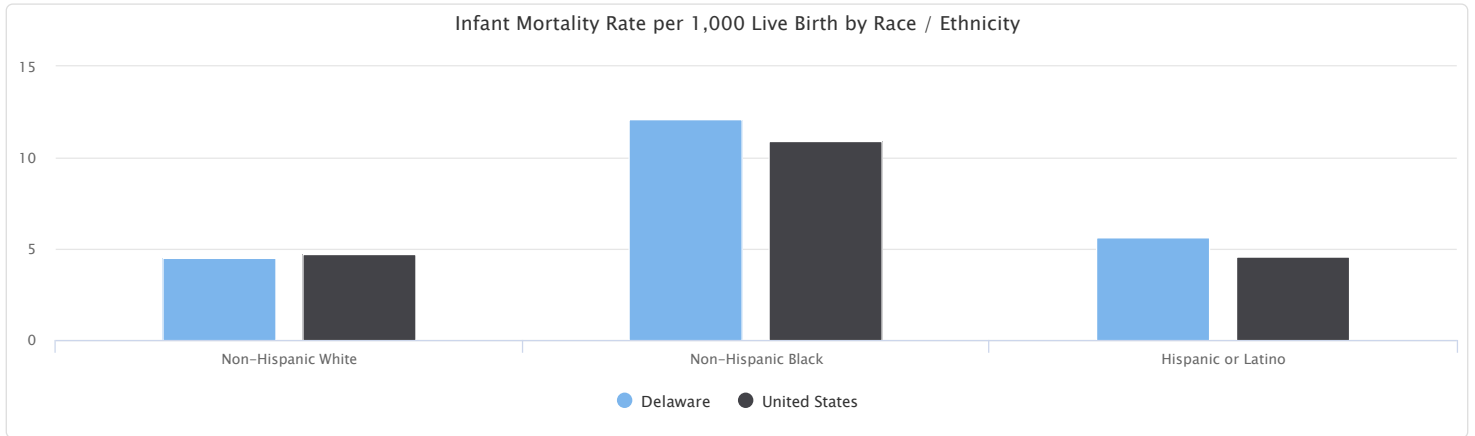

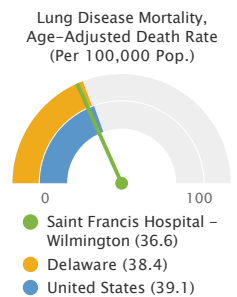

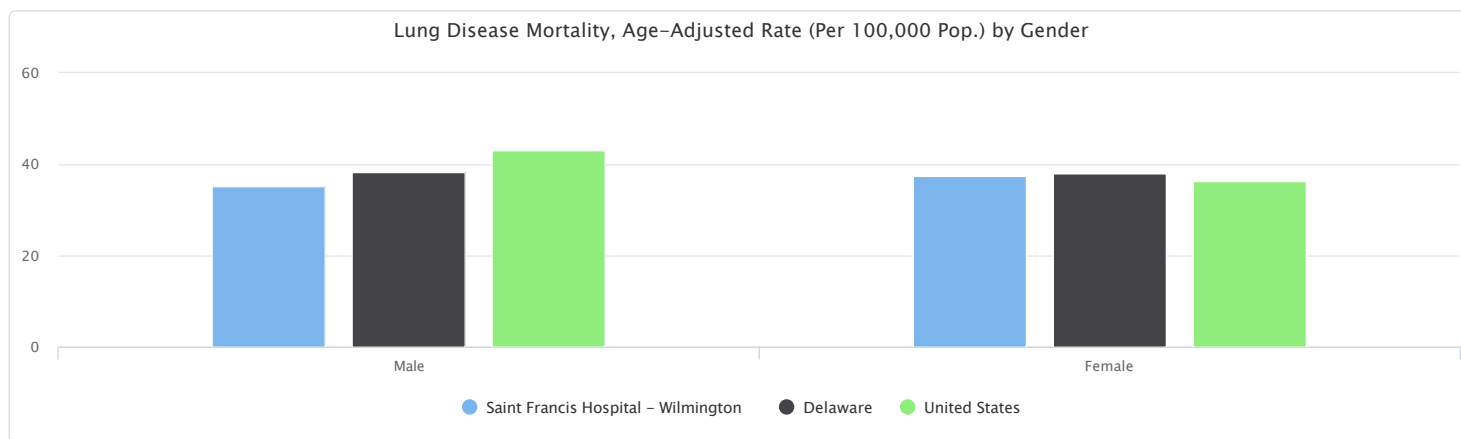
Lung Disease Mortality, Age Adj. Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, CDC NVSS 2016-20

