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I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Overview

Nazareth Hospital is a member of Mercy Health System, the largest Catholic healthcare system serving the Delaware Valley and is a part of Trinity Health and sponsored by Catholic Health Ministries. Mercy Health System supports the Delaware Valley with three acute-care hospitals (Nazareth Hospital, Mercy Philadelphia Hospital and Mercy Fitzgerald Hospital), a home healthcare organization, several wellness and ambulatory centers, physician practices, a federal PACE program and a managed care plan.

Established in 1940 by the Sisters of the Holy Family of Nazareth, Nazareth Hospital is located in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and is a 205-bed acute care hospital with 28 skilled nursing beds serving the Northeast Philadelphia community. Nazareth is dedicated to being a transforming, healing presence in the community it serves. The Hospital addresses the diverse health needs of individuals at every stage of life and ensures quality care is available to every patient regardless of their socioeconomic status. This is the core of Nazareth Hospital's Catholic identity and mission.

Nazareth Hospital provides high-quality healthcare services, education and disease prevention programs. Nazareth was named one of America's Best 100 Hospitals for Stroke Care by HealthGrades and is five-star rated for treatment of stroke for eleventh consecutive year. And, Nazareth is an Independence Blue Cross-designated Blue Distinction+ Center® for Knee and Hip Replacement.

Nazareth Hospital's healthcare team has continually demonstrated its commitment to the well-being of the community it serves. Through countless community outreach efforts—free monthly screenings and community health fairs—and alliances with community organizations and leaders, the Hospital impacts the lives of thousands of residents annually.

Vision

As a mission-drive regional health ministry, we will become the recognized leader in improving the health of our communities and each person we serve. We will be known as the most trusted health partner for life.

Mission

We, Mercy Health System and Trinity Health, serve together in the spirit of the Gospel as a compassionate and transforming healing presence within our communities. In fulfilling our mission, we have a special concern for persons who are poor and disadvantaged.

Community Health Needs

Nazareth Hospital is located in Northeast Philadelphia. The hospital's service area comprises eight (8) zip codes (19152, 19136, 19115, 19149, 19114, 19135, 19111, and 19116) in Northeast Philadelphia (2015 population 329,706). The Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) was a one-year process. In 2015, Nazareth Hospital through Mercy Health System collaborated with 11 health systems to contract with the Public Health Management Corporation (PHMC), a private non-profit public health institute. PHMC conducted data collection, research, the identification of health needs in the individual communities, and prepared the CHNA report. (Refer to page 7 for the list of participating health systems.)

Nazareth Hospital's approach to community health need is to focus on responding to those needs that are both documented in the assessment and intersect with its strengths, vision and mission. As described in Section XI. Unmet Needs, the community's 14 unmet healthcare needs were identified based on the analysis of the data and community input. The needs were then prioritized. The prioritization process (refer to Section XII. Prioritization of Unmet Needs) resulted in grouping 11 of the 14 identified healthcare needs into three priorities that address the mission objectives to improve access of health care for the vulnerable population; the clinical objectives to improve health risk behaviors contributing to disease; and, objectives to improve access to screenings and education to both the general and underserved residents of the community. Nazareth Hospital will focus on the following three priorities and associated needs:

- 1. Improve access to healthcare services for persons who are poor and vulnerable.
- 2. Improve access to Mental and Behavioral Health Care.
- 3. Improve Chronic Disease Prevention and Management.

The specific programs and strategies for each of the three priorities will be detailed under the Nazareth Hospital Community Health Implementation Strategy.

Implementation Strategy

Upon confirmation by the governing board of the priorities, Nazareth Hospital is in the process of completing the annual Community Health Implementation Strategy. The implementation strategy is a community benefit approach to address the community health priorities of unmet needs by executing evidence based programs to measure outcomes. The implementation strategy is to be updated on an annual basis.

Governing Board Review

Nazareth Hospital Mission Integration presented the CHNA to its governing board, the Nazareth Hospital Board of Directors. The Nazareth Hospital Board of Directors approved the CHNA findings and priorities on May 24, 2016. In addition, the CHNA was reviewed and confirmed by the Mercy Health System Board of Directors.

Communication

Nazareth Hospital Mission Integration contacted the community representatives to share the results of the CHNA findings, the identified unmet healthcare needs and those needs on which Nazareth Hospital will focus. II.ASSESSMENT

The **purpose** of the needs assessment is to **identify and prioritize community health needs** so that the hospital can develop strategies and implementation plans that benefit the public as well as satisfy the requirements of the Affordable Care Act.

PURPOSE

This report summarizes the results of an assessment of the health status and unmet health care needs of residents of Nazareth Hospital's service area.

- Nazareth Hospital is located in Northeast Philadelphia, and is a part of the Mercy Health System SEPA. The two other Mercy Health System SEPA hospitals are Mercy Fitzgerald Hospital in Darby, PA and Mercy Philadelphia Hospital in West Philadelphia.
- The purpose of this needs assessment is to identify and prioritize community
 health needs so that the hospital can develop strategies and implementation
 plans that benefit the public, as well as satisfy the requirements of the Affordable
 Care Act (ACA).
- The needs assessment was conducted by Public Health Management Corporation, a private non-profit public health institute.

- a definition of the community assessed in the report;
- a description of the previous needs assessment; and,
- the qualifications of PHMC to conduct the assessment.


COMMUNITY DEFINITION

The community (2015 Pop. 329,706) for purposes of this needs assessment was defined as the Zip codes where **80% of Nazareth's inpatient admissions derive**.

Nazareth Hospital (Nazareth), a part of Mercy Health System of SEPA, is a community hospital serving the community of Northeast Philadelphia. With more than 200 inpatient beds, and a host of outpatient services, Nazareth Hospital has a broad range of specialties to meet patients' health care needs. For more than 70 years, Nazareth Hospital has served Northeast Philadelphia and the surrounding region. The mission of Mercy Health System and its parent organization, Trinity Health, is to serve together in the spirit of the Gospel as a compassionate and healing presence within their communities.

NAZARETH HOSPITAL PREVIOUS NEEDS ASSESSMENT IMPACT STATEMENT

The previous 2013 needs assessment was developed using data from PHMC's 2012 Household Health Survey, the U.S. Census, the PA vital statistics, and other information on the health status and health care needs including community meeting of Nazareth's service area residents, public health representatives, service providers, and advocates knowledgeable about community health. The analysis of the data and information identified the needs and the following priority community health needs: (1) improve access to cardiovascular services; (2) Improve access to oncology services; and, (3) Improve access to health care services particularly to persons who are poor and vulnerable.

The priority setting method utilized to determine the community health needs that Nazareth would respond to was the Nominal Group Planning Method where voting and ranking of the needs was determined after group discussions. The specific questions considered for each identified priority healthcare need were:

- Does the healthcare need affect a specific vulnerable population?
- Do existing programs in the community address the healthcare need?
- Does Nazareth Hospital have the capability to address the healthcare need?
- Will the community support intervention to address the healthcare need?
- Will addressing the healthcare need be in alignment with the Nazareth Hospital mission?

Nazareth's previous CHNA Implementation Strategy executed programs to address the specific needs and the measures identified were achieved. The implementation strategy is available on our website at https://www.mercyhealth.org/about/.

Nazareth has not received any public comments since the previous CHNA was adopted. Nazareth has moved forward with augmenting these areas with health education campaigns linked with free screenings and resource education. The following are highlights of the programs developed to meet the identified needs of in the 2013 CHNA:

Priority 1: Improve access to cardiovascular services and achieve targeted outcomes.

Problem: Heart disease is the leading cause of death. Modifiable risk factors can prevent heart disease and stroke.

Provided access to cardiovascular disease education and prevention services that showed an overall increase of participation of 14% over 2013:

- In FY 2014, a total of 6 free cardiovascular disease (CVD) education and prevention awareness events were provided (exceeded target); 4 events were held in FY 2015 (target met); and 4 events have been held to date in FY 2016. The total number of persons participating in these educational events was 269.
- In FY 2014, 463 free Basic CVD assessments were provided exceeded target) and 2 free Comprehensive risk assessment sessions were held for "at-risk" adults (achieved target). FY 2015 efforts resulted in 106 Basic CVD assessments (exceeded target) and 2 Comprehensive risk assessment sessions were provided (target met); in FY 2016 to date, 355 Basic assessments have been offered.
- In FY 2014, a nutrition and exercise tracking program was developed and piloted (target achieved), with an additional session completed in FY 2015 (target met); 2 sessions have been held to date in FY 2016. The total number of participants in these programs was 110 persons.

Priority 2: Improve access to oncology services and achieve targeted outcomes.

Problem: Cancer is the second leading cause of death. Early detection can increase survival rates.

Provide access to cancer prevention services that showed an overall increase of participation of 10% over 2013:

- In FY 2014, 7 free cancer sessions were provided (exceeded target) to promote cancer awareness in the areas of lung, breast, melanoma, and colon cancer; 6 additional sessions on these topics in FY 2015; and 2 events have been held to date in FY 2016. The total number of participants in these sessions was 239 persons.
- A lung cancer risk assessment tool was developed in FY 2014 (achieved target) and a risk assessment session was offered in FY 2015 (target met) in which low dose risk assessments were provided for 10 persons.
- In FY 2014, 50 free melanoma screenings were provided (target met) and an additional 50 screenings were provided in FY 2015 (achieved target).
- A calendar for quarterly cancer presentations was developed and made available to the public in FY 2014 (target achieved); it was determined in FY 2015 that the hospital's Cancer Support Group is the better forum for identifying and addressing needs of persons with cancer.

Priority 3: Improve access to health care services particularly to persons who are poor and vulnerable.

Problem: Achieve access to preventive services to help diminish disparities among the poor and vulnerable.

Provide access to disease prevention information and services that showed an overall increase of participation of 18% over 2013:

- In FY 2014, a total of 223 free health risk assessments (194 blood pressure screenings and 29 arthritis and osteoporosis screenings were provided for poor, vulnerable and homeless persons (exceeded target); 377 free assessments (362 blood pressure screenings and 15 arthritis and osteoporosis screenings) for this same targeted group were provided in FY 2015 (exceeded target); to date in FY 2016, 150 assessments have been offered.
- A community services resource list was completed to aid hospital personnel and local organizations in referring poor, vulnerable and homeless persons to needed services (target met). The list was reviewed, revised and distributed in FY 2015 (target met). A new Nazareth Hospital Senior Resource Directory was completed in August of 2015.
- In FY 2014, 2 free educational sessions on the topics of "Frostbite" and "Infection Prevention and Hygiene" were provided for participants of the Holmesburg United Methodist Church (HUMC) King's Kitchen, a local soup kitchen (target met). 2 additional educational sessions on "Nutrition" and "Healthy Eating" were presented in FY 2015 (target met).
- In FY 2014 and FY 2015, 2 successful food and clothing drives were held (targets met). A clothing collection drive was held in the 2nd Quarter of FY 2016 to aid persons discharged from the Nazareth Hospital Emergency Department who are in need of clothing and to provide new hats, socks and gloves for persons at the HUMC soup kitchen. A food collection drive was held in the 3rd Quarter of FY 2016 to benefit the St. Jerome Church Emergency Food Bank and the HUMC Food Pantry (target met).

SUMMARY OF COACH INITIATIVE

The Collaborative Opportunities to Advance Community Health (COACH) initiative is a community health collaborative sponsored by the Hospital and Healthsystem Association of Pennsylvania (HAP) to bring together hospitals, public health, and community partners to address community health issues in Southeastern Pennsylvania. The collaborative launched in September 2015 with 8 health systems and public health stakeholders (including U.S. Department of Health & Human Services, Region III; the Philadelphia Department of Public Health; and the Montgomery County Department of Health) to begin the process of identifying a community health issue to address collaboratively. Since launch, COACH members have agreed on a collaborative model, discussed strategies for collective action, and identified criteria for prioritizing health needs to address. Early in 2016, the collaborative identified the specific community health needs to address and will develop implementation strategies toward improving those needs. The needs that COACH will address are (1) Chronic Disease prevention/management; and, (2) Mental Health. Both are aligned with the needs that Nazareth Hospital will address.

COACH health system participants include Aria Health, the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, Einstein Healthcare Network, Holy Redeemer Health System, Jefferson Health (including Abington Jefferson Health), Mercy Health System, Temple Health, and the University of Pennsylvania Health System.

PUBLIC HEALTH MANAGEMENT CORPORATION QUALIFICATIONS

PHMC uses best practices **to improve community health** through direct service, partnership, innovation, policy, research, technical assistance, and a prepared workforce.

Public Health Management Corporation (PHMC) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation that was founded in 1972 to address problems in the organization and delivery of health and social services. PHMC is a public health institute that creates and sustains healthier communities and envisions a healthy community for all.

In 2013, PHMC completed 28 Community Health Needs Assessments for Southeastern Pennsylvania non-profit hospitals, and has been assessing the health needs of the community since 1972. For a comprehensive list of completed assessments, see Appendix A.

- PHMC's Community Health Data Base is uniquely qualified to provide comprehensive services to not-for-profit hospitals. It is the only public health institute in Pennsylvania, has many years' experience collaborating with health care stakeholders, and can facilitate the participation of these diverse groups as required by the ACA.
- PHMC staff members are public health experts who have conducted many services over the past twenty years for hospitals, health departments, foundations, and other non-profits.

PHMC's qualifications also include developing and maintaining the Southeastern Pennsylvania Community Health Data Base (www.CHDBdata.org).

 The CHDB provides an unmatched set of information on local community health needs that can be used to develop focused findings supported by reliable data.
 These data can also be used in developing priorities and rationales for strategic plans that are ACA compliant.

The biennial SEPA Household Health Survey collects information on more than 13,000 residents (children, adults, and seniors) living in the five-county SEPA region. The survey is the longest running community health survey in the United States, as well as one of the largest regional surveys of its kind.

Francine Axler and Lisa R. Kleiner are the co-directors of this Community Health Needs Assessment.

Francine Axler, Executive Director, Community Health Data Base. Since 1989, Francine has been actively involved in the field of public health and health promotion, specifically in the collection and dissemination of health status, health behaviors, and utilization of health services data for residents of Southeastern Pennsylvania. Francine is particularly focused on teaching health and human service providers how to utilize community level health data to develop needed, effective and targeted health promotion programs for vulnerable populations. Francine directs PHMC's Community Health Data Base. She has a degree in sociology and a graduate degree in public health education.

Lisa Kleiner, Manager of Operations, Community Health Data Base. For the past twenty-eight years, Lisa has worked on a broad range of evaluation, research, and technical assistance projects. Lisa has conducted and coordinated over 50 population and community needs assessments focusing on older adults, racial/cultural minorities, persons with behavioral health needs, homeless families, maternal and child health and other at-risk groups and communities. In addition to this expertise, Lisa has provided training and technical assistance to over 200 organizations to enable them to build their capacity to define and measure program outcomes and impact, tailoring the technical assistance to the specific needs of the organization and staff. Lisa has a law degree and a graduate degree in social work.