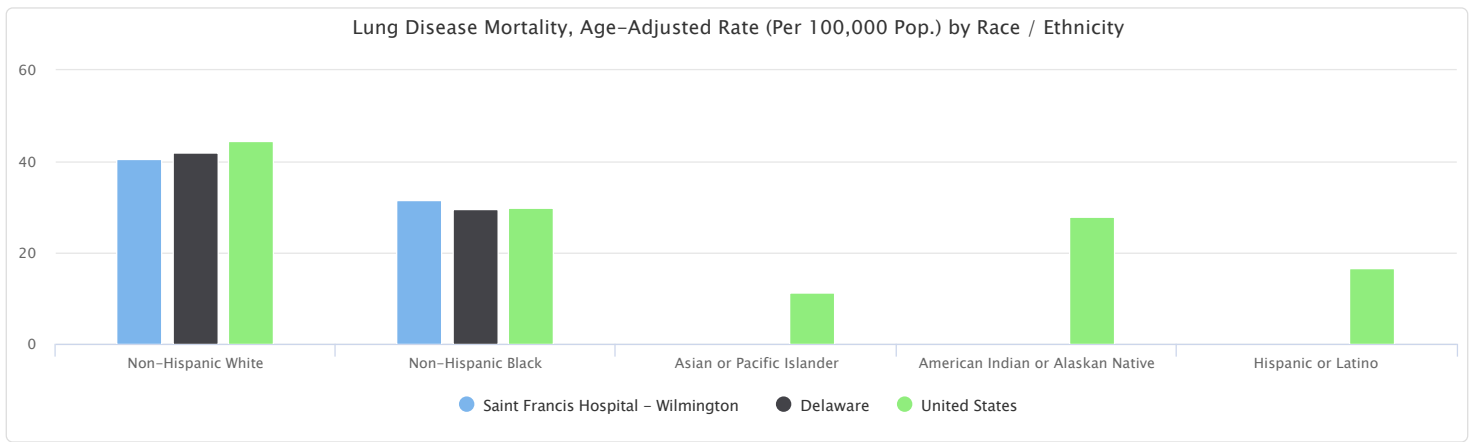

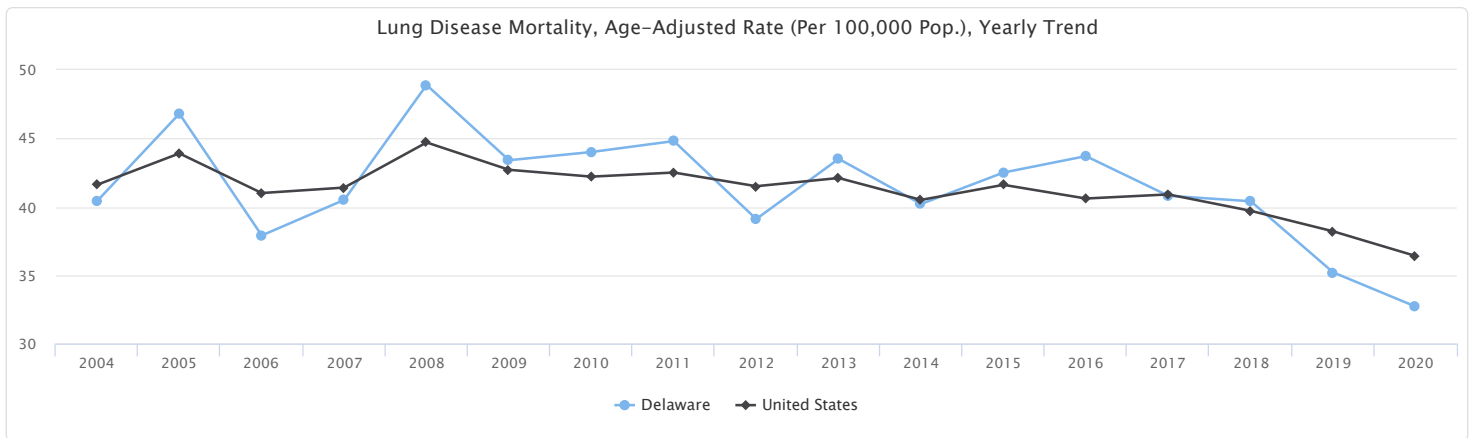

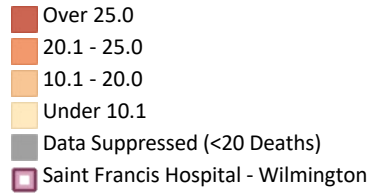

Motor Vehicle Crash Mortality, Age Adj. Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, CDC NVSS 2016-20