III. PROCESS AND METHODS

The five steps in the needs assessment process were:

- 1. defining the community;
- 2. identifying existing primary and secondary data and data needs;
- 3. collecting primary and secondary data;
- 4. analyzing data; and
- 5. preparing a written narrative report.

Additional hospital and geographic specific data are supplied in the Appendices to allow the Mercy Health System hospitals to further target community health needs. The data acquisition and analysis, community representatives, and information gaps are described in more detail below.

DATA ACQUISITION AND ANALYSIS

Both primary and secondary and quantitative and qualitative data were obtained and analyzed for this needs assessment.

 Obtaining information from multiple sources, known as triangulation, helps provide context for information and allows researchers to identify results which are consistent across more than one data source.

Quantitative information from:

- the 2013 American Community Survey, and 2015 and 2020 Nielsen-Claritas Pop-Facts;
- Pennsylvania Health Department vital statistics on births, deaths, communicable diseases, and cancer incidence (2008-2012 and 2009-2012);
- PHMC's 2015 Southeastern Pennsylvania Household Health Survey;
- 2015 County Health Roadmaps & Rankings for Bucks, Delaware, Montgomery, and Philadelphia Counties; and
- The PA State Health Care Innovation Plan (2013).

Data analyzed for the hospitals' service area using the Statistical Program for Social Sciences (SPSS).

Frequency distributions were produced for variables for multiple years of data so trends over time could be identified and described. In addition, for Household Health Survey measures, tests of significance were conducted comparing the service area to the HHS for Southeastern Pennsylvania to objectively identify and prioritize unmet needs. In addition, quantitative data for each service area from the HHS was compared to health objectives for the United States from HP 2020, the PA State Health Care Innovation Plan (2013), and to data collected for Pennsylvania from the Center for Communicable Diseases' 2014 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey.

Qualitative information. PHMC also collaborated with Nazareth Hospital to identify individuals living and/or working in the communities in the hospital's service area who could provide input on the needs assessment as community members, public health experts, and as leaders or persons with knowledge of underserved racial minorities, low income residents, and/or the chronically ill. The hospital and PHMC worked together to obtain meeting venues, contact potential participants, and encourage attendance.

- Meeting participants were not compensated.
- Participants who could not attend were invited to send written comments, and these were incorporated into the report.
- Input from the community meeting participants, including county and local health department officials and public health experts, was used to further identify and prioritize unmet needs, local problems with access to care, and populations with special health care needs.

Qualitative information from the community meetings was analyzed by identifying and coding themes common to participants, and also themes that were unique.

• This information was organized into major topic areas related to health status, access to care, special populations, and unmet needs.

These data sources are described in more detail in the next section.

The information from this needs assessment will be used by the hospital to develop a community health implementation plan.

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PHMC SOUTHEASTERN PENNSYLVANIA HOUSEHOLD HEALTH SURVEY

A total of **860 interviews were conducted with adults** residing in the hospital's service area, including 227 adults age 60 and over and 294 households with a selected child under the age of 18.

Nazareth received input on the needs of the community, including the medically underserved, low-income, and minority populations from PHMC's 2015 Southeastern Pennsylvania Household Health Survey. The survey questionnaire examines health status and utilization of, and access to, health care among adults and children in the five-county area of Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery and Philadelphia Counties.

- The survey was conducted through telephone interviews with people 18 years of age and older living in 10,018 households in Southeastern Pennsylvania. Of this total sample of 10,018 adults, 860 adult survey respondents lived in Nazareth's service area and participated in the survey. These 860 households also included 227 adults age 60 and over and 294 households with at least one child under the age of 18.
- A total of 2,009 cell phone interviews were conducted with adults in the five county area. Cell phone respondents received the same survey questionnaire as landline respondents.

The survey includes many questions that have been administered and tested in national and local health surveys:

- National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) for the National Health Interview Survey (NHIS);
- The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey (BRFSS);
- The California Women's Health Survey;
- The Social Capital Community Benchmark Survey (Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University); and
- The Survey on Childhood Obesity (Kaiser Family Foundation/San Jose Mercury News).

Households in each of the five counties were selected to guarantee representation from all geographic areas and from all population subgroups. When needed, the interviews were conducted in Spanish.

The survey was administered for PHMC by Abt/SRBI, Inc., a research firm in New York City, between December 2014 and March 2015.

The final sample of interviews is representative of the population in each of the five counties so that the results can be generalized to the populations of these counties. Within each selected household with more than one eligible adult, the Last Birthday Method was used to select the adult who last had a birthday as the respondent for the interview (with the exception of the cell phone sample).

- In households with children, the child under age 18 who most recently had a birthday was selected as the subject of the child interview.
- The survey incorporates over-samples of people ages 60-74 and 75 and older to provide a sufficient number of interviews for separate analyses of the responses of people in these subgroups.

Information from the survey was analyzed for the community as a whole and for the uninsured, medically underserved, poor, ethnic and racial minorities, children, and older adults. The results of the survey were taken into account in identifying the size and location of these medically underserved populations, their unmet health care needs, and any barriers they encounter to accessing services. Priorities among these needs were established by comparing the results of the 2015 HHS to Health People 2020 benchmarks, existing resources, and the hospital's existing programs and mission.

U.S. CENSUS

This report includes data on the characteristics of the hospital's service area residents and residents of Montgomery and Philadelphia Counties for the years 2013, 2015 and 2020. Data from the 2010 U.S. Census, estimates from the 2013 and 2015 American Community Survey, and the Nielsen-Claritas Pop-Facts Database projections for 2020 were also used. The Nielsen-Claritas Pop-Facts Database uses an internal methodology to calculate and project socio-demographic and socioeconomic characteristics for non-census years, relying on the U.S. Census, the Current Population Survey, and the American Community Survey.

VITAL STATISTICS

The most recent information on births, birth outcomes, deaths, cancer, and reportable diseases and conditions for residents of the hospitals' service area, Montgomery County, and Philadelphia was obtained from the Pennsylvania Department of Health, Bureau of Health Statistics and Research.

- Five year (2009-2012) annualized average rates for natality and four year (2008-2012) annualized average rates for mortality and cancer incidence were calculated by PHMC.
- Mortality rates were age-adjusted using the Direct Method and the 2000 U.S. standard million population.

The denominators for all 2008-2012 and 2009-2012 vital statistics rates for the county and state were interpolated from the 2010 U.S. Census and the 2015 American Community

Survey. The number of women ages 15-44 and ages 15-17 was also interpolated from the 2010 US Census and 2015 American Community Survey.

2015 COUNTY HEALTH RANKINGS & ROADMAPS

The County Health Rankings measure the health of nearly all counties in the nation and rank them within states. The Rankings are compiled using county-level measures from a variety of national and state data sources. These measures are standardized and combined using scientifically-informed weights.

COMMUNITY MEETINGS AND ITERVIEWS

The hospital solicited and took into account input from persons or organizations that represent the broad interests of the community it serves, including:

- Local city and county health departments from each of the five counties in SEPA;
- Members and/or representatives of medically underserved, low-income, and minority populations; and
- Written comments received on the most recent service and Implementation Strategy.

Mercy Health System and Nazareth Hospital solicited and took into account input from persons or organizations that represent the broad interests of the community it serves. In general, input was received on the unmet health care needs, existing health care resources, and special needs of minority and medically underserved populations. The community meeting was guided by a set of written questions that focused on participants' perceptions of the most important physical and behavioral health problems in the area, programs that successfully address these issues, gaps in services, barriers to care, vulnerable and underserved populations, and how to best reach individuals in the community.

This input was solicited from 31 service area community representatives of the medically underserved, low-income, and minority populations in the service area and from the Deputy Health Commissioner of the Philadelphia Department of Public Health.

Potential participants for the meetings were identified by Mercy Health System and Nazareth staff working with PHMC, and invited by mail or electronic mail to attend the meeting.

- The input was received at the community meeting on June 23, 2015 at Wesley Enhanced Living Pennypack Park, located in Northeast Philadelphia, and in interviews with the Deputy Health Commissioner of the Philadelphia Department of Public Health on September 8, 2015.
- Anyone who could not attend was invited to send written comments at any time.

 The input on community needs from the individuals/organizations is included throughout the CHNA analysis to assist in identifying the community needs.

The input from this meeting is summarized in each section of this report, as pertinent.

INFORMATION GAPS

Quantitative information for socioeconomic and demographic information, vital statistics, and health data was available at the ZIP code level for the service area. To fill potential gaps in information, these data were supplemented by detailed information about the service area obtained from community meetings.

IV. SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH

Healthy People 2020¹ defines **social determinants of health** (SDOH) as conditions in the environments in which people live, learn, work, play, worship, and age that affect a wide range of health, functioning, and quality-of-life outcomes and risks. Conditions (e.g., social, economic, and physical) in these various environments and settings (e.g., school, church, workplace, and neighborhood) have been referred to as "place." In addition to the more material attributes of "place," the patterns of social engagement and sense of security and well-being are also affected by where people live.

Healthy People 2020 developed a "place-based" organizing framework, reflecting five key areas of SDOH:

- Economic Stability
- Education
- Social and Community Context
- Health and Health Care
- Neighborhood and Built Environment

We know that poverty limits access to healthy foods and safe neighborhoods and that more education is a predictor of better health. We also know that differences in health are striking in communities with poor SDOH such as unstable housing, low income, unsafe neighborhoods, or substandard education. By applying what we know about SDOH, we can not only improve individual and population health but also advance health equity. Therefore, the next section of the assessment provides information on the many of the social determinants of health for the population living in Nazareth Hospital's service area.

V. COMMUNITY DEMOGRAPHICS

The current population of the Nazareth service area is 329,706. It was 327,621 in 2013 and is predicted to increase to 336,143 in 2020, representing close to a 3% increase in the population from 2013-2020.

AGE

In the Nazareth service area, 18-44 year olds make up more than one-third (37%) of the population (120,811); the size of this age group is predicted to decrease by 2% by 2020.

• In comparison to the Nazareth service area, the 18-44 year old group in Philadelphia makes up a larger percentage of the population (41%) but is predicted to decrease by 1% by 2020.




Figure 1. Age Distribution of the Population, 2015

One in four of Nazareth service area residents (25%) are between the ages of 45-65 (82,876). This percentage has not changed since 2013, but by 2020 is predicted to decrease by 1%.

- The 65+ population (50,983) makes up 16% of the overall population, and is the only age group in the Nazareth service area which has grown since 2013 (1%). It is predicted to increase in size again (1%) by 2020.
- In comparison to the Nazareth service area, adults age 65+ make up 17% of the population of Montgomery County, but only 13% of the Philadelphia population overall.

Children age 0-17 make up 23% of the Nazareth Hospital service area.

RACE/ETHNICITY

The majority of Nazareth service area residents are White (57%).

- Seventeen percent of the population is Black;
- 13% is Latino; and
- 10% is Asian.

This pattern is different than the pattern in Philadelphia as a whole, where 41% of the population is Black, 36% White, 14% Latino, and 7% Asian.

The percentage of Black residents in the Nazareth service area is predicted to decline by 2% by 2020.

• This is the only racial subgroup in the Nazareth service area that is predicted to decline in size during this time period.

The percentage of White residents in the Nazareth service area is predicted to increase by 1% by 2020, which is the opposite of the pattern predicted for Philadelphia as a whole (1% decline in White residents by 2020).

LANGUAGE SPOKEN AT HOME

The overwhelming majority of residents of the Nazareth service area (88%) speak English at home.

- Four percent speak an Asian language, 3% speak Spanish, and 6% speak another language.
 - The Nazareth service area has fewer Spanish speakers (3%) than Philadelphia as a whole (10%).
 - More residents in the Nazareth service area speak English at home (88%) than in Philadelphia overall (79%)


SOCIOECONOMIC INDICATORS

EDUCATION

Almost two-thirds of Nazareth service area residents age 25 and over are high school graduates (65%), and an additional 19% have a college degree or more.

Seventeen percent of residents did not graduate from high school.

The Nazareth service area has a higher percentage of high school graduates (65%) than Philadelphia as a whole (57%), and a smaller proportion of residents with less than a high school degree (17% versus 20%).

• The Philadelphia population as a whole, however, has a greater proportion of residents with a College Degree or higher (24%) than the Nazareth service area (19%).

EMPLOYMENT

The overwhelming majority of residents of the service area age 16+ are employed (86%).


However, 14% are unemployed.

Unemployment has risen by 1% since 2013.

• It is predicted that the unemployment rate will remain relatively stable through 2020.

Unemployment is slightly lower in the Nazareth service area (14%) than in Philadelphia as a whole (16%).

POVERTY


Almost one in three families in the Nazareth service area (32%) is living in poverty. This represents over 17,000 families in poverty.

- This includes one in five families with children (19%) and 13% of families without children living in poverty.
- The poverty rate has grown by 2% since 2013.

Poverty rates are lower in the Nazareth service area compared to rates in Philadelphia as a whole.

• In Philadelphia, 54% of families (32% of families with children and 22% of families without children) live in poverty.

Figure 5. Families in Poverty, 2015





MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME

The median household income in the Nazareth service area is \$44,206.

- This represents a very minimal increase from 2013 when it was \$43,376.
- It is predicted to grow almost 3% to \$46,368 by 2020.

The median household income in the Nazareth service area is higher than the median household income in Philadelphia as a whole (\$36,553).

• Philadelphia is predicted to have a household income growth pattern similar to the Nazareth service area.

HOME OWNERSHIP

The majority of Nazareth service area residents (63%) own their housing. Nearly two in five residents (37%) are renters.

 Home ownership rates in the Nazareth service area are slightly higher than home ownership rates in Philadelphia overall, where 54% of residents own and 46% rent.




Figure 7. Homeownership, 2015

HOMELESSNESS

An estimated 2.3 to 3.5 million Americans experience homelessness each year.² In Pennsylvania, there are an estimated 15,000 homeless persons at any one point in time. Homeless persons are a population with special health care needs. Despite their relatively large numbers, homeless persons are very difficult to reach with health and social services, and suffer from poorer health than the rest of the population. The health problems of homeless people are broad and multidimensional, contributing to excess mortality. Many homeless persons have histories of mental illness and drug and alcohol abuse. In addition, many homeless adults experience significant dental problems and vision impairments. Homeless people also experience poor access to health care, leading to delayed identification of health problems, increased reliance on emergency departments, and higher rates of hospitalization, often for preventable conditions.

National studies have found that many homeless persons report unmet needs for medical or surgical care, prescription medications, mental health care or counseling, eyeglasses, and dental care. The most frequently cited reasons for each type of unmet need were inability to afford care and lack of health insurance coverage.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has established a point-in-time methodology to assess unduplicated sheltered and unsheltered homeless individuals via reports submitted by regional zones called Continuums of Care (CoC). Nazareth Hospital is within the Philadelphia CoC. On the single night of January 29, 2015, there were a total of 4,213 homeless households in the Department of Housing and Urban Development's Philadelphia Continuum of Care (CoC) area.