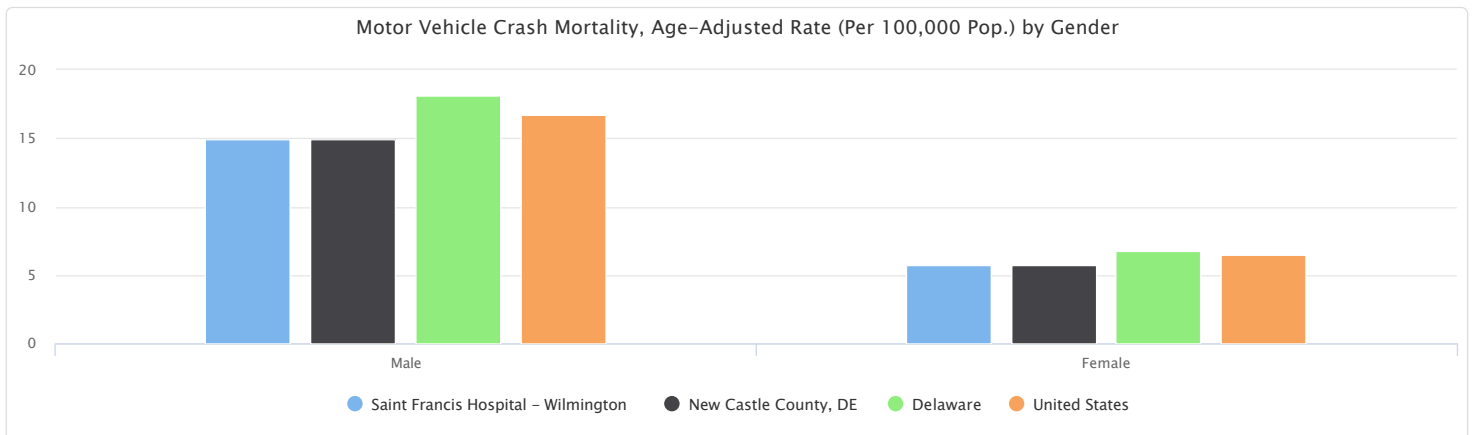

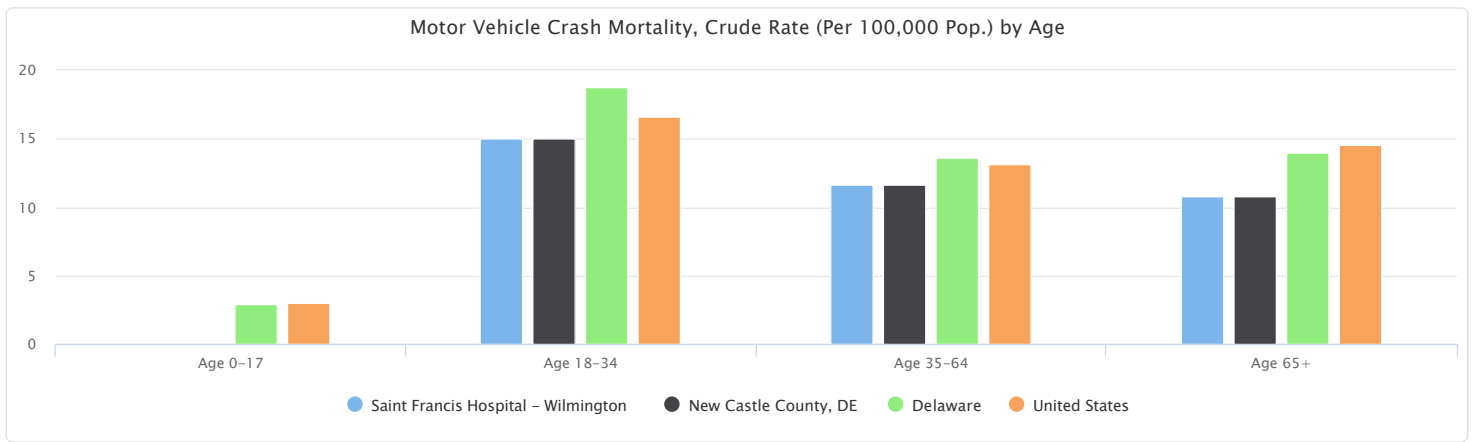

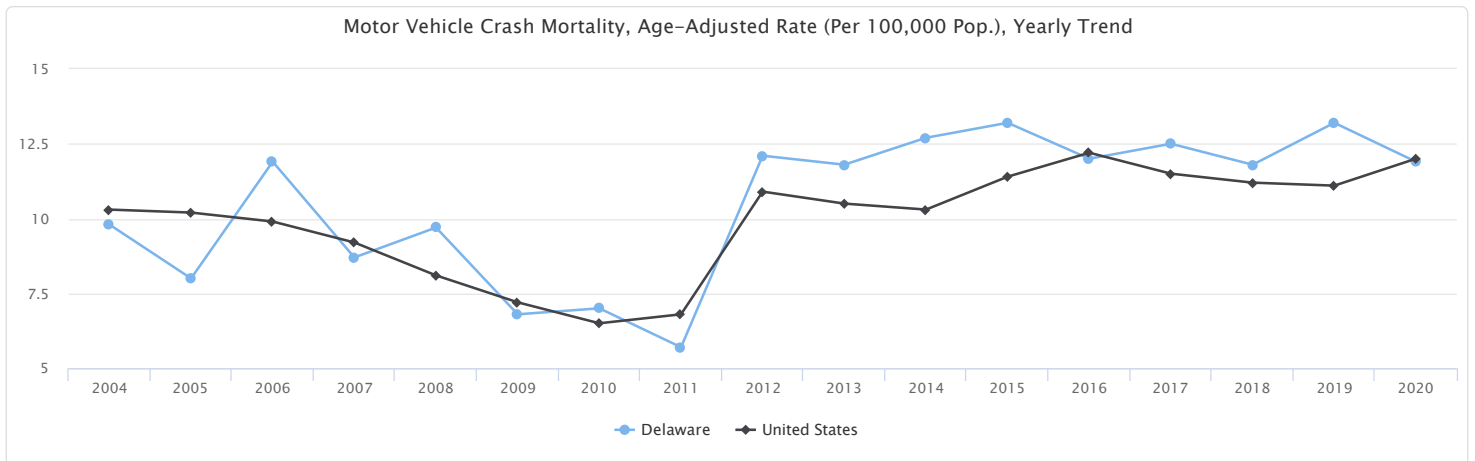

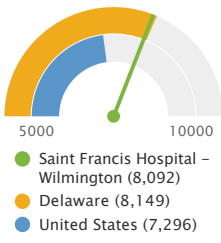

Years of Potential Life Lost, Rate per 100,000 Population

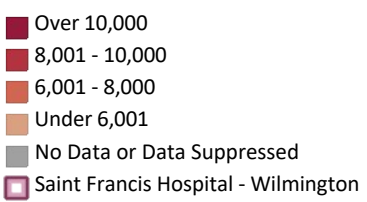

Premature Death (YPLL), Years Lost Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, CDC NVSS 2018-2020

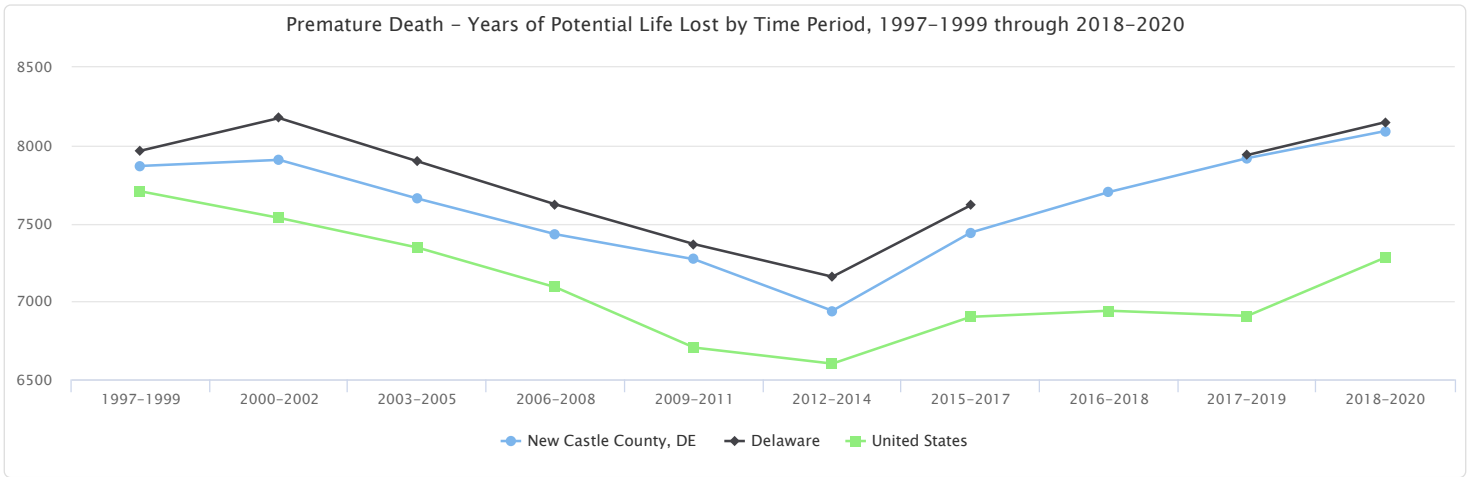

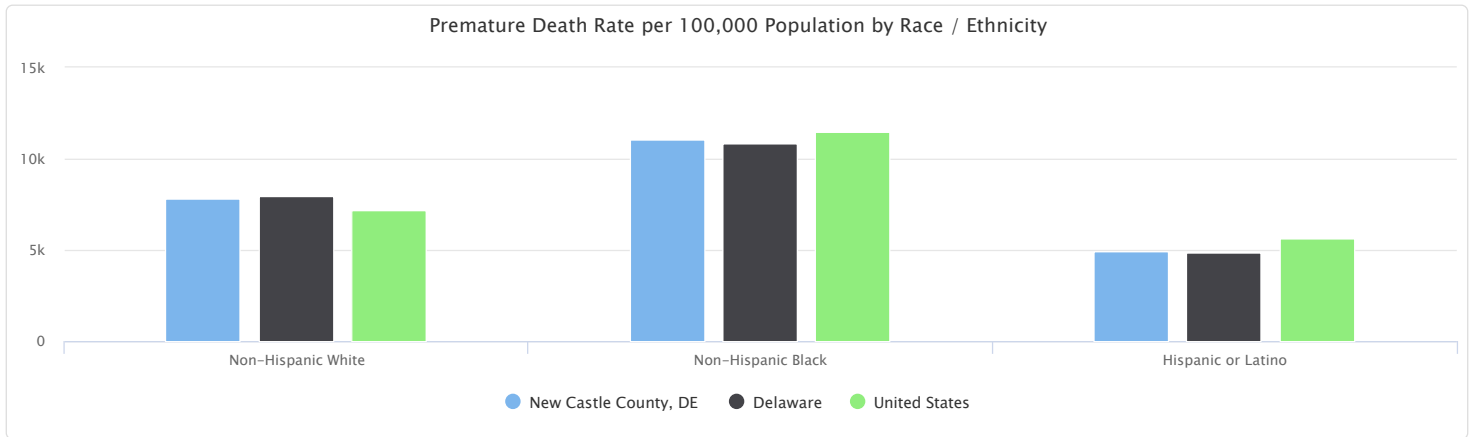

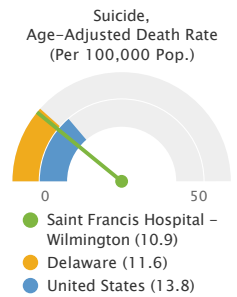

Suicide Mortality, Age Adj. Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, CDC NVSS 2016-20