On that night, there were 2,553 homeless households in emergency shelter, 1,001 in transitional housing, and 659 unsheltered households in the Philadelphia CoC area.³ The total number of homeless persons was 5,998 on that date. This includes 3,333 households without children, and 2,652 with at least one adult and one child in emergency shelter. In addition, there were 13 households with a child without an adult.

The majority of the homeless population of the Philadelphia CoC area is male (3,516) and Black (4,987). Many of the individuals are homeless due to serious chronic physical and mental health conditions or violence. For example, 1,429 of the Philadelphia homeless were severely mentally ill and 1,752 were chronic substance abusers. There were 410 victims of domestic violence and 13 unaccompanied youth under the age of 18.

Despite these health problems, in general it is difficult to provide services and conduct outreach for the transient homeless population. Many homeless men do not have access to the relatively greater amount of services in Center City Philadelphia. The largest shelter is located in Southwest Philadelphia, which makes it hard for homeless persons in West and Southwest Philadelphia to qualify for other services in the City. Without photo identification, they do not qualify for Medical Assistance and are not qualified to receive free or low cost health care services at a City Health Center. In addition, there is little assistance in navigating the publicly-funded health care system for homeless, particularly for underinsured mentally ill adults. These individuals do not get the services and medications they need unless they have a social worker/case manager.

VI. HEALTH OF THE COMMUNITY

The health of a community can be assessed by comparing overall health measures, birth outcomes, self-reported health status and health conditions, communicable disease rates, self-reported health concerns and perceptions, and mortality rates to statewide indicators and HP 2020 goals for the nation.

This section examines information for the Nazareth service area.

COUNTY HEALTH RANKINGS AND ROADMAPS

The County Health Rankings & Roadmaps measures the health of nearly all counties in the nation and ranks them within states. The Rankings are compiled using county-level measures from a variety of national and state data sources. These measures are standardized and combined using scientifically-informed weights. (See Appendix G for the County Health Rankings table)

The Nazareth service area is within the City of Philadelphia, which ranks 67th out of the 67 counties, or last in the state, in health outcomes, and 65th in length of life. It ranks 66th in quality of life.

Philadelphia ranks just as poorly in specific health measures, such as health factors (67^{th}), health behaviors (64^{th}), clinical care (63^{rd}), and social and economic factors that influence health (67th), but it ranks 1st in physical environment, based on the fact that fewer people drive to work, and there are no drinking water violations.

BIRTH OUTCOMES

Birth outcomes for residents of the Nazareth service area generally **do not meet the HP 2020 goals** for the nation, except for White births.

FERTILITY RATES

There are 4,283 births annually to women living in the Nazareth service area.

This represents a fertility rate of 66 per 1,000 women age 15-44.

- This fertility rate is higher than the rate in Philadelphia (64) and Montgomery (60) Counties and the rate in the overall Southeastern Pennsylvania (SEPA) region (60).
- Latina women have the highest fertility rate (86; 738), followed by Black (69; 886) and Asian women (65; 417).
- White women have the lowest fertility rate in the Nazareth service area (55; 2,145).




Figure 9. Fertility Rates for Women 15-44, 2009-



Infants born to teenagers have been associated with a number of negative birth outcomes, including prematurity and low birth weight, making it an important outcome to track.

In the Nazareth service area, the fertility rate of all women age 15-17 is 13 per 1,000, representing an average of 79 births annually.

- The fertility rate for 15-17 year olds in the Nazareth service area (13) is lower than the rate in Philadelphia (31) by more than half, but is still more than double the rate for this age group in Montgomery County (6).
- Latina and Black adolescents aged 15-17 in the Nazareth service area have the highest fertility rates (23) for this age group.
- The fertility rates for these two racial and ethnic groups are far higher than the fertility rates in this area for White (8) adolescents aged 15-17.

Latina adolescents in the Nazareth service area (23) have far lower fertility rates than Latina adolescents in Philadelphia (46), Montgomery County (37), and the entire SEPA region (41).

LOW BIRTH WEIGHT

Low birth weight infants (<2,500 grams or 5lb 8 oz.) are at greater risk for dying within the first year of life than infants of normal birth weight.

In the Nazareth service area, an average of 84 infants per 1,000 live births are low birth weight, representing an average of 360 infants annually.

- This rate does not meet the HP 2020 goal of 78 per 1,000.
- The Nazareth service area low birth weight rate is lower than the Philadelphia rate (109) and the rate for SEPA (91), but higher than the Montgomery County rate (70 per 1,000).

Black infants in the Nazareth service area are almost twice as likely to be low birth weight as White infants (129 versus 68).

- Black (129) and Asian (82) infants in the Nazareth service area do not meet the HP2020 Goal (78) for low birth weight.
- White and Latino/a infants in the Nazareth service area meet the HP 2020 goal for low birth weight.

PREMATURE BIRTHS

There is an average of 419 premature births (less than 37 weeks gestation) annually to women living in the Nazareth service area, representing 10% of all live births.

This is a lower percentage than in Philadelphia (12, representing 2,670 births) and higher than in Montgomery County (8; 739).

Black infants in the Nazareth service area (13%) have the highest rate of prematurity, while Asian infants have the lowest (8%).

The percentage of White infants in the Nazareth service area who are born prematurely (9%) is the same as in Philadelphia and the SEPA region overall (9%), and similar to the percentage of White premature births in Montgomery County (8%).




Figure 12. Percentage of Premature Births, 2009-2012

PRENATAL CARE

Receiving prenatal care during the first trimester of pregnancy can help ensure that health concerns are identified and addressed in a timely manner. A little over one-third of women in the Nazareth service area (36%) receive prenatal care beginning after the first trimester or have no prenatal care.

- This does not meet the HP 2020 goal of 22.1%.
- The percentage in the Nazareth service area is higher than the percentage in Montgomery County (26%), lower than the percentage in Philadelphia (46%) and the same as the percentage in the SEPA region overall (36%).

The percentage of Black women receiving prenatal care beginning after the first trimester or having no prenatal care (47%) is far greater than the percentage of White women (29%) with late prenatal care.

• Second to Black women, Latina (44%) and Asian women (35%) in the Nazareth service area are more likely to receive late or no prenatal care.




Figure 13. Late or No Prenatal Care, 2014-2015

MORTALITY

INFANT MORTALITY

Every year, an average of 30 infants in the Nazareth service area dies before their first birthday.

The Nazareth service area infant mortality rate is 7 infant deaths per 1,000 live births.

• This rate does not meet the HP 2020 target goal of 6 infant deaths per 1,000 live births.

Black infants die at more than three times the rate (17) than any other service area infant.

• White infants die at the second highest rate in the Nazareth service area (6) followed by Latino (5) and Asian (4) infants.

Black infants die at a higher rate in the Nazareth service area than in Philadelphia (13), Montgomery County (16), and the entire SEPA region (13).

 The Black infant mortality rate in the Nazareth service area does not meet the HP 2020 goal.





Figure 14. Infant Mortality Rates by CHNA Area, 2009-2012

MORTALITY

The overall mortality rate in the Nazareth service area is 769 deaths per 100,000 population, representing an average of 3,225 deaths annually.

This rate is lower than the Philadelphia rate, which is 893 per 100,000 (representing 14,009 deaths) and higher than the Montgomery County rate, which is 664 per 100,000 (representing 6,995 deaths).