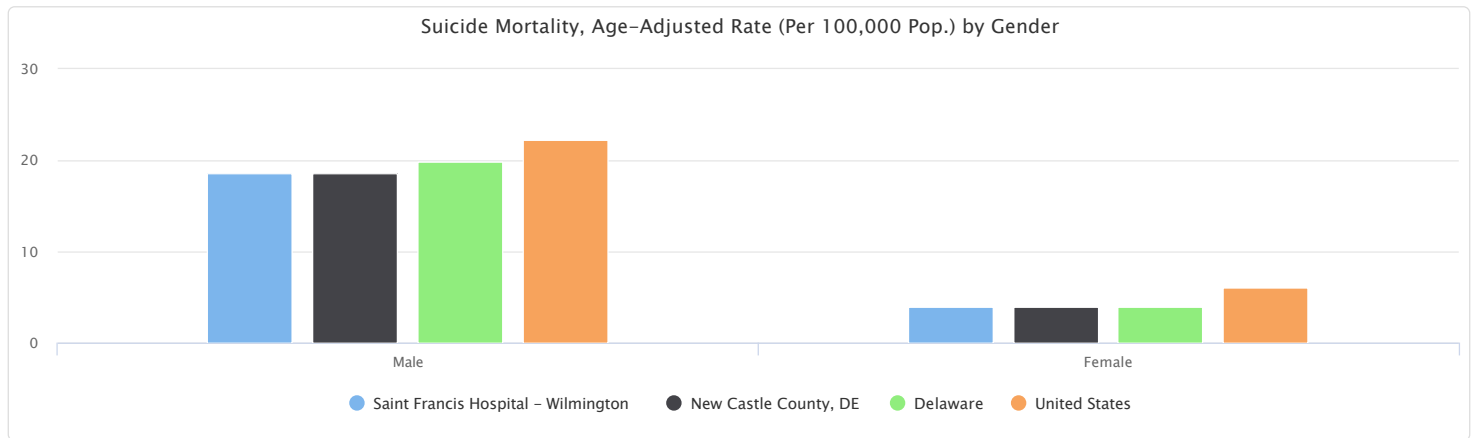

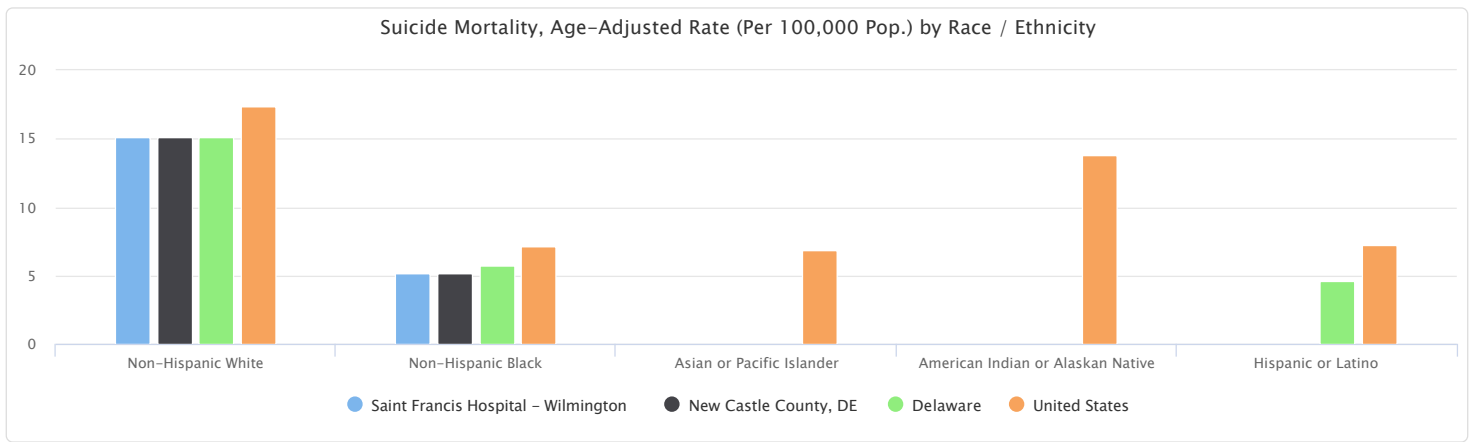

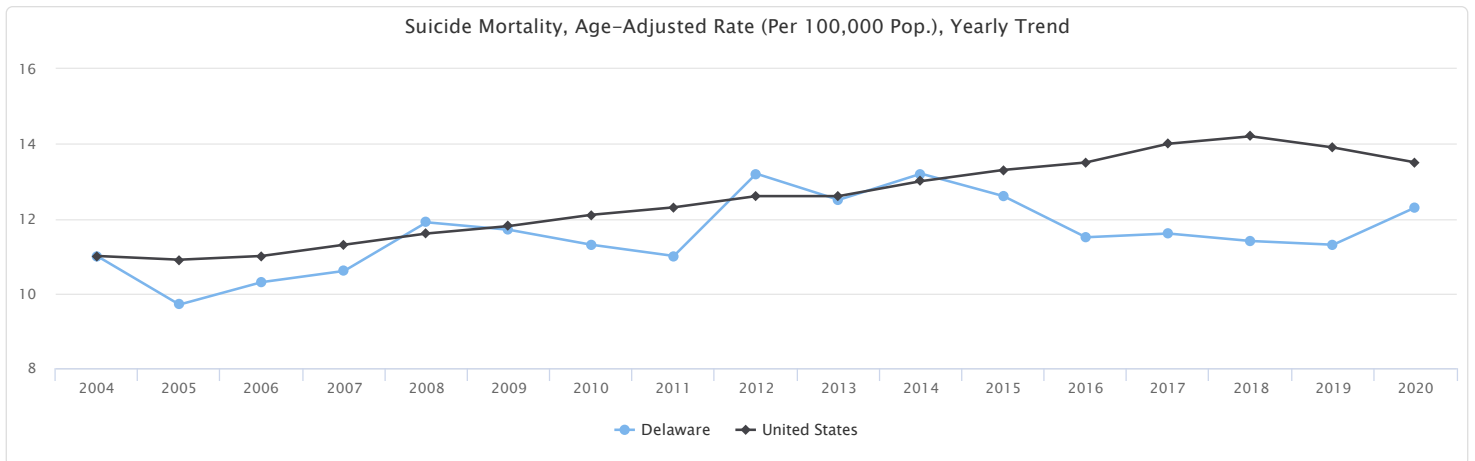

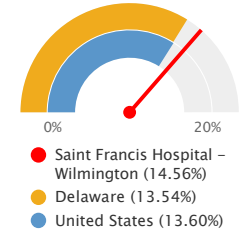

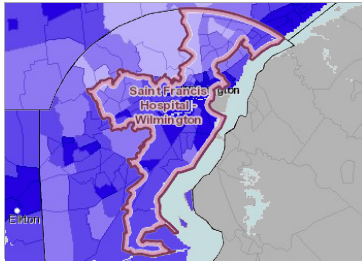

Percentage of Adults Age 18+ with Poor Mental Health



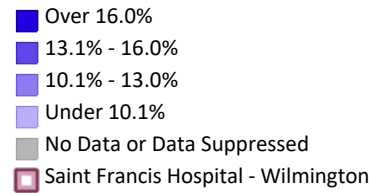

Poor Mental Health, Prevalence Among Adults Age 18+ by Tract, CDC BRFSS PLACES Project 2019



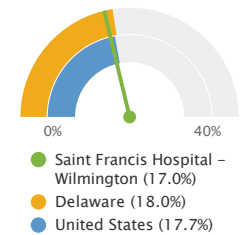

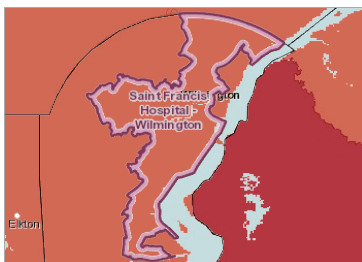

Percentage of Adults with Fair or Poor Health



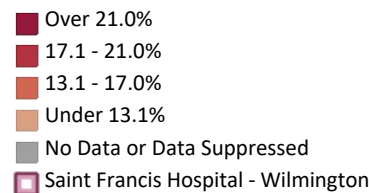

Poor or Fair Health by County, CHR 2022



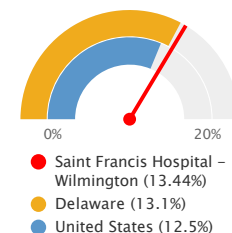

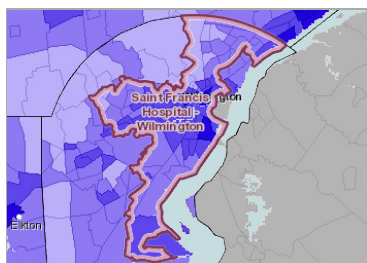

Percentage of Adults Age 18+ with Poor Physical Health



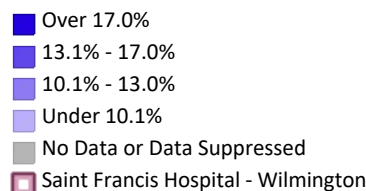

Poor Physical Health, Percentage of Adults Age 18+ by Tract, CDC BRFSS PLACES Project 2019

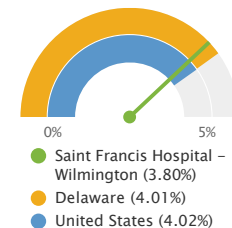

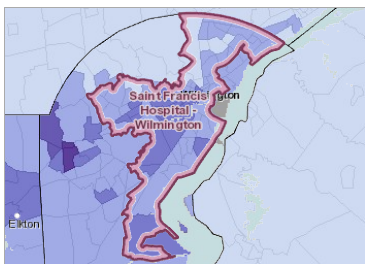

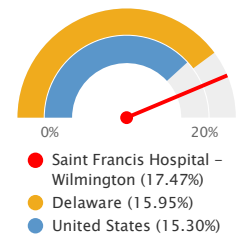

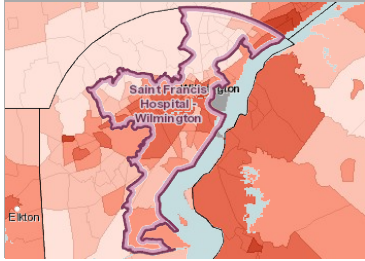

Step 2: Apply the ‘PEARL’ test - Once community health needs have been rated by criteria, the ‘PEARL’ Test will be applied to screen out health needs based on the following feasibility factors:

- **Propriety** – Is a program for the health problem suitable?
- **Economics** – Does it make economic sense to address the problem? Are there economic consequences if a problem is not carried out?
- **Acceptability** – Will a community accept the program? Is it wanted?
- **Resources** – Is funding available or potentially available for a program?
- **Legality** – Do current laws allow program activities to be implemented?

Any community health need that receives an answer of “No” to any of the above factors should be removed or adjusted to ensure that potential community health need meets all five of the feasibility factors.

Step 3: Calculate priority scores and rank community health needs.