Cancer is the leading cause of death in the Nazareth service area (186; 733).

This does not meet the HP 2020 goal of 161 deaths per 100,000 population.

The other four leading causes of death in the Nazareth service area are Coronary Heart Disease (135; 592), Accidents (47; 167), Stroke (37; 167), and Diabetes (18; 75).

- The Accident rate in the Nazareth service area (47) is slightly higher than accident rate in Philadelphia as a whole (45), and much higher than the rates in Montgomery County (32) and the SEPA region overall (37).
- The Suicide rate in the Nazareth service area (12) is slightly higher than the rate in Philadelphia (10) and the SEPA regional (11), but is the same as the rate in Montgomery County.

Among all cancers causing death in the Nazareth service area, lung cancer has the highest mortality rate (49; 190), followed by breast (25; 55), prostate (20; 32), and colorectal cancer (17; 68). All of these rates are lower than the rates in Philadelphia as a whole.

- However, with the exception of prostate cancer, all cancer rates in the Nazareth service area are higher than rates in Montgomery County.
- The mortality rate for prostate cancer does not meet the HP 2020 goal (21.8 per 100,000).


MORBIDITY

HIV AND AIDS

The prevalence of HI/AIDS in Philadelphia (46 per 100,000) is the highest in the SEPA region. This represents 2,100 persons in Philadelphia.

- HIV/AIDS rates are lower in Chester (6), Montgomery (6), and Delaware (16) Counties.
- The overall rate of people living with HIV/AIDS in the state of Pennsylvania is 11, representing 4,320 people.


Figure 17. Currently living with HIV/AIDS per 100,000, 2014

In general, rates of sexually transmitted infections are highest in Philadelphia.

The Hepatitis B rate in Delaware County (35 per 100,000) is the highest rate in the region, Philadelphia has the second highest rate (31 per 100,000), and Chester County has the lowest (8 per 100,000). The rate in Montgomery County is 21 per 100,000.

Chlamydia rates in Philadelphia are the highest in the region (1,317 per 100,000), and more than double the Delaware County rate (458 per 100,000). The rate in Montgomery County is 221 per 100,000.

Gonorrhea rates in Philadelphia are the highest in the region (447 per 100,000) followed by Delaware County (115 per 100,000). The rate in Montgomery County is 41 per 100,000.

Syphilis rates continue to be highest in Philadelphia (16), a rate which is eight times higher than the next highest rate in Delaware County (2). Montgomery County has the same rate as Delaware County (2).

Philadelphia has the highest Chicken Pox rate in the region (14); the second highest rate is in Bucks County (10), followed by Montgomery County (7).

Chester County has the highest rate for Lyme disease (134 per 1,000 population), followed by Bucks (75), Montgomery (44), and Delaware Counties (19), and Philadelphia (9).

All five counties have similar rates of pertussis (whooping cough), ranging from a high of 19 per 1,000 population in Delaware County to a low of 9 in Philadelphia.

HEALTH STATUS


A **majority** of adults in the service area describe their health as excellent, very good or good


SELF-REPORTED HEALTH STATUS

Self-reported health status is one of the best indicators of population health. This measure has consistently shown to correlate very strongly with mortality rates.⁴

About eight in ten Nazareth service area adults (82%) are in excellent, very good, or good health. This is a higher percentage than for Philadelphia as a whole (78%), and lower than for the SEPA region (84%) and Montgomery County (87%).

• One in five adults in the Nazareth service area (20%) is in fair or poor health. This represents approximately 49,600 adults.





Three percent of children in the Nazareth service area (2,500 children) are in fair or poor health; this is lower than in the surrounding SEPA region.


Figure 20. Children 0-17 in Fair or Poor Health by CHNA Areas, 2015

In the Nazareth service area, about 22,100 older adults 60+ are in fair or poor health (31%), which is comparable to Philadelphia and worse than both Montgomery County (17%) and SEPA as a whole (21%).

Three in ten older adults in the service area, 31%, or about 22,200 adults, have at least one limitation in the Instrumental Activities of Daily Living (IADLs).

About 15%, or 10,900 adults, have at least one limitation in the Activities of Daily Living (ADLs).


Instrumental Activities of Daily Living (IADLs)

SPECIFIC HEALTH CONDITIONS


High blood pressure, diabetes, asthma, cancer, and mental health conditions are chronic illnesses that require ongoing care.

Representatives from the Philadelphia Department of Public Health (PDPH) indicated that the most serious health problems in Philadelphia are: 1) the health of women and infants; 2) safe sex and reproductive health for teenagers; 3) chronic disease, including causes such as smoking poor diet, and lack of physical activity; and 4) indoor and outdoor environmental issues that impact health.

HYPERTENSION

Nearly three in ten adults in the Nazareth service area (28%, or 86,300 adults) have been diagnosed with high blood pressure.

- Six in ten older adults age 60+ in the service area (60%, or about 42,500) have been diagnosed with high blood pressure.
- This does not meet the Healthy People 2020 goal of 27%.

Among adults with high blood pressure in the service area, 8% report not taking all or nearly all of their medication all of the time.

DIABETES

About 37,400 adults in the Nazareth service area (15%) have been diagnosed with Type II diabetes.

- This is the same as Philadelphia as a whole (15%), and higher than in Montgomery County (11%) and SEPA overall (13%).
- More than one-quarter of older adults in the Nazareth service area (28%) have diabetes; this represents 19,900 older adults.





Figure 24. Diabetes, Adults 18+ by CHNA Areas , 2015

ASTHMA

In the Nazareth service area, about 39,600 adults (16%) have been diagnosed with asthma.

Nearly one in five children (18%) has been diagnosed with asthma; this
represents 13,000 children in the Nazareth service area, and is
comparable with childhood asthma rates in SEPA overall.

OVERWEIGHT AND OBESITY

Overweight and obesity are strongly correlated with high blood pressure, diabetes, cancer, heart disease, and asthma.

The Healthy People 2020 goal for obesity is 30.6% of adults age 20 and older. The Nazareth service area does not meet this goal.

About 9,400 children in the Nazareth service area (20%) are classified as obese, and 22% are overweight.





Figure 27. Obese and Overweight Children (0-17), 2015

MENTAL AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

Approximately 39,600 adults in the service area, 16%, have been diagnosed with a mental health condition.

• Of those with a mental health condition, 37% are not receiving treatment for the condition.

About 14,000 older adults age 60+ in the Nazareth service area (21%) have four or more signs of depression on the CES-D 10 Item Depression Scale.

• This is higher than in Philadelphia (18%), Montgomery County (7%) and across SEPA (12%).

About 1,500 older adults in the Nazareth service area report speaking to friends or relatives less than once a week.

Attendees at the community meeting noted that depression was a particular issue among older adults, but that awareness of mental health services is lacking.

VII. ACCESS TO CARE

Having a regular source of care, a person residents can go to if they are sick or have a question about their health, is important as people who have a regular source of care are more likely to seek care when they are sick compared with those who do not. This allows people to receive earlier, less expensive treatment, get well sooner, and prevents costly complications and longer illnesses.

Community meeting attendees listed accessibility as the one health care issue that people in the Northeast should be most concerned about.

ECONOMIC BARRIERS

With or without health insurance, 31,200 adults in the Nazareth service area were unable to get needed care due to the cost of that care; 12% of adults reported that there was a time in the past year when they needed healthcare, but did not receive it due to the cost.

About 41,300 adults in the Nazareth service area (16%) were prescribed a medication but did not fill the prescription in the past year due to cost.

Attendees at the community meeting noted that the cost of prescription drugs is leading to reduced adherence to medication regimens, and that health literacy around prescription drugs was a concern.




Figure 30. Cost Barriers to Care, Adults, 2015

HEALTH INSURANCE STATUS

Community meeting attendees noted changes in Medicaid processes and a lack of coordination between health care providers and social services as factors that complicate care for many in the service area.

Having health insurance and a regular place to go when sick are important in ensuring continuity of care over time. The Nazareth service area does not meet the Healthy People 2020 goal of 100% coverage.


 The overwhelming majority of adults (91%) in the service area have health insurance coverage.

However, a number of adults aged 18-64 do not have any private or public health insurance;

- 9% of adults aged 18-64 in the service area are uninsured, representing 19,200 uninsured adults.
- This is a higher percentage than in Montgomery County (5%), lower than Philadelphia (12%), and comparable to SEPA as a whole, where 9% of adults are uninsured.


About four in ten adults in the Nazareth service area (42% or about 22,100) have enrolled in health insurance plans through the Federal Marketplace since 2013.

Nearly one in five adults in the service area (19%, or 48,300 adults) does not have prescription drug coverage.

PRIMARY CARE

Attendees at the community meeting pointed out the long wait times at health centers, making it difficult for all of those looking for care to get what they need. In addition, they described overuse of emergency departments as a result of limited access to primary care.

Having a regular source of care is important since people who have a regular source of care are more likely to seek care when they are sick compared with those who do not. In the Nazareth service area, 18% of adults (about 44,200 adults) do not have a regular source of primary care they can consult if they are ill or have a question about their health. The service area meets the Healthy People 2020 goal, with less than 26.1% of adults having no regular source of care.

• Approximately 6,300 children in the service area (9%) do not have a regular source of care.




Figure 33. No Regular Source of Care, Adults, 2015

PREVENTIVE CARE


Regular health screenings can help identify health problems before they start. Early detection can improve chances for treatment and cure and help individuals to live longer, healthier lives. In the Nazareth service area, 13 % of adults did not visit a health care provider in the past year; this percentage represents 32,600 adults.

The following screenings have been recommended for preventive health for adults. As described below, many in the service area are not accessing these services.

DENTAL VISIT

More than one-third of adults in the service area (38% or about 97,300 adults) did not have a dental visit during the past year. This is lower than Philadelphia (41%), but higher than both Montgomery County (26%) and SEPA as a whole (32%). About 12,900 children in the service area (17%) did not have a dental visit during the past year.

BLOOD PRESSURE

About 26,400 adults in the service area (11%) did not have a blood pressure test in the past year. This is slightly higher than in the surrounding area.

COLONOSCOPY

Regular screenings beginning at age 50 are recommended to prevent colorectal cancer. About one-third of adults 50 years of age and older in the service area (32%) did not have a colonoscopy in the past ten years. Screening rates in the Nazareth service area are slightly lower than the surrounding counties. The percentage of those screened in the Nazareth service area (68%) meets the PA State Health Care Innovation Plan target of 66.5% of all adults 50-75 being screened by 2019.

PSA OR RECTAL EXAMS FOR PROSTATE CANCER

Half of men aged 45 years and older in the Nazareth service area (51%) did not have a screening for prostate cancer in the past year. Across the SEPA region, 49% of men were unscreened, while in Philadelphia and Delaware Counties 55% and 48% of men were unscreened, respectively.

MAMMOGRAM

The US Preventive Service Task Force recommends mammograms for women aged 50 to 74. The Healthy People 2020 goal for screening mammography is 81.1% of age appropriate women screened. This service area does not meet this goal.

About one in five women aged 50-74 did not have a mammogram in the past two years, representing 21% or about 12,500 women. This represents slightly lower screening rates than in Montgomery County (16% unscreened), Philadelphia (17% unscreened), and is comparable to the SEPA region (20% unscreened).

PAP SMEAR TEST

The Healthy People 2020 goal for cervical cancer screenings is 93% of women screened according to the most recent guidelines. The Nazareth service area does not meet this goal. Approximately 20,100 women aged 21 to 65 in the service area (19%) did not receive a Pap test in the past three years. This worse than SEPA, Philadelphia, and Montgomery Counties; in all three areas about 13% of women are unscreened.

VIII. HEALTH BEHAVIORS

Community meeting attendees described the far-reaching effects of poor nutrition, both on physical health status and mental and behavioral health. They listed nutrition as a critical health problem for the community. In addition, they discussed a lack of nutrition education for young people.

NUTRITION

According to the USDA's MyPlate food guidelines, adults should eat 4-5 servings of fruits and vegetables daily.⁵

In the Nazareth service area, 82% of adults do not reach this recommended goal. This is comparable to Philadelphia (81%), and worse than both Montgomery County (73%) and SEPA as a whole (77%). However, the 18% of adults who do eat 5 or more servings of fruit or vegetables per day do meet the PA State Health Care Innovation Plan target of 16.3% by 2019.

Fast foods are often high in unhealthy calories, saturated fats, sugar, and salt. About four in ten adults in the service area (39% or about 99,600 adults) report eating fast food in the past week.

Attendees at the community meeting cited cultural shifts that keep children indoors, reducing physical activity.

EXERCISE

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' 2008 Physical Activity Guidelines for Americans recommends that adults (ages 18-64) get 2.5 hours of moderate aerobic physical activity each week.⁶

One-quarter of adults in the service area (25%) do not participate in any exercise, and more than half (54%) exercise fewer than three times each week.

- Across SEPA, 22% do not exercise.
- The percentage of adults who exercise fewer than three times each week in the Nazareth service area is higher than the surrounding counties.
- The percentage of adults (78%) who exercise at all in the Nazareth service area meets the PA State Health Care Innovation Plan target for 2019 (54.3%).

TOBACCO USE

The percentage of adults who smoke in the service area **does not meet** the Healthy People 2020 goal of 12%. The percentage of smokers who have tried to quit in the past year **does not meet** the Healthy People 2020 goal of 80%.

In the Nazareth service area, 21% of adults smoke cigarettes. This represents approximately 56,200 adults.

- This does not meet the PA State Health Care Innovation Plan target of 19.3% smokers by 2019.
- This is also higher than the percentage of smokers in SEPA (16%), Philadelphia (16%), and Montgomery County (12%).

Within the service area, 63% of smokers have tried to quit during the past year.

• This is higher than in the surrounding counties, but does not meet the Healthy People 2020 goal of 80% of smokers trying to quit.




Figure 36. Adult Smokers, 2015

IX. SPECIAL POPULATIONS

One of the goals of this needs assessment was to identify health needs of special populations across the Nazareth Hospital service area. This section focuses on selected health status and access to care needs of special populations in the service area.

Representatives from PDPH indicate that racial and ethnic health disparities occur across all of these areas especially for blacks, but also for Hispanics. Targeted interventions are needed for people of color across all strategic areas. In addition age is a factor and some strategic areas are age-specific, such as teens and sexual health and children and obesity.

LOWER INCOME POPULATIONS

Compared to Philadelphia as a whole, the Nazareth Hospital service area, comprised of Northeast Philadelphia communities, might appear to be economically blessed when compared to other parts of Philadelphia. However, the higher median income and lower poverty rate instead indicates some of the economic extremes that are present in this service area. Nearly one in five (19%) families with children are living in poverty, as are 13% of households without children. One in seven people in the labor force (14%) is unemployed, and one in six (17%) adults age 25 or older did not graduate from high school. The community meeting participants emphasized the challenges that low income populations in this area face when accessing health care and other health-impacting resources.

- Access to medical care itself is often challenging for adults with limited means:
 - Although the number of adults age 18-64 in the Nazareth service area without insurance (9%) is similar to that in SEPA overall (8%), this number still represents more than 19,000 people without insurance who should be insured according to Healthy People 2020 goals.
 - Nearly one in five (18%) of adults age 18-64 in the service area report they
 do not have a regular source of care (compared to 13% in SEPA overall).
 Nearly one in ten children (9%) also has no regular source of care, double
 the rate for Philadelphia or SEPA overall (both 4%).
 - Furthermore, although significantly more adults in the service area had looked into buying insurance through the healthcare.gov portal (42% compared to 36% in SEPA overall), both the survey data and the community meeting attendees indicated that plans with affordable monthly premiums were not really affordable in terms of copays and

- deductibles. Community meeting attendees suggest that the high deductibles led people to delay even routine care that should be covered.
- One in five (19%) adults in the service area did not have prescription insurance coverage, and 16% reported that they had not filled a needed prescription due to the cost. Both the lack of insurance and the challenges paying for prescriptions were similar to SEPA overall, but were emphasized as an issue by meeting attendees, who discussed how financially vulnerable residents in the service area end up picking and choosing which medications to buy, never getting the maintenance regimen as prescribed.
- Nutrition was identified by community meeting attendees as an important problem in this service area, particularly for lower income residents:
 - Even with food stamps, many households do not have enough money for proper nutrition.
 - Not all housing has adequate kitchen resources, and some programs that provide food do not provide foods supportive to physical and mental health. Programs that provide a hot meal in particular may do so in ways that some residents find undignified, making the programs potentially unacceptable.
 - Adults in the service area report eating fewer vegetables and more fast food than their peers in other parts of SEPA. A large majority of adults (82%) did not eat 4 or more services of fruits and vegetables combined, and two in five adults (39%) ate fast food in the past week.
 - Lower-income children in this area are particularly vulnerable to not having enough nutritious food, and community meeting attendees expressed concerns about the information and skill level of teens and young adults trying to feed themselves.
- Social networks, and the information and additional resources they hold, were also identified as a resource that lower income people may not be able to access.
- Transportation issues add stress in general to the lives of those with limited income, according to the community meeting attendees. In addition, reliance on public transportation can add hidden costs to accessing health care, especially for families with children.

HOMELESS POPULATIONS

The community meeting attendees focused on the needs of homeless and housing-insecure residents of the service area. Homelessness and housing insecurity are linked to a large number of poor health outcomes for adults and children.

- In the service area, there are not enough resources for individuals or families
 who lose their housing, and want to remain in the area, where they know
 people and have some access to social resources that they know.
- The challenges of living in a shelter, unstable housing, or temporarily with family or friends increases the considerable logistical challenges of living with limited income discussed above.
- In this service area, meeting attendees were particularly concerned with the health of families with children living in Pennypack Park. In addition to other health risks and daily life challenges of being unhoused, meeting attendees expressed concerns about the risk of violence for these families from other park users.

OLDER ADULTS

Older adults generally have increased needs for medical care and other social services due to health concerns. However, in this service area, the community meeting attendees discussed how older adult needs in these communities were particularly challenging and faced particular barriers.

- According to community meeting attendees, older adults in this service area are
 particularly vulnerable to depression and isolation. The Household Health Survey
 data also showed that more older adults in the service area reported depressive
 symptoms, with one in five (21%) reporting signs of depression (compared to 12%
 in SEPA overall).
- In addition, community meeting attendees discussed how older adults in the service area communities have a particularly high need to be linked in to supportive social service programs. The Household Health Survey data support this observation about the heightened needs of older adults in this area for both health care and at-home services.
 - o One in three (31%) older adult in the service area were in "fair or poor" health, a significantly higher proportion than in SEPA overall (21%).
 - One in three (31%) older adults in this service have at least one limitation in the Instrumental Activities of Daily Living, such as cooking, shopping, or managing medication, a higher proportion than in SEPA overall (24%).
 - About one in three (31%) older adults also planned to move out of their current home within the next 5 years, compared to 20% of older adults in SEPA overall.

IMMIGRANTS

Community meeting attendees also discussed the challenges that immigrant populations in the service area face, and how they influence health and health care.

- In particular, the Russian-speaking communities in the service area experience both language barriers, have a lack of understanding of the health care system, and feel high levels of mistrust for the medical system, according to the community meeting attendees.
- According to US Census information, one in five (20%) adults in the service area speaks a language other than English or Spanish: 6% speak an Asian language, and 14% speak other languages
- Immigration status affects the willingness of undocumented residents to access health care through typical clinic settings. Community meeting attendees suggested that health fairs that provide screenings were an important resource for undocumented adults in particular.

X. EXISTING RESOURCES

EXISTING HEALTH CARE RESOURCES

The existing health and social services in the service area, and for Southeastern Pennsylvania as a whole, were inventoried for this report. Information on health and social services was obtained by internet searches and from the Yellow Pages. Health services included: acute care general hospitals; inpatient psychiatric hospitals and long-term psychiatric facilities; and rehabilitation hospitals. Skilled and intermediate care nursing facilities were not included. Health services also included community health centers and clinics, urgent care centers, and state, city, and county health department service locations. Existing social services which were inventoried included: food pantries, WIC centers, farmer's markets, and soup kitchens; community outpatient mental health and mental retardation services; senior services; social work services; homeless and domestic violence shelters; and YMCA's. These existing health care and social service resources are shown on the maps of the hospital's service area and for Philadelphia in Appendix F.

XI. UNMET NEEDS

In general, residents of Nazareth's service area are in better health than those who live in the communities served by Mercy Philadelphia and Mercy Fitzgerald. However, Nazareth Hospital's CHNA identified the following 14 unmet needs in priority for the hospital's service area:

XII. Prioritization of Unmet Needs

SIGNIFICANT HEALTH NEEDS TO BE ADDRESSED

Nazareth Hospital through Mercy Health System pulled together a cross functional Prioritization Workgroup which included a community representative. Nazareth Hospital's approach to community health need is to focus on responding to those needs that are both documented in the assessment and intersect with its strengths, vision and mission. Nazareth's resources and overall alignment with the hospital's mission, goals and strategic priorities were taken into consideration of the 14 significant health needs identified through the most recent CHNA process. The input that was gathered in our community interviews was used in the process to identify and prioritize the unmet needs.

The Mercy Health System Prioritization Workgroup reviewed and prioritized the defined health needs. The priority setting methods utilized to determine the community health needs that Nazareth Hospital would respond to were (1) the Simplex Method and (2) the Nominal Group Planning Method.

First, under the Simplex Method each workgroup member prioritized the identified health need by scoring on a scale of 1-5 (5 = high; 1=Low) for each of the six criteria:

- Severity, Magnitude, Urgency
- Feasibility and Effectiveness of Possible Interventions
- Potential Impact on Greatest Number of People
- Importance of Addressing the Need
- Outcomes within 3 Years are Measurable and Achievable
- Consequences of Inaction

The Workgroup proceeded with the Nominal Group Planning Method where voting and ranking of the needs was determined after exhaustive group discussions. The specific questions considered for each identified priority healthcare need were:

- Does the healthcare need affect a specific vulnerable population?
- Do existing programs exist to address the healthcare need?
- Does Nazareth Hospital have the capability to address the healthcare need?
- Will the community support intervention to address the healthcare need?
- Will addressing the healthcare need be in alignment with the Nazareth Hospital mission?

The prioritization process resulted in the identification 11 out of the 14 needs that Nazareth Hospital will address under three priorities:
